SUBJECT: Report After Action Against the Enemy

TO : The Adjutant General, Washington, D. C. (thru channels).

In accordance with paragraph 10, (c-5), AR 345-105, the following report after action for the month of January 1945 is submitted.

Period: 1 January 1945.

Disposition at beginning of period:

330th Inf (- 1st Bn; atchd to 84th Inf Div), atchd to VII Corps Reserve.

Regt in assembly area vic of SOMME LEUZE, Belgium (3195). Co G, 774th Tk Bn; Co B, 308th Med Bn; and one platoon Co E, 308th Engr Bn; atchd.

At 1100, the Regt was atchd to 3d Armd Div and was alerted to move and join 3d Armd Div in assembly area.

The Regt was atchd to 3d Armd Div in the following manner:

Regt (- 2nd and 3rd Bns) atchd to GCR.

1st Bn, upon release from attachment to 84th Inf Div, to become atchd to GCR, 3d Armd Div.

2nd Bn attached to CGA.

3rd Bn attached to CGB.

The Bn Comdrs of 2nd and 3rd Bns and quartering parties from all units of Regt departed at 1230 to contact respective units to which they were attached.

All attachments to Regt released at 1200.

The 2nd Bn crossed IP at 1435 to join CGA; 3rd Bn crossed at 1650; and the special units had cleared at 1600. The 1st Bn was released from attachment to 84th Inf Div at 1850 and moved at 2000. By 2100, all units of Regt had closed into assembly area of unit to which they were atchd.

One platoon of AT Co atchd and joined each, 2nd and 3rd Bns.

Regimental CP located vic of TERWANGE, Belgium (306079).

2 January 1945.

One platoon of AT Co atchd to 1st Bn at 0850 and joined 1st Bn at 1025.

Hq & Hq Co, Cn Co, AT Co (-), crossed IP at 1300 for new assembly area vic FERRIERES, Belgium (490025). At 1500, all had closed in.

The 3rd Bn atchd to CGD, 3d Armd Div. 3rd Bn moved from BARSU (286-017) to assembly area at PETITE HOURLINNE (506939), closing at 1320. Preparation made for attack on following day.

3 January 1945.

Hq & Hq Co moved to CP location at WERBOMONT (543007), closing at 1730.

2nd Bn atchd to CGA. Bn assembled at BRA (575935). G Co rode tanks from BRA to FLORET (591931) where they dismounted and were committed with a company of tanks to clear road between FLORET and LANSIVAL (603904). G Co only was used in this operation. G Co and tanks attacked down road and by nightfall had reached point at (595921). Opposition consisted of infantry supported by artillery and mortars.

330th Inf was attached to 3rd Armd Div, 1 January 1945. On 8 January, the Regt (- 2nd and 3rd Bns) reverted to 83d Inf Div control and on 11 January was again attached to 3rd Armd Div. On 18 January, the Regt (- 2nd Bn and Cn Co) reverted to 83d Inf Div and on 19 January, the 2nd Bn and Cn Co reverted to Regt control.

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At 0730, GCB with 3rd Bn riding on the tanks moved out of PETITE HOUSINNE to seize MALEMPRE (561889). The attack was made down roads. The infantry cleared road blocks when column was held up and tanks sprayed woods and protected flanks. By 1200, a point at (555890) was reached. Infantry of 3rd Bn made attack on MALEMPRE with L Co attacking right of town across open ground and K Co through woods on the left of town. Marching fire employed in taking town against opposition of snipers and heavy artillery fire. Tanks followed infantry into town and the town was cleared by 1700. The 3rd Bn pushed past the town and established road blocks and set up outpost line from (562882) to (568886) to protect town. Heavy artillery fire and Nebelwerfer fire fell on town throughout night. Approximately 87 PsW from 12th VGR were taken during day's operation. Losses light.

4 January 1944.

1st Bn attached to TF Hogan, GCB, 3d Armd Div.
1st Bn moved to MANHAY (533902) in preparation for attack, final objective being CR at (576854). 1st Bn given mission of seizing high ground at (557877)-(565840). A and B Cos attacked cross-country, B Co to the left rear of A Co. C Co secured the road between (548894) and MALEMPRE (560890). A and B Cos encountered light artillery fire in reaching hill. A Co ran into enemy infantry digging in on forward slope of hill and drove them off with little difficulty. By nightfall, the positions had been secured and organized for defense. No supporting tanks were used in this operation.

2nd Bn - G Co, with one company of tanks, was given mission of taking LANSIVAL (603904) and F Co, with one company of tanks, given mission of securing JEVIGNE (599904). Both columns moved down main road between FLORET and LANSIVAL. The attack was made in severe cold with heavy snow falling and poor visibility. The infantry leading, closely supported by tanks. By 1200, lead elements had reached the road fork at (600905) against enemy infantry, artillery, and mortar fire. There, F Co moved toward JEVIGNE, and G Co toward LANSIVAL. As both forces neared the towns, opposition became stiffer and it developed into a house-to-house fight with tanks shooting up buildings and the infantry closing in and cleaning out the enemy infantry. Two enemy 75mm high-velocity guns were knocked out. Both towns were cleared by 1500. Approximately 100 PsW from 12 SS Pz Div were taken.

At 1600, E and G Cos launched attack to seize hill 108 (610895). This action was infantry action only, and by nightfall, the enemy infantry had been driven off and the hill secured. The attack was made against enemy automatic weapon fire, artillery, and mortar fire. E and G Cos occupied hill over night. F Co remained in LANSIVAL. Very heavy artillery fire was received in LANSIVAL throughout the night.

The day's operation was primarily infantry action by 3rd Bn. At 0800, K Co, abreast of trail at (564886), attacked to SE against heavy infantry and automatic fire and artillery fire. At 1030, I Co was committed on the left of the trail with L Co following. Progress was slow against stubborn resistance. High-velocity weapons, together with heavy mine fields, prevented the tanks from giving close-in support to infantry. By 1500, a line from (565884) to (573880) had been secured. No further progress made.

5 January 1944.

Cn and AT Cos closed into area vic of Regtl CP at 1455. AT Co established road blocks in CP area. Cn Co made reconnaissance to give fire sup-

port to 1st Bn and GCR.

A and B Cos advanced at 0800 with tanks astride trail from MALEMPRE toward RJ at (568859). Little opposition was encountered until column reached (566866). Here the attack ran into strong enemy emplacements, thick mine fields, and heavy artillery, mortar, and small arms fire.

Co C, and one tank company, were sent to outflank the enemy. This column took road from MALEMPRE to RJ. (548893), then down main highway towards the main CR at (576854). Co C dismounted at (545875) and advanced to (563863) where heavy mine fields, artillery, and small arms fire and enemy tanks were encountered. C Co was unable to advance further.

