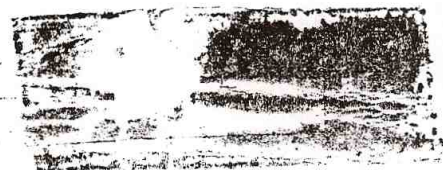

SUBJECT: Report After Action Against Enemy.

1. In accordance with paragraph 10 (c3) AR 345-105, the following report after action against enemy for the month of June, 1944, is hereby submitted.

2. On 27 June 44 the 330th Infantry regiment relieved those elements of the 101st Airborne Division which were holding the sector along the general line 358819 380815 419818 (Map reference-France, 1/50,000, LaHaye-DuPuits 6 E/5)

3. The activity from the time of relief until 2400 30 June 44 consisted of aggressive patrolling and some exchange of artillery fire.

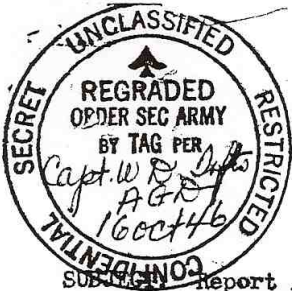

Subject: Report After Action Against the Enemy.

TO : The Adjutant General, Washington, D.C. (Thru Channels).  
In accordance with paragraph 10, (c-3), AR 345-105, the following report after action for the month of July 1944 is submitted.  
Period: 1 July through 31 July.

Location 1.8 miles SE of CARENTAN, 375825. Regiment occupying defensive positions. Action was limited to night patrolling and the exchange of s/a and arty fire. Casualties very light.

4 July. The Regiment in conjunction with units on the right and left launched an attack at 0500 after a 15 minute arty preparation. 1st and 2nd Bns in the assault. The attack met stiff resistance especially mortar and arty fire which was zeroed in on hedgerows over which the attack had to pass. At 0800 the 2nd Bn was pinned down by mortar and arty fire and were unable to advance. The attack was halted. 1st Bn resumed the attack at 0855. The 2nd Bn received a counterattack and was forced to withdraw to their original O.P.L. The 3rd Bn was committed at 1907 across the 2nd Bn front and were held up at 1937. Very little progress was made during the day.

5. July 1944. Regiment resumed attack at 0900. The 2nd Bn was ordered to assemble and reorganize and be prepared to attack by 1400. 2nd Bn was committed at 1550 to assist 1st Bn whose situation was not good. 3rd Bn was attached to 329th Inf. 1st and 2nd Bns resumed attack at 2030 and reached objective at 2132. Progress slow.

6. July 1944. 3rd Bn heavily shelled at 0100 as it moved into position with 329th. Shelling disorganized the Bn and caused heavy casualties. Co L was cut off from Bn received enemy counterattack in considerable force which was beaten off after inflicting heavy casualties. 3rd Bn by-passed by 329th.

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7 July 1944.

Enemy counterattacked at 0500, attack was repulsed but counterattack delayed Regt from launching its attack at 0800. Regt supported by company of tanks attacked.

Enemy tanks were encountered, two of which were knocked out by AT gun fire. 3rd Bn cut off, communication lines cut, ammo and food delivered in jeeps escorted by light tanks. 1st and 2nd Bn advanced abreast  $2\frac{1}{2}$  Kilometers and reached objective relieving pressure on 3rd Bn. This advance was made possible by use of a rolling arty barrage, which chisled a narrow penetration through enemy positions leaving a number of small enemy groups on each flank.

8 July 1944.

Attack was resumed, enemy tanks and assault guns encountered. Our tanks were unable to assist materially in advance, suffering heavy losses. Enemy tanks counterattacked but were stopped by bazooka and sticky grenade teams. Regtl OP attacked by tank. Tank was knocked out. 1st and 2nd Bns Aid Stations captured. Regtl received 300 replacements.