At 0730, E and G Cos were counterattacked by three SP guns and approximately 50 infantry. The attack came from the NE and was preceded by artillery and mortar fire. The attack was repulsed and the SP guns and remaining infantry withdrew.

E and G Cos maintained positions on hill 108 throughout day and F Co, with tanks, worked their way to the first few houses of LIERNEAUX (617890). Slow progress was made by 3rd Bn; primarily infantry action. AT guns on flanks still preventing friendly tanks from giving close support. I and K Cos attacked abreast road; J on the left and L on the right; M Co following on the road. At close of day, a point at (572872) was reached.

6 January 1945.

At 1000, Cn Co moved to gun positions from which they could give direct support to the 1st Bn.

A and B Cos took RJ (569660), opposition consisting of enemy infantry, automatic, and mortar fire. Enemy tanks had withdrawn during previous night and C Co reverted to Bn reserve after assisting in clearing road blocks and mine fields. A and B Cos made a night attack across the road and secured the high ground (570855).

F Co continued to push into LIERNEAUX from the W, and E and G Co pushed into town from the N. Resistance was light and by 1400, the town was completely cleared.

E and F Co, without tank support, took hill at (626884) dominating VERLEUMONT by nightfall, against enemy infantry and automatic weapons fire.

3rd Bn - The attack on FRAITURE (586863) was resumed on the morning of the 6th against light artillery fire. By 1600, FRAITURE had been entered and the tanks came up to assist the infantry in cleaning the town. House-to-house fighting developed and by nightfall, the town had been cleared by tanks and infantry. Approximately 200 POW were taken.

7 January 1945.

A and B Cos attacked and seized the RJ at (576854). This attack was made by infantry; tanks being unable to advance through mine fields. 1st Bn was opposed by entrenched infantry and heavy mortar and artillery fire. A Co pushed beyond RJ to point at (578849). B Co occupied ground at (572848). C Co swung to the left and established road block at (582852). During the night, A Co sent patrol into woods to the S and contacted enemy infantry.

One platoon of F Co, riding medium tanks, attacked VERLEUMONT (629878) and took it with little opposition.

The remainder of the Bn came across country and joined the tank force.

At 1400, two columns started across country for JOUBIEVAL. E Co with right tank column and F Co with left column. The edge of the town was

reached but AT fire was met and the columns pulled back to the edge of woods at (642873).

3rd Bn - Attack for REGNE (611856) was launched by CCB. 1st Bn attacked town from the NW and the infantry of 2nd Bn, 33rd Armd Inf Regt attacked from the E. By 1000, fighting was going on in the town and by 1900, the town was secured and road blocks had been established to the E, S, and SW.

8 January 1945.

The Regt (- 2nd and 3rd Bns) reverted to control of 83d Inf Div at 072300, and was given mission of seizing and securing the town of BIHAIN (626842), and thus protect the right flank of the Div in conjunction with 83d Div mission of establishing bridgehead over LANGLER River.

At 072300, Co C, 774th Tk Bn; one platoon Co B, 629th TD Bn (SP); one platoon Co B, 308th Engr Bn; and 83d Cav Rcn Trp; and Co B, 308th Med Bn, were attached to Regt. 323rd FA Bn in direct support.

At 0930, the Regt (- 2nd and 3rd Bns), and attachments, began moving into assembly area vic of LANSIVAL (603903). The 1st Bn, upon relief by 1st Bn, 333rd Inf, at 0900 began moving from position at CR (576853) to assembly area at LANSIVAL. The 1st Bn closed in at 1410, and the AT (- 2 platoons) closed at 1600. Last elements of Co C, 774th Tk Bn, moved throughout night to assembly area vic LANSIVAL.

Movement was by infiltration due to great amount of vehicular traffic on roads, together with the icy condition of the roads.

Co C, 774th Tk Bn, attached to 1st Bn.

83d Rcn Trp sent one platoon to investigate quarry at (625848). The platoon of 83d Rcn Trp got into quarry at 1900, accompanied by 3-man patrol of Regtl I&R Plat. One prisoner was captured.

From an OP at (624847), enemy troops and vehicles could be heard in BIHAIN (624839).

2nd Bn - Heavy mortar and artillery fire was kept on town throughout night and the tanks, with G Co mounted, moved into JOUBIEVAL in the morning with little resistance. The town was clear by 1000.

G Co cleared woods to the right of road at (664857), and F Co on left. Road blocks were established at (664856), (665858), and (660855), after stubborn enemy had been driven back by the two companies.

9 January 1945.

The 1st Bn began moving by motor at 0600 for assembly area at HEBRONVAL (6386), detrucking at REGNE (600856), and closed in at 0800.

Co B was given mission of passing through quarries at (626847) and proceeding E and clean out woods at (635847). Co B moved from REGNE toward quarry. At 0855, Co B contacted enemy at (622847), who at that time were attacking the platoon of the 83d Cav Rcn Trp, occupying positions in the quarries. The enemy was driven off and Co B, whose effective strength was about 25 men, was ordered to take up defensive positions in quarries at (626847). The 2nd Plat of the Rcn Trp was ordered to join the 1st Plat in quarries and had joined the 1st Plat by 0930.

Cos A and C jumped off at 1140 in column of companies, C Co leading. The mission was to seize and secure BIHAIN, and the plan was for C Co to attack from the NE, C Co to by-pass woods at (625847) and A Co to clean the woods if the enemy gave them trouble.

By 1330, C Co's leading elements had reached (62858430) with their right on road at (629844). C Co passed woods at (625847) without meeting resis-

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tance from them. At 1955, C Co had reached mill at (628842), where they met scattered s/a fire. Co C, after maneuvering, eliminated resistance and reached RJ at (62608405) at 1540 and Co A and one platoon of Engrs were moving to mill (628842).

Enemy vehicles were seen leaving BIHAIN by road (620838) and infantry moved from town into woods (630837). Arty took them under fire. The tks had remained behind on the high ground (632851) and at 1800, tks began moving towards town; two tks were in town at 1900, one was knocked out by high-velocity fires. Only one more tk got into town. The TDs remained on high ground at (634844).

B Co and Rcn Trp maintained positions in quarry and received fairly heavy arty and mortar fires. Co C's opposition consisted principally of s/a and automatic fire.

Weather still cold and overcast; snow fell throughout day. Icy roads, vehicles in ditches, and snow banks made movement difficult. Cross-country movement by vehicle impossible.

1st Bn contacted Co G, 331st Inf during night and coordinated plan for operation on 10 Jan 45.

2nd Bn - G and F Cos pushed to (626855), (6785), and (668849).

3rd Bn CP closed into HERRONVAL (632862). I Co was relieved of guarding road blocks at OTTIRE (645853). Relief was made in small groups due to intense arty and mortar fire. L and K Cos closed into assembly area at HERRONVAL.

Regtl CP: LANSIVAL (604904).

10 January 1945.

At 0800, 83d Rcn Trp, with mission of protecting right of Regt and maintaining contact with 1st Bn and friendly elements on right, investigated and cleared quarries from (623847) E to (629847). The quarries were found to be unoccupied. No arty or mortar fire was received in quarry area during day.

B Co was given mission of sweeping woods at (635847) to be sure no bypassed pockets remained in rear of our forward elements. By 1030, B Co had swept woods from W to E and found woods unoccupied. B Co returned to (631-848) where they took up position. B Co contacted Co G, 331st Inf.

Both C and A Cos were held up by cross-fire from enemy MGs in woods just S of BIHAIN that had excellent observation on town. A Co moved from mill at (629842) to a position in rear of C Co (626841). C Co was held up just past cross-roads at (625841) at 1100. Six tks were in town supporting A and C Cos, and the platoon of TDs were on high ground at (626845) with good observation to the E and SE.

C and A Cos made slow progress fighting for each building against automatic and accurate s/a fire and light mortar fire. At 1400, C Co had reached a point at (625840). At 1600, A Co was at (624839), C Co was at (624840) and B Co, who rode into town on the 3rd Plat of tks, was at (6250-8395). Resistance by troops of the 19th Regt of 9th SS Pz Div was extremely bitter. At this time, about 12 houses remained to be taken in the town.

At 1700, the last house had been taken and the 1st Bn was clearing town, establishing road blocks and preparing to defend town.

At 1720, the I&R Plat relieved the 83d Rcn Trp in quarry positions and the 83d Rcn Trp reverted to 83d Inf Div.

The 323rd FA Bn and Cn Co kept fire continually on woods S of BIHAIN and 3 TOTs of 11 Bns each were fired on woods just S of BIHAIN.

110 PsW from 9th SS Pz Div taken during day's operations.

2nd Bn - No change. One rifle company supported by tks protecting road blocks. Bn CP at JOUBIEVAL (655864).

3rd Bn completely assembled at HEBRONVAL, reorganizing.
Regt CP closed LANSIVAL. Opened at HEBRONVAL (6366) at 1600.

11 January 1945.

The 330th Inf reattached to 3d Armd Div at 0800 and all attachments to 330th Inf reverted to 83d Div. Regt Hq and Sep Cos attached to Hq 3d Armd Div. 1st Bn attached to CCR, 3d Armd Div.

At 0600, heavy concentrations of mortar and artillery fire began falling on 1st Bn in BIHAIN after a quiet night. The concentrations lasted for 30 minutes.

One platoon of tanks of 83d Rcn Bn, 3d Armd Div, and a section of TDs, 3d Armd Div, got into BIHAIN at 0700. At 0845, small arms and automatic weapons fire was received in BIHAIN, coming from woods just S of town and it was believed enemy infantry and tanks were forming for an attack on the town. Soon after, enemy tanks were sighted at (629839). Artillery was called down on the tanks and suspected infantry locations.

The enemy launched an attack with five tanks, preceded by infantry, from woods just S of BIHAIN, at 0900. Attached and supporting tks and TDs fired on enemy armor. Three enemy tks were knocked out at (625838), (625-836), and (625836). The 1st Bn took 38 Pw. The attack was repulsed with heavy losses for the enemy. The two remaining tanks withdrew to woods and the artillery fired TOT on road on which the tanks withdrew.

Arty observation planes picked up a column of enemy troops moving S along road between (609836) and (608820), estimated to be of Bn strength. This column was taken under fire by artillery with good effect.

The 1st Bn was given mission by CCR of taking bridge at (62558220) and securing line to the SW. The 1st Bn moved out at 1600, C Co leading, and at 1920, had taken bridge, with little opposition. 31 Pw taken, 8 of which were wounded. 1st Bn given this mission because it was believed enemy was starting a withdrawal and new troops could not be brought in in time; therefore, 1st Bn, which had been fighting continually for six days, had to launch another attack. At 2000, the Bn set up defenses to protect the bridge and themselves. The of 3d Armd Div were moving up to reinforce 1st Bn.

The town of BIHAIN, having been secured and the attack continuing, the I&R Plat was withdrawn from positions in quarries.

1st Bn received two small counterattacks; one at 1950, and one at 2100; one enemy tank knocked out and the counterattack repulsed.

2nd Bn - No change.

3rd Bn - No change.

12 January 1945.

Regt CP at HEBRONVAL (6366); Cn and AT Cos in same vic. The 1st Bn maintained positions around bridge at (62558220) throughout the night and at 0837, the 83d Rcn Bn began passing through the 1st Bn and by 0930, had completed same. Shortly after, the 1st Bn moved back to BIHAIN to secure the town and rest and reorganize. At 2130, C Co was ordered to return to bridge at (62558220) and establish road blocks in surrounding road net.

Heavy artillery and Nebelwerfer concentrations fell on BIHAIN throughout the day.

2nd Bn - No change.

3rd Bn began moving to assembly area at (638816) in preparation for attack on LOMRE (643799).

Because the assembly area at (638816) had not been taken by preceding elements, the Bn moved into assembly area via of BIHAIN (625838).

13 January 1945.

1st and 2nd Bns - No change.

3rd Bn - At 0530, the 3rd Bn moved out in column of companies with mission of taking LOMRE (644800). At 0800, the Bn deployed; K Co on the right of trail leading to LOMRE and L Co on the left. The 3rd Bn passed through the 1st Bn, 331st Inf, 400 yards S of LANGLIR (648818). The tks moved abreast of K and L Cos, giving close support. The enemy fought a delaying action and heavy automatic and mortar fire was encountered.

I Co was committed on the left of L Co, which had suffered heavy casualties. I Co advanced rapidly and by 2000 had occupied LOMRE.

14 January 1945.

1st Bn - The Bn moved from BIHAIN to an assembly area at (630777), closing at 0800. At 1030, an attack was launched to take HALONREUX (645781), Bn in column of companies, C Co leading, each company supported by tks. Rapid progress was made initially but resistance stiffened as the column approached the objective. HALONREUX was taken at 1530 by the tank-infantry team.

A Co, supported by tks, advanced on MONT LA BAN (645785), attacking it from the S to assist TF Kane in taking the town. By 1800, the two forces had met at the center of the town. Resistance consisted of infantry supported by artillery, mortars and high-velocity weapons.

At 2400, B Co, mounted on tks, attacked to seize high ground at (648773) in preparation for attack on VAUX (655768) on following day. This attack was repulsed by dug-in infantry supported by high-velocity weapons and artillery. B Co and the tanks withdrew to HALONREUX.

2nd Bn - No change.