9 July 1944.

An attack scheduled for 0900 started off when scouts moved out at 0830 to get to L.D. Our attack held up by delay in arrival of supporting tanks. Attack never reached L.D. due to enemy tanks located in front of the center of 2nd Bn. Tanks stopped our attack during the morning. At 1345 a plan to reduce the tanks holding up the attack was put into action but the arty concentrations fell 300-400 yards short and accompanying friendly tanks ran into fire and the attack failed. At 1540 C.O. stated he had been relieved of command of Regt by Div C.O. Asst Div C.O. arrived and took over temporary command of Regt. At 1830 a third attack planned by acting Regtl C.O., was launched and the net gain was from 200 to 300 yards with furthest elements almost reaching M.L.R. The operation finished at this point with 7 tanks found to oppose us, used as stationary pill boxes firing from hull down positions. During the advance of assault Bns the reserve Bn occupied positions formerly occupied by 1st and 2nd Bns.

NOV 73 50 1944

At 2225 the order was given to return under cover of darkness to original positions occupied before the attack.

10 July 1944.

Colonel McLendon officially relieved of command. 3rd Bn arrived in assembly area at 1130 for an attempt to envelope enemy right flank. Crossed the L.D. at 1414 delay being caused by inability of the tanks to get up on time. 3rd Bn advanced 200 yards from L.D. and ran into road blocks covered by fire from tanks. 15 tanks estimated to be in whole area. Little progress made and 3rd Bn ordered to withdraw to original assembly area. Well placed concentrations and time fire causing great damage to Germans who were caught in open for first time.

11 July 1944.

Attack resumed at 1030. Attack supported by dive bombing. Situation improved and 1st and 2nd Bns broke through defense line held by tanks. After supporting tanks and T.D.'s were left behind by the Infantry.

12 July 1944.

Operations consisted of cleaning up LE PORT peninsula, 385762.

13 July 1944.

Regt, (less two reinforced rifle companies garrisoning the LE PORT peninsula) moved into assembly area. Col. Foster assumed command of the Regt.

14 July 1944.

2nd Bn attached to 531st for their support. Regiment, (less 2nd Bn,) was attached to 9th Division and proceeded to LES CHAMPS DE LOSQUE, 395712.

15 - 17 July 1944.

Regt (- 2nd Bn) made coordinated attack against REMILLY SUR LUZON, 381708, with units of 9th Inf Div at 1130. It was necessary for 3rd Bn to make a stream crossing during this operation. Enemy had observation on the stream and 3rd Bn suffered casualties from small arms fire. 24th Cav was attached to Regt and assisted Regt in accomplishing mission successfully.



18 - 24 July 1944.

Regt reverted to 83d Div control on 18th. Slow but steady progress made during period against stubborn resistance. Approximately 225 replacements received during this time.

25 - 28 July 1944.

Regt began attack at 1110 coordinating with 9th Div on left. Attack was preceded by 80 minute bombing preparation by some 1800, dive, medium and heavy bombers. Greatest part of bombing being done in 9th Div sector. Attack made slow progress toward PERIERS - LESSAY road, 365692. Heavy fire from all arms encountered. Flanking fire from MARCHESLEUX, 356719, area being effective against us. 106th Cav protected our right and left flank and maintained contact with 60th Inf on our left. Casualties: 273. The left elements of Regt reached the PERIERS - LESSAY road, 368685, on evening of 26th. Very stiff resistance by enemy covering withdrawal of forces from MARCHESLEUX area, met by Regt at key road junction on PERIERS-LESSAY Road. On 28th July Regt took final objectives and began rapid advance to the south to LEBORY, 389815.

29 - 31 July 1944.

Regt continued to mop up enemy pockets of resistance, which had been by-passed in rapid advance, and to occupy defensive position. 83d Div passed to Corps reserve, and the Regt was alerted for possible movement on short notice.

Total casualties for July 2150.

Total replacements received in July 2681.

3 September 1944.

SUBJECT: Report After Action Against the Enemy.

TO : The Adjutant General, Washington, D.C. (Thru Channels).

In accordance with paragraph 10, (c-3), AR 345-105, the following report after action for the month of August 1944 is submitted.

Period: 1 - 2 August 1944

Location: LE LORY (389815). Div in Corps reserve. Regiment reorganizing; cleaning and repairing equipment. Training in hedgerow fighting and firing MGs, bazookas and rifle grenades carried out. Reconnaissance of roads and assembly areas to S & S.W. made in conjunction with an alert order for movement.