3rd Bn - The attack was resumed with mission of seizing CHERAIN (665775). The attack was launched with the rifle companies riding the tks, I Co on lead tks. The column got within 1220 yds of CHERAIN where the advance was halted by high-velocity fire. At 1300, the attack was resumed against heavy arty and direct fire weapons. After advancing 300 yds, the tks were forced to withdraw after having lost tks to high-velocity guns located in and around CHERAIN. L Co covered the withdrawal.

At 2300, the Bn (- tanks) attempted to enter CHERAIN from the NW and E but encountered entrenched enemy infantry and heavy machine gun fire; the attempt was unsuccessful.

15 January 1945.

Cn Co, after having made reconnaissance for gun positions, moved from assembly area to support 2nd Bn at 1430.

1st Bn - The Bn attacked in column of companies, A Co leading, at 1130: initial objective the same high ground at (648773) and the final objective the town of VAUX (655768). The initial objective was taken at 1400 against very determined resistance by infantry supported by artillery, mortar and SP guns.

64 reinforcements were formed into a task force and, under command of Capt Fritts, took up positions on the high ground at (648773) to enable the

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Bn, whose effective strength was depleted, to reorganize for the attack on VAUX. With the task force under Captain Fritts occupying position on the high ground at (648773), A, B, and C Cos, mounted on tks, advanced to within 300 yds of VAUX where they dismounted and fought their way through the town supported by the tks. VAUX was secured at 1700. A few PsW were taken and approximately 60 enemy killed in the town.

The replacement task force came forward to secure the town while the remainder of the Bn reorganized.

2nd Bn - At 1600, the Bn moved toward BACLAIN (664791). On reaching the edge of the woods at (664805), the column halted and F Co, with tks, attacked across country to take STERPIGNY (676778). The attack was launched at 2200 and continued throughout the night against enemy infantry supported by four Mark IV tks. Our tks knocked out the four enemy tks and by 160430, both tks and infantry were well into the town. E Co sent a combat patrol to CHERAIN (665775) where contact was made with elements of our 3rd Bn near the NE edge of the town.

3rd Bn - The Bn, supported by tks, launched an attack at 1200, under a smoke screen laid by M Co and supporting arty, to take CHERAIN. The attack progressed to the stream at (66057765) where the infantry came under extremely accurate machine gun and mortar fire. All of the supporting tks were put out of action by AT fire. The attack was unsuccessful. The infantrymen were forced to take cover in the water of the streams to escape the enemy fire. A withdrawal became necessary and with L Co covering the withdrawal, I and K Cos moved back to the former position.

The AT guns and heavy machine guns were brought up and defensive position established at (659777). Effective fighting strength of I, K, and L Cos - 2 officers and 17 men.

16 January 1945.

The 1st Bn continued to secure VAUX.

2nd Bn - G Co joined F Co at 0730, and shortly afterwards H Co dis- placed weapons to STERPIGNY. The remainder of the day was spent in clearing town and establishing road blocks and perfecting defensive positions.

3rd Bn - At 0900, E Co, 2nd Bn, 330th Inf, passed to the left of the 3rd Bn positions and the 3rd Bn assembled at LOMRE.

17 January 1945.

The Regt was notified by the 3rd Armd Div that release of the Regt (- 2nd Bn and Cn Co) to the 83d Inf Div control would be effected on the following day. Quarters parties from all units departed at 1500 for HAM- OIR, Belgium, to secure billets.

The gun platoons of AT Co, that had been attached to battalions, re- verted to company control.

1st Bn - No change.

2nd Bn - The 2nd Bn was given the mission of clearing the woods ex- tending 2000 meters along the main road from STERPIGNY towards GOUVEY (708- 778). The attack was launched at 1400 with E Co on the right of the road and F Co on the left. E and F Cos advanced approximately 600 yds and reached a line generally along the creek (684781) where they came under intense fire from entrenched infantry and two tks and one SP gun located along the W edge of the woods just beyond the creek. Both Cos were pinned down.

G Co with five tks attempted to outflank the enemy positions by moving NE out of STERPIGNY on a trail at (680786). This force was held up at

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(683786) by machine gun fire and infantry from both the left and right in the woods just to their front. No further progress made.

18 January 1945.

The special units (- Cn Co) began moving at 0800 for new assembly area. The 3rd Bn cross IP at LANGLIER at 0900.

The Regtl CP was opened at ST ROCH, Belgium (507048) at 1130. AT Co closed into FERRIERES (496024) at 0945. Sv Co closed into same location as Regtl Hq at 1345. The 1st Bn moved under 3rd Armd Div control and closed into HAMOIR (433053) at 1850. The 3rd Bn closed into HAMOIR at 1100.

2nd Bn - At 0600, E and F Cos resumed the attack. Because the rifle companies were depleted, both E and F Cos attacked on the left of the road in column of companies, E Co leading. By 1400, after having fought enemy infantry for 2000 meters, E and F Cos reached the E edge of the woods. Combat patrols of G Co swept the right side of the road and found it unoccupied; the enemy tks had withdrawn during the night.

19 January 1945.

Relief of the 2nd Bn by the 2nd Bn, 335th Inf was begun at 0900. The Bn assembled at BARCLAIN and at 1430 began, under 3rd Armd control, movement by motor to billets at IZIER (470005), closing at 1800.

Cn Co closed into assembly area at FERRIERES (496024) at 1430. All elements of the Regt under Regtl control at 1800.

20 January 1945.

The 3rd Bn moved from HAMOIR to FILOT (461051).

All elements of Regt began reorganization and training program. Bn emphasized the training of replacements in weapons firing and small unit training.

21 January 1945.

The 1st Bn moved from HAMOIR to billets in HEYD (4596), Bn CP located at MORVILLE (435955). Cn Co moved from FERRIERES to billets with Regtl Hq and Sv Cos.

22 - 24 January 1945.

Training and reorganization continued. Regtl Hq, Sv and Cn Cos, moved from ST ROCH to make room for XVIII Corps troops.

Sv Co closed into billets in MY (453080). Regtl Hq closed into FERRIERES (486024) and Cn Co moved to THIER DE FERRIERES (488016).

25 - 31 January 1945.

Intensive training program was carried on throughout the remainder of the period. The training emphasized the training of new leaders, both officers and NCOs as well as the reinforcements. Included in the schedule was: attacks on villages and woods, both day and night; attacks by the tank-infantry teams; tank stalking by bazooka teams; familiarization firing of infantry weapons by reinforcements; and small unit problems.

In accordance with paragraph 10, (c-3), AR 345-105, the following report after action for the month of February 1945 is submitted.

Training of reinforcements carried on throughout period.

6 February 1945.

The 83d Division passed to control of the XIX Corps for operations in the JULICH sector. Extensive preparations were made to make the move secret. Vehicle markings and division patches were removed. All troops received instruction in secrecy discipline.

The Regt, with Co B, 308th Med Bn attached and the 323rd FA Bn attached for movement, crossed IP at BOMAL (428999) at 1745 fro assembly area vic of MHEER, HOLLAND (631439).