3 August 1944

At 0005, CG issued order for Regiment to move by motor to assembly area in vicinity of FONTORSON (1602), a move of 75 miles. 330th Combat team, motorized crossed IP at 0225, and closed into assembly area at 1455. Entire move made without encountering enemy action but considerable delay was caused by roads congested with armor and supply columns. At 1830, CT 330, moved by truck to new assembly area near BAGEUR PICAN (025028) two miles east of DOL.

4 August 1944

At 1000, CT launched attack to seize DOL DE BRETAGNE (982025). 2nd Bn in assault astride road, 1st Bn on right rear and 3rd Bn on left rear. Only light resistance was met although extensive defensive positions consisting of road blocks, wire and AT ditches surrounded the town. At 1130 2nd Bn was on objective and proceeded through town toward main highway leading to FIERGUER (915005), the new Regt'l objective. 1st Bn remained in vicinity of Dol to clean out the MONT DOL sector (771050). Regt (- 1st Bn) advanced to vicinity of MINIAC (860992) where they moved into assembly area for night. No resistance was met after passing through DOL.

5 August 1944

Regt in Div Res. 3rd Bn was given mission (on Div order) to cross the RANCE River in vicinity of (800978) to establish a bridgehead across the river and block the main DINAN-DINARD road. Patrols were sent out during the night to reconnoiter for suitable site for crossing and to feel out enemy. 1st Bn moved from DOL at 0630 into assembly area joining rest of Regt. At 1900 3rd Bn crossed two companies in assault boats after arty and mortar concentrations drove enemy from positions. At 2000, 3rd Bn was ordered by CG to withdraw from bridgehead across river and was attached to Task Force A, commanded by Brig. Gen. Ernest. Withdrawal effected under heavy enemy arty concentrations. Regt (- 3rd Bn) moved to new assembly area vic of (865099) preparatory to launching attack on ST MALO.

6 August 1944

Regt (- 3rd Bn) attacked at 0900 in column of Bns, 1st Bn leading, advanced rapidly 3 1/2 kilometers and were on objective at 1130. At 1350 attack on ST MALO proper began with a rapid advance by 1st Bn until they were held up by a mine field. 2nd Bn was committed around left flank of 1st Bn.

August 1944

Attack on ST MALO renewed at 0630. 2nd Bn was held up by strong point (ST JOSEPH FORTRESS) (815142). This strong point consisted of permanent gun emplacements in granite rocks of a quarry. Shafts led down to caves hewn out of granite in which enemy holding this point were garrisoned. Stone walls and wire were in front of point. 1st Bn advanced to (809149) following heavy arty preparation on high ground to their front. 1st and 2nd Bns suffered 120 casualties and captured 215 prisoners.

8 August 1944

2nd Bn still held up at ST JOSEPH'S FORTRESS and spent most of the day trying to maneuver around it. 1st Bn initially held up at same strong point but sufficiently strong arty concentrations were placed in front of them to reduce long range mortars and MG fire allowing them to advance to the right of ST JOSEPH FORTRESS (814145). Arty continued to pound ST JOSEPH FORTRESS and 2nd Bn advanced a little taking many prisoners. By 2115, 185 prisoners had surrendered to 2nd Bn and Lt. Col. Norris at 2140, requested arty fire to cease to enable more prisoners to surrender. 2nd Bn resumed attack and were still attempting to close in on bunkers at 2400. Casualties for day 124. 350 prisoners captured.

9 August 1944

2nd Bn continued attack on bunkers till 0245 but were forced to give up attempt to occupy them during darkness due to FPL MG fire along wire and stone walls. At 0725 Germans in ST JOSEPH FORTRESS (815141) began negotiations for surrender with the 2nd Bn and the greater part of the morning was spent by 2nd Bn in taking over the fort. 434 prisoners were brought to the PW cage. After passing the fort opposition was light except for SP guns. 1st Bn launched attack at 0830 and moved forward against slight resistance. By 1120 A Co had reached the waters edge of ST MALO in its zone (798144) and B Co was close behind in its zone, and operations began to comb out snipers and pockets of resistance which had been by-passed. L Co and 2nd Bn, 331st Inf, attached to the Regt for operations against old ST MALO and LE VARDE peninsula. Total PWs for the day: 657.