All units of the Regt had closed into assembly areas by 070200.

Regtl CP located at MHEER, HOLLAND (631438).

7 - 8 February 1945.

Units established themselves in billets and training was resumed.

9 February 1945.

The Regtl Combat Team was alerted to join the 29th Div and become attached to that division for operations across the ROER RIVER in the vic of JULICH. The Regtl Commander, S-2 and S-3 departed for the 29th Div area to contact the 29th Div and establish a forward CP. Quartering parties from all units departed to select assembly areas for their units. A forward Regtl CP was established at SCHLEIDEN, GERMANY (836568).

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10 - 22 February 1945.

The Regtl CT remained in present bivouac area and continued training. Plans which called for the CT to move to forward assembly areas on 11 February were postponed. Regt continued training, emphasizing attack across open ground, night attack, use of screening smoke and tank-infantry training.

23 February 1945.

The attack of the 29th Div jumped off at 0300 to establish a bridgehead across the ROER RIVER vic of JULICH. At 1000, the Regt with Co B, 308th Med Bn, Co B, 643rd TD Bn (T) (- 1 platoon being fitted with M-18 Tank Destroyers) crossed IP at GROSNIICH, HOLLAND, to join the 29th Div.

The Regtl CP opened at SCHLEIDEN, GERMANY (950550) at 1230. The 1st and 3rd Bns closed into Assembly Area at HONGEN, GERMANY (928538); the 2nd Bn closed into SCHLEIDEN. The Regtl CT was completely closed into Assembly Area at 1430. Co B, 308th Engr Bn, already in area, became attached to the Regt.

The 330th CT became attached to the 29th Div, on arrival.

Cn Co moved to firing positions near KOSLAR, GERMANY (600598), at 2100, to support the attack of the Regt on the following day. During the night Cn Co had 6 vehicles damaged by heavy caliber mortar fire, casualties were light.

24 February 1945.

The 115th Inf Regt secured that part of the Division bridgehead in their zone during the night of 23-24 February. At 0800, the Bn and Sep Co Commanders crossed the ROER RIVER and contacted Commanders of the elements of the 115th Inf, preparatory to effecting their relief.

At 1300, the Regt was alerted to move across the river and relieve the 115th Inf.

At 1400, the Bns began moving on foot to cross the ROER RIVER. Weapons and extra ammunition were carried on jeeps and trailers. The jeeps were staged to KOSLAR. Each Bn was allotted 16 jeeps, including command and supply vehicles. From KOSLAR, Bn TOs were prepared to join foot columns with vehicles at bridge site or issue weapons and extra ammunition to troops as they passed by; this precaution taken in event enemy succeeded in destroying the ponton bridge, or vehicles not allowed to cross bridge by traffic control officer.

The Bns crossed the river at Bridge Site #2 (027586) and each Bn moved directly to relieve the respective Bn on the Division bridgehead. The 1st Bn, reserve Bn, relieved the 3rd Bn, 115th Inf, in BROICH (014620) at 2147. The 2nd Bn relieved the 1st Bn, 115th Inf, on Obj B (025632)-(029631)-(030627) at 2120. The 3rd Bn relieved the 2nd Bn, 115th Inf, on Obj C (034623)-(038620)-(039618) at 2045.

The 2nd Bn sent patrols to MERSCH (0463) and the 3rd Bn sent patrols to PATTERN (054626). All patrols ran into enemy outposts, drew fire, and were unable to penetrate the towns.

Co A, 736th Tk Bn, consisting of two platoons medium tks, one platoon light tks and one assault gun platoon arrived in Regtl area at 2030 and became attached to the Regt.

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The Tk Co, TD Co, and the Regtl AT Co crossed the ROER RIVER during the hours of darkness and assembled vic of BROICH.

The Regtl CP opened at BROICH (014620) at 1900 and the Regt assumed responsibility for 115th Inf sector at 2220.

Sporadic artillery and mortar fire fell during the time the Regt crossed the river. Enemy aircraft bombed the area throughout the night but no casualties resulted.

Co A, 92nd Cml Bn was attached, and Co B, 812th TD Bn (SP) was put in direct support. Both these units had been attached to the 115th Inf. The 323rd FA Bn, which was in general support of XIX Corps, was put in direct support of the Regt.

25 February 1945.

The 2nd Bn launched an attack in column of companies, E, G and F, at 0515 to take MERSCH (039634). E Co advanced to a point at (039637) where they were held up by fire from bunkers and entrenched infantry. G Co was committed on the right of E and at 0640, G Co was in the southern edge of MERSCH after by-passing enemy to the NW. G Co moved rapidly across the open ground by employing marching fire against enemy s/a and long range MG fire. By 0730, G Co was well into MERSCH and was working up the main road running through the town. At 1100, G Co had reached the northern edge of MERSCH, having cleared the main road, and had begun working SW through the town to clear the enemy resistance that had held up E Co. By 1110, E Co had begun to move forward and shortly after, E and G Cos had made contact at (044636). Mopping up operations continued. A platoon of tanks and TDs moved into MERSCH to assist in this operation. By 1400, all resistance had been eliminated. The Bn consolidated their position in MERSCH.

The 3rd Bn attacked from their positions at 0515 to take PATTERN (053-627).

L Co advanced against s/a fire and at 0715 was in southern edge of PATTERN and by 0810 had occupied all of the town and was engaged in mopping up operations. Three light tks were lost to enemy AP fire moving into PATTERN to support L Co. The enemy hid in holes as infantry passed and returned to fire on tks as they came forward. K Co was held up initially at (044623) by MG fire from the SE. At 0930, the 3rd Bn reported PATTERN secured. At 1300, K Co had moved into the western edge of PATTERN and had linked up with L Co. I Co began moving towards PATTERN with mission of passing through PATTERN and attacking SEVENICH (055643). I Co ran into an anti-personnel mine field at (047628) and was held up; therefore, L Co was ordered to attack SEVENICH. At 1435, L Co launched attack on SEVENICH and by 1500 had progressed 1/3 of the way against heavy s/a and scattered arty fire. At 1520, the objective was smoked by the arty and L Co moved into the town. By 1700, all resistance had ceased and the town was secure. The 1st Bn moved from Assembly Area at BROICH at 1400 to attack MUNTZ (0466). The Bn moved by route BROICH - TETZ - BOSLAR (018647). B Co took up positions on Hill 109 (022630) to secure flank. Platoon of 4 quads and one 40mm gun of the 453rd AAA Bn attached to Regt and took up positions on Hill 109 to support the attack of 1st Bn.

At 1600, the 1st Bn crossed LD (041681) in column of companies, C Co leading, accompanied by 1 platoon medium tks, followed by A Co. At 1615, C Co was in the SW edge of the town and had encountered no resistance.

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By 1630, C Co held positions at (039659) and were still advancing against light s/a fire. Road blocks were encountered at (041659) and (039659) and the resistance stiffened. These blocks were blasted out by the mine squad with TNT after the tanks had tried unsuccessfully to blast them out. The resistance continued to be stubborn. The 1st Bn continued the attack during the night and at 260130, A and C Cos had cleared and secured the town. On Co displaced from KOSLAR to BROICH (021619) to continue close support of the Regt.

26 February 1945.

The 1st Bn at 0130 sent a combat patrol consisting of one platoon from Co A to HASSELSWEILER (0566), the next objective of the 1st Bn. At 0430, the patrol occupied houses on the outskirts of the town without opposition. At 0555, A Co launched attack from the NE edge of MUNTZ to take HASSELSWEILER. A Co's advance was met by MI and high-velocity fire from the NE. By 0930, A Co had secured the W half of the town from (057667) to (057663). One platoon of tanks joined A Co to assist them in cleaning the town and, shortly after, B Co moved into the town in rear of A Co.

A Co built up strong base of fire and rushed across the open ground in the middle of the town and by 1005 had secured the town except the most eastern row of houses. At 1115, the town was secured.

Elements of the 115th Inf passed through the 2nd and 3rd Bns at 0500 to attack SPIEL (069652). The 3rd Bn assembled at MERSCH.

The 2nd Bn moved from MERSCH to BROICH at 0600. The 2nd Bn was given mission of taking GEVELSDORF (054686). To avoid open ground and enemy arty, the 2nd Bn planned to move by foot from BROICH through TETZ - BOSLAR - RALSHOVEN (039681) and to launch the attack from RALSHOVEN which had been taken by the 102nd Inf Div.

The 2nd Bn moved from BROICH at 0800 for RALSHOVEN.

At 1115, in order to speed the operation to take GEVELSDORF, the 1st Bn was ordered to attack the town from the S and assist the 2nd Bn in taking it. At 1245, B Co, mounted on platoon of tks and supported by TD fire from N edge of HASSELSWEILER, launched attack on GEVELSDORF, along the main road from HASSELSWEILER (056668). At 1303, tk traps at (055679) were encountered but a crossing was found and B Co continued on into the town without meeting opposition and were ordered to clear the eastern half.

The 2nd Bn in column of companies, F leading, followed by E, launched attack on GEVELSDORF from RALSHOVEN at 1310. One platoon of the 29th Div Recon Troop who held positions at (050681) attacked at the same time. At 1330, F Co reached the W edge of the town without opposition; the Recon platoon joined F Co and moved in at the same time. E Co followed F Co in at 1400. At 1336, C Co accompanied by a platoon of tks moved into GEVELSDORF, B and F Cos made contact and the town was secured.

At 1550, B Co with 1 platoon of tks attacked to seize high ground at (063693). At 2000, 1 platoon of B Co had seized the high ground after the tks had broken paths through tactical wire for the infantry. B Co sent a strong patrol to GUT ISENKROIDT (068692) and by 2100 had occupied houses at (067692). These positions were occupied throughout the night.

The 3rd Bn, Regt Reserve, moved from MERSCH to MUNTZ and from MUNTZ to HASSELSWEILER, closing at 1730.

Co A, 92nd Cml Bn was relieved from attachment at 2200.

On Co displaced from BROICH to MERSCH (045626) to continue close support of the Regt.

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27 February 1945.

At 0500, the 175th Inf passed through the positions of the 330th Inf to attack to the N. The 330th Inf reverted to control of the 83rd Inf Div. The Regt remained in position until 1400 and then assembled as follows:

1st Bn - GEVELSDORF and vic (054685) and HASSELSWEILER (055675).
2nd Bn - GEVELSDORF with GP at RALSHOVEN (039681).
3rd Bn and Plat of 453rd AAA Bn - HASSELSWEILER (055675).
Co B, 643rd TD Bn and Co A, 736th Tr Bn - MUNTZ (040660).

28 February 1945.

Reorganization and maintenance of vehicles begun. Shower baths set up and Regt readied itself for future operations.

SUBJECT: Report After Action Against the Enemy.

TO : The Adjutant General, Washington, D. C. (thru channels).

In accordance with paragraph 10 (c-3), AR 345-105, and Adm Memo #3 Hq VII Corps, 30 July 1944, the following report after action for the month of March 1945 is submitted:

1 March 1945.

At 282300, Regtl CO and S-3 reported to Div CP to receive orders for movement of the Regtl CT. The Regtl CO returned to the Regtl CP and issued orders at 0200 for the movement of the Regt to vic of BEDBURDYCK, GERMANY (177808). The Comd Gp departed at 0530.

The 1st serial, consisting of the 2nd Bn, 323rd FA Bn, Cn Co, Co B 643rd TD Bn, AT Co, Co A 736th Tk Bn, and Flat Y of the 453rd AA Bn crossed IP at TITZ at 0630 for BEDBURDYCK. The 1st Bn and Hq Co were to follow later in serial #3 and the 3rd Bn and Co B 308th Med Bn were to make up serial #6.

The movement of the 3rd and 6th serials was delayed considerably due to the great number of units moving forward, congested traffic, and were far behind schedule in arriving at new area.

The Comd Gp established Fwd CP at BUSCH (202837) at 0850. They were the first American troops to reach that town. Eight PsW were taken by the Comd Gp and one enemy fighter plane was shot down by the I&R Plat.

The attached units, except Co B 308th Med Bn, had all closed into assembly area vic BUSCH by 1600. The 2nd Bn detrucked at BEDBURDYCK and proceeded on foot to LUTTERGHLEN (212860) closing in at 1130. The trucks that moved the 2nd Bn returned to pick up the 3rd Bn.

At 1300, the 2nd Bn was issued orders to attack. Mission: to attack to the NE with objective of siezing NEUSS and the W bank of the RHINE RIVER in our sector.

The 2nd Bn advanced at 1410 on GREFRATH (230865) in approach march, F Co leading; Tk Co (- 1 plat) atchd to 2nd Bn. No resistance was encountered and 15 PsW were taken by the Bn in clearing up the town. The 2nd Bn was ordered to continue the pursuit to deny the enemy the opportunity to reorganize his forces.

F Co encountered high velocity fire from a gun battery after moving out of GREFRATH toward LANZERATH (240872). F Co continued the attack and came under considerable high-velocity fire from a gun battery located at (244877). F Co was receiving fire from a battery of six 88mm guns to the NE. F Co had advanced to within 100 yards of the gun battery at the time they began receiving fire. Arty and ~~COMBAT~~ was directed on these guns with good effect but F Co was still unable to advance. E Co was committed at 1900 to swing to the left of F Co to outflank the gun battery, relieve F Co, and continue on to objective.