10 August 1944

1st Bn attacked across causeway (797151) leading to old ST MALO, progress slow. Enemy fought from house to house and had to be blasted out by TD fire and grenades. Heavy fire was received from islands to the north. 2nd Bn 331st started attack to seize ST IDEUC (828161). Patrols were pushed into town but were withdrawn, Bn received fairly heavy fire from LE VARDE peninsula, believed to be naval guns and automatic artillery (AA) from ST IDEUC. Heavy arty fire was laid on ST IDEUC and part of garrison surrendered. 2nd Bn 331st Inf casualties: 9.

11 August 1944

1st Bn relieved 2nd Bn in its sector and continued mission of occupying old ST MALO. 2nd Bn detached and moved to DINARD area under Div control. 1st Bn operations consisted principally of reducing pillboxes and silencing arty fire from ST MALO. At close of day 1st Bn had advanced to point (792150) and occupied the CASINO. 2nd Bn 331st Inf progress slow but methodic in face of arty fire from concrete and steel coastal defense bunkers. Anti-Aircraft guns were used by enemy as direct fire weapons. Pillboxes, bunkers, and strong points were reduced with aid of heavy arty, and tank destroyer weapons. French Resistance forces under command of an American officer protected our right flank. 2nd Bn 329 was attached to Regt on evening of 11th for operations on following day.

12 August 1944

1st Bn 330th Inf with L Co 331st Inf, attached continued attack on the CHATEAU (78951500) guarding approach to ST MALO. No great progress made. Efforts to reduce walls, pillboxes and gun emplacements by heavy arty and direct fire weapons was continued. CHATEAU was dive bombed at 1330. Enemy 20mm guns still active. 2nd Bn 331st captured fort at ST IDEUC (825164) taking 160 prisoners in process, then advanced steadily and strong point at LA FRESNE (825169) was taken in early afternoon. 2nd Bn 329th launched its attack on LE VERDE peninsula and assisted 2nd Bn 331st by flanking strong points that had held up their advance.

12 August 1944 (cont.)

G Co, 329th Inf, on the left of Bn sector was held up by bunkers at LA BASTILLE (839169). After reducing this strong point the Bn advanced rapidly through skillful use of supporting tanks, TDs and other supporting weapons. By 2130 all the area SE of LA VERDE peninsula had been cleaned out and the peninsula itself cut off. French Resistance forces occupied ST VINCENT (843171) and had a strong patrol in ROTHENEUF (831181) after patrols during previous night found them unoccupied by the Germans. Total prisoners for the day: 303.

13 August 1944

No change in tactical situation in ST MALO sector. 1500 civilians evacuated from ST MALO under a truce. 2nd Bn 329th relieved 2nd Bn 331st in its sector. 2nd Bn 331st reverted to control of the 331st Inf. 2nd Bn 329th cleaned out rest of LE VERDE peninsula after stubborn resistance of fortified positions at (818176) and (820118) was overcome. Fire from AT and TD weapons kept bunkers buttoned up while infantry assaulted with grenades and flame throwers. 106 prisoners, four of which were officers, taken in capture of bunkers.

14 August 1944

Heavy arty fire was placed on THE CHATEAU and old ST MALO at dawn. At 0900 1st Bn began assault. 3" TD guns were employed to smother fire of enemy and smoke was placed on flank to prevent enemy from using supporting fires from the CITADEL. Tanks were employed but ran into minefields and were unable to advance. Infantry surged through the city gates into the city of old ST MALO meeting only slight resistance. L Co 331st Inf and A Co, 330th Inf, by-passed the CHATEAU and went on into the city. Only snipers and MGs were encountered in mopping up the city. MGs firing from top of the CHATEAU hampered efforts of C Co to place prepared demolitions on walls of building. Upon use of the demolitions the enemy garrison surrendered. 150 PWs taken from CHATEAU. Casualties - none. 329th Inf relieved the 1st Bn 330th Inf in ST MALO, at 1900. Regt (- 2nd and 3rd Bns) at 2130 began move by motor to assembly area at BOIS DE PONTUAL. (092732).

15 August 1944

Regt and attachments closed into assembly area in early part of morning. Regt given mission of mopping up a sector by-passed by 331st Inf in its attack on DINARD. No enemy found in sector. Remainder of day given over to rest for troops. All attachments released. 2nd Bn reverted to Regtl control and moved to assembly area vicinity of Regt.

Period 16, 17 and 18 August 1944

Regt in Reserve. Care and cleaning of personnel and equipment and training programs carried out.

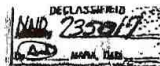
19 August 1944

Regiment ordered to garrison the ST MALO - DINARD Area from CONCALE (918171) west along the coast to ST JACUT DE LA MER (S 6609). Mission: Locate and guard enemy supplies and equipment, maintain order, capture or prevent enemy forces from landing along coast. 1st Bn relieved 331st Inf in DINARD sector. 2nd Bn relieved 329th Inf in ST MALO Area. Regtl CP located on the outskirts of DINARD (76581220). 323d FA Bn (- 1 Btry) and Co C, 802d TD Bn attached.

Period 20 - 24 August 1944

During period search and consolidation of German supplies carried out. Outposts along coast established with motorized patrols maintaining contact. German food and supplies issued civilians through Civil Affairs section and Regtl Supply section. An attempt on 20 August was made, under white flag of truce, to induce garrison on ILE DE CEZEMBRE (758180) to surrender. Attempt unsuccessful. Harassing fire from Arty and TD guns on CEZEMBRE continued. ILE DE CEZEMBRE being the only German resistance remaining in this area. On 21 Aug, 150 FFI were attached to Regt. 50 in turn were attached to 1st Bn and 100 to 2nd Bn for employment.

Period 20 - 24 August (Continued)



On August 22 propaganda leaflets were fired on island by Arty after which another party, under flag of truce, again went to island to try and induce them to surrender, this attempt also unsuccessful. Island was dive bombed on 23 August.

25 August 1944

Co E relieved 1st Bn in the DINARD area and 2nd Bn took over responsibility of garrisoning the ST MALO - DINARD Sector. Cannon Co was attached to 2nd Bn for this mission. At 1000, Regt (- 2nd, 3rd Bns and Cn Co) with 325d FA Bn and Co C, 802d TD Bn attached, departed from ST MALO - DINARD area on 180 mile road march to CHATEAU LA VALLIERE (484852). The movement was made without incident. 308th Engr Bn, a provisional battery of 453d AAA Bn (AW) consisting of quadruple .50 cal. guns and two recon platoons of 802d TD Bn were attached to Regt to assist in carrying out mission of establishing OPs and patrols, and to search out and prevent enemy from infiltrating across LOIRE River between SAUMUR (exclusive) and ORLEANS (exclusive). 1st Bn closed into assembly area vic of CIERE (530714) and Regtl Hq and attachments vic 2 1/2 miles south of CHATEAU LA VALLIERE at 2200.

26 August 1944

1st Bn reconnoitered and outposted LOIRE River line from SAUMUR 1755 (exclusive) to TOURS (7567) (exclusive) LANGONAIS (540603) and CINQ-MARS-LA-PILE (582628) thought to be enemy strong points were occupied. All enemy in sector driven south of LOIRE River. Patrols consisting of elements of the I & R Platoon, quadruple .50 cal. guns of 453d AAA Bn and motorized infantry were formed. These patrols reconnoitered area N and N.W. of TOURS and vic S., S.E. and S.W. of CHATEAU LA VALLIERE. Contact made with Free French, who were active in area, and plans for coordination of efforts effected.

27 August 1944

1st Bn continued to man OPs and patrol area in its sector. River line and area between TOURS and ORLEANS patrolled. No contact with enemy made in either sector. Efforts to coordinate and equip FFI with German equipment continued. The caves captured at CINQ-MARS-LA-PILE (582628) was found to contain German supplies, principally food, of tremendous proportions. There existed tunnels, some 22 kilometers in length, with large store rooms off each side of tunnel. Regtl Staff contacted Div Hq to get a higher Hq to take over control of caves to avoid complications with FFI who claimed possession of the captured stores.