E Co jumped off and at 1945 had advanced 1500 yards to (240877) and by 2130, E Co was at (250889) and had encountered no resistance. The guns that had been holding up F Co's advance had been outflanked and F Co was advancing to the right rear of E Co.

By 2300, E Co was moving up to the NORD CANAL astride the road at (253-890) and F Co was advancing steadily on the right. G Co was following up E Co, completing mopping-up operations. The Bn advanced rapidly against light resistance consisting of light arty and S/A fire.

- 1 -

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The 1st Bn detrucked at BEDBURDYCK and closed into GREFRATH at 1635. The 1st Bn was given mission of attacking on the left of the 2nd Bn, crossing the canal and assisting in the taking of NEUSS. C Co and A Co attacked at 1810; G Co to advance on road at (234888) and A Co to attack to the left of C Co to secure Obj 6 (243906), protect the left of the Regt, and secure a crossing of the canal in that sector. At 2320, C Co had reached (236890) and A Co (228893). Resistance was light; scattered arty and S/A fire. Because resistance was determined to be light, A Co was ordered not to proceed to Obj 6 but to attack that part of Obj 4 at (250895). At 2400, A Co was at (239895); B Co (236883); and C Co (236889).

The 3rd Bn closed into GREFRATH at 2230 and remained there through the period.

2 March 1945.

At 0025, E Co had gotten 1 platoon across the canal (258895) on a bridge that had not been destroyed. This platoon reported the far side clear of enemy and E Co began crossing. F Co was at the canal to the left of E Co, and G Co, who had been following, was swinging to the right of E Co to clear the city area on the Bn's right flank. By 0245, both E and F Cos were across the canal, G Co had run into an enemy strong point at (259888) and were bringing up tanks to blast it out. The 2nd Bn at this point was well into the built-up part of NEUSS and was having trouble controlling civilians and guarding PsW. Large buildings made it difficult to advance rapidly and still comb the area. By 0600, the 2nd Bn had advanced to a line along the docks from (27059010) to (272897) and was continuing the mopping-up process.

A Co crossed the RR and was advancing NE and at 0105, was at (246906). C Co on the right of A Co was within 400 yards of the canal. Both Cos sent patrols to the canal to find crossings, and began closing up to the canal. B Co, mounted on tanks, moved up to rear of A Co. Engineers who had previously been alerted for bridging operations had begun to bring forward bridging equipment. A Co ran into an enemy tank which was destroyed by Bazooka teams. All bridges in the 1st Bn except one had been destroyed. However, A Co found damaged locks and by 0630, the Co had crossed and B Co was following.

At 0735, A Co was at GR (251915), receiving some S/A fire. B Co was in the built-up area clearing buildings and factories. 1st Bn continued slow process of moving forward to the N clearing out buildings throughout the day. By 2100, 1st Bn had cleared all the area across the canal from (240915)-(253897)-(257924), except one bunker at (245913). A Co was using dynamite to clear this bunker. Opposition was mainly by sniper and scattered arty fire.

At 0200, the 3rd Bn was ordered to move up behind the 2nd Bn, preparatory to passing through them and continue mission of clearing the town. By 0300, the 3rd Bn had cleared the enemy 88mm gun battery at (244877) that had been by-passed by F Co. Some PsW were taken and the guns put out of action. By 0430, the 3rd Bn had closed in the area vic of (254893) behind the 2nd Bn. At 1230, the 3rd Bn moved out in column of Cos to pass through the 2nd Bn and at 1330, the Bn crossed the LD at (267903) to clear the area within (270930)-(276923)-(427096)-(262918). K Co on the left, I Co on the right. 3rd Bn was supported by Co B, 736th Tk Bn. By 1700, initial objective had been completely secured against light resistance and the 3rd Bn was ordered to continue the attack and take Obj C, square (2892), Obj D (2993) grid square, and Obj E (3192) and (3193) grid squares.

The 3rd Bn moved steadily throughout the night of 2-3 March and by 0545, L and I Cos were on objective and clearing the area preparatory to sending a patrol to the bridge. K Co remained on Obj D consolidating that area and establishing road blocks.

- 2 -

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Resistance was principally S/A and bazooka fire. One platoon of I Co suffered casualties from panzerfaust fired from buildings as they advanced. L Co caught a column of enemy advancing towards them in close formation and killed 14 with MG and BAR fire.

The 1st Bn 331st Inf was attached to 330th Inf Regt at 1630 in place, HINTERFELD (323918) where they had been maintaining a road block while attached to the 2nd Armd Div. The 1st Bn 331st Inf, with 2 platoons, Co B 774th Tk Bn, passed through A Co at 1950 to sieze OBERKASSEL (293952) and attempt to sieze the bridge to DUSSELDORF intact if possible. Steady progress was made throughout the night. Their attached armor was held up by road block at (260923), the foot troops proceeded on mission, some resistance was met at OBERLORICK but was quickly eliminated. The tanks and TDs joined the Bn at 0330 after road block was removed by Engrs. By 0905, the 1st Bn 331st Inf was on the northern edge of Obj E and had contacted our 3rd Bn and both Bns were on the approaches to the bridge when it was blown by the enemy at 0937.

The 329th Inf received a counterattack by enemy infantry and armor from vic of KAPELLEN (222817) at 0600. A task force consisting of Co B 308th Engr Bn (- 1 platoon), 1 gun platoon AT Co and AT Mine Plat, two platoons TDs (T) and Hq Co personnel were dispatched at 0800 to set up road blocks and defense to protect our right flank and rear vic of VIERREICINDEN (214824). At 0930, the attack was broken up by dive bombers and the 329th Inf, all troops except the AT Co, were withdrawn at 1400. The AT Co maintained road blocks until 041000.

Regtl CP displaced to KAMBERG (244881), opened at 1400. Plat Y was relieved from attachment to 2nd Bn and attached to 3rd Bn at 2230.

3 March 1945.

The 1st and 2nd Bn continued to search out their areas during early hours of morning and additional PAW were taken. At 0720, the 2nd Bn was ordered to move to (297937) and sweep area along way. The Bn moved at 0930 and closed in at 1130. The 1st Bn was ordered to follow 2nd Bn to assembly area. The Bn moved at 1115 and closed into area vic (285928) at 1250.

The Regt was in the process of regrouping at 1300 in preparation for further attacks when word was received that the Regt would not move but maintain and organize present positions.

Areas of responsibility were assigned as follows:

1st Bn - (282920)-(278933)-(283938)-(293939).

2nd Bn - (289931)-(292958)-(311949)-(3093).

3rd Bn - the peninsula from east of a line (311949)-(3093).

1st Bn 331st Inf - (281939)-(267960)-(279977)-(311950).

The 1st and 2nd Bns began occupying positions, the 1st Bn 331st Inf remained in the area of the 3rd Bn.

Patrols and road blocks were established to prevent civilian movement and the search of the area was continued.

Plat Y 453rd AA Bn was released from attachment and attached to 329th Inf in place.

The Regtl CP displaced to NEUSS (261895), opening at 0915 and later moved to (283927), opening at 1500.

The attack of 1 March through 3 March was pushed rapidly to exploit the confusion of the enemy created by the rapid advance of our forces in this sector. The steady pressure exerted both day and night prevented him from reorganizing. Elements of many enemy units were taken prisoner.

The resistance throughout the period generally would be classified as light, although some strong points resisted stubbornly. These strong points

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were by-passed by the assault troops and mopped-up by elements that followed.

F Co captured 56 PsW as they came marching down a street at close interval, right shoulder arms. Later the same night, two men captured a half-track towing an 88mm gun, the crew of 15 were riding in the half track. G Co took about 50 police officers of NEUSS as they were mounting trucks to cross the river. In each of the above instances, the enemy was not aware of the fact that our troops were in the area.

Civilians offered very little resistance although cases of sniping by civilians was reported. Civilians milling around hampered operations during darkness.

855 PsW were taken during this period.

4 March 1945.

The 1st Bn 331st reverted to control of the 331st Inf at 0900 and the 1st Bn was ordered to occupy area assigned to 1st Bn 331st, occupation complete at 1130.

Co A 736th Tk Bn and Co B 643rd TD Bn (SF) were released from attachment at 1230.

Bns continued to organize their sectors for defense. OPs were established along the river line.

5 March through 8 March 1945.

Patrols were maintained throughout the period to enforce civilian curfew. On Co and the 323rd FA Bn fired missions on enemy activity across the RHINE.

An enemy concentration of about 150 rds of arty fell on the 3rd Bn area on 051845. The CP received a direct hit, casualties were light. Light harassing fire fell in Regtl area throughout the night.

A patrol of 3 men of Co B crossed the RHINE at (305952) on 070045 and returned on 072100 with information of enemy installations and troop movement on the E side of the river.

Training was conducted on a limited scale with assault boats, squad problems and conditioning marches.

Co B 308th Engr Bn was relieved of attachment on 6 March 1945.

9 March through 19 March 1945.

Considerable harassing fire, arty, mortar and some MG fire fell in the Regtl area throughout the period. Casualties were light.

Training continued, emphasizing assault boat training, Tk, TD and Inf training. Bn and Regtl tests were conducted on attack of village, supported by TDs and tks.

20 March 1945.

The 2nd Bn of the 379th Inf Regt, 95th Inf Div, began relief of the Regt at 1630. Relief was completed at 1915. The Regt remained in same area preparatory to moving on following day to MEUSE RIVER, vic of ECHT, HOLLAND (6960).

21 March 1945.

The Regt crossed IP (276928) at 0950, following the 331st CT. The move out of the assembly area was made under enemy arty fire. The 1st and

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2nd Bns suffered some casualties as a result. Six trucks were temporarily disabled.

The 323rd FA Bn and Co B 308th Med Bn were attached for the move.
The Regtl CP opened at (761485), vic DIERGAARDE, HOLLAND, at 1220.
Bns and Sep units closed into assembly area as follows:
1st Bn - LINNE, HOLLAND (S7485) at 1420.
2nd Bn - MAASBRACHT, HOLLAND (S7085) at 1345.
3rd Bn - HINGEN, HOLLAND (S7180) at 1300.
Cn Co - ST ODILIENBERG, HOLLAND (S7884) at 1235.
AT Co - MONTFORT, HOLLAND (S7482) at 1210.
Sv Co - WALDFEUCHT, GERMANY (S7775) at 1530.

Preparations were immediately begun for river crossing training to begin on the following day on MEUSE RIVER.

22 March 1945.- 27 March 1945.

Day and night training on river crossings continued through the period. Bn attack training with tks and TDs was conducted.

Two provisional truck Cos formed from the 228th FA Gp and the 957th FA Gp were attached to the Regt on 27 March, thus making the Regt completely motorized. This was done in anticipation of a fast-moving situation.

28 March 1945.

Regt, with Co B 308th Med Bn, 323rd FA Bn and Btry C 453rd AAA Bn attached, crossed IP (748955) at 1818 for assembly area vic of SCHIEFBahn, GERMANY (S1694). Btry C 453rd AAA Bn was disbursed throughout the column for AA protection. The move was made without incident. The Regt plus attachments had closed into assembly area vic of SCHIEFBahn, GERMANY at 2130. Regtl CP opened at SCHIEFBahn (165945) at 1900.

29 March 1945.

Regtl CT crossed IP vic of NEERSEN, GERMANY (135946) at 1300, to cross the RHINE RIVER and move to assembly area vic of FRIEDSRICHFELD, GERMANY (273377).

Co B 643rd TD Bn (SP) and Co A 736th Tk Bn joined column at ST TONIS, GERMANY (S1303) and became attached to the Regtl

The guns of Btry C 453rd AAA Bn were disbursed throughout the column for AA protection.

The Regtl CP opened at (273377) at 1730. All elements of CT had closed into assembly by 2230.

30 March 1945.

One platoon of Co B 643rd TD Bn (SP) and one platoon Co A 746th Tk Bn were attached to each of Bns at 0800.

CT moved at 1930 to new assembly area between SYTHEN (645530) and SPRENGSTOFF (633550). Regtl CP opened at 1945 (632550). The CT had closed in assembly area at 310030.

Div still in process of staging up behind 2nd Armd Div.

Plat Y, Btry C 453rd AAA Bn attached to Regt at 1500. One quad was in turn attached to each Bn.

31 March 1945.

The 3rd Bn, supported by Cn Co, was given mission of taking over de-

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defense of bridge heads established across the DORTMUND-EMS CANAL by 2nd Armd Div W of LUDINGHAUSEN. 3rd Bn moved out at 0430 behind I&R Flat reconnaissance. By 0800, relief was effected with I Co on both sides of canal between (780575) and (775530), K Co protecting two bridges at (785505) and (783520). L Co established defense around LUDINGHAUSEN (87952) and (88052). No contact with the enemy.

At 1100, the Regtl CT (- 3rd Bn) was alerted to move to new assembly area vic of SEPPENRADE (S-7651) and at 1300 CT crossed IP (645545). The CT closed into new assembly area at 1600 and were ordered to move immediately to vic of ASCHEBERG (920547). The 2nd Bn, lead element, began moving at 1605.

The 3rd Bn was ordered to leave one reinforced rifle Co guarding bridge-head until troops became available to relieve them. The CT (- K Co) closed into ASCHEBERG at 1950. Regtl CP in ASCHEBERG. Co B 643rd TD Bn (SP) and Co A 736th Tk Bn were relieved from attachment at 1350.