28 August 1944

At 0800, 329th Inf assumed control of 330th sector. 1st Bn 330th was attached to 329th Inf and remained in present positions. At 0830, Regt (less 3 Bns) plus Co B 808th Engrs and Co C, 802d TD Bn attached moved by motor to DINARD. Regt closed into assembly areas at 1900. Because joint operations with navy were to be inaugurated to seize ILE DE CEZEMERE (755180), elements of Div forward CP were moved to Regt CP.

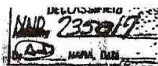
29 - 30 August 1944

Plans for assault of CEZEMERE were formulated and 2nd Bn troops receiving training in landing technique using alligators and LCPs. Softening up process on island continued with air bombings, naval bombardment and arty fire.

31 August 1944

Softening process continued. 300 Heavy bombers and 24 P56's, latter with oil bombs, bombed island. 8" Howitzers and 8" guns shelled island.

1 October 1944

SUBJECT: Report After Action Against the Enemy.

TO : The Adjutant General, Washington, D.C. (Thru Channels).

In accordance with paragraph 10, (c-3), AR 345-105 the following report after action for the month of September 1944 is submitted.

Period: 1 September 1944.

Training for landing operations on Isle of CEZEMBE by 2nd Bn continued. Date for landing set for 2 September. Island was heavily bombed by heavy, medium, and dive bombers. Shelling by warships and heavy arty (one Bn 8" Howitzers and one Bn 8" guns) continued. Two more trips to CEZEMBE made in attempt to induce surrender, both trips were unsuccessful. (At this time Bns disposed as follows: 1st Bn attached to 329th Inf vic CHATEAU LA VALLIERE; 3rd Bn attached to Task Force A in operations against BREST)

2 September 1944.

At 0800 garrison on CEZEMBE raised a white flag and troops were immediately dispatched in LSPV's to take prisoners off island. 320 men, one German and two Italian officers taken prisoner. 2nd Bn resumed garrison of ST MALO - DINARD area and were also ordered to put detachment on CEZEMBE but rough sea prevented them doing this. 323d FA (- 1 Btry) and Co C, 802d TD Bn were attached to 330th Inf and ordered to vic of CHATEAU LA VALLIERE (484852) and were temporarily attached on arrival to 322 FA pending arrival of 330th Inf in that area.

3 September 1944.

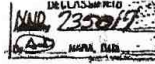
323d FA (- 1 Btry) and Co C, 802d TD Bn crossed IP for CHATEAU LA VALLIERE at 0830. One rifle Co (- one rifle platoon) plus 1 platoon HMGs and 1 Sec 81mm Mortars put on CEZEMBE as garrison. (Garrison was reduced to a platoon on following day). Regt received warning order for movement to ANGERS to relieve 329th Inf in that area.

4 September 1944.

Regt (- 3 Bns) moved by motor at 0900 for ANGERS (8279), a move of 122 miles, and closed into assembly area in ANGERS at 1630. 1st Bn was relieved from attachment to 329th Inf and moved from CLERE (530714) to ANGERS closing in at 0830. Contact with 329th Inf was made preparatory to taking over area on 5 September. Mission was defensive, to prevent enemy crossing LOIRE RIVER from S in Regtl sector; CHAMP TOCE SUR LOIRE (584728) W to SAMUR, and responsibility for guarding all captured German stores in regimental sector.

1944



5 September 1944. - 12 September 1944.

Relief of 329th Infantry completed in the morning. 1st Bn assigned sector from ST SENN DAS LINIERES (57577) SE to LOIRE RIVER, then E along N bank of river to LA BOHALLE (59373). Outposts and patrols established along LOIRE between ANGERS and CHAMP TOCE SUR LOIRE (584728) and Co C, 802d TD Bn established patrols along LOIRE from ANGERS to SAUMUR. Contact patrols were sent out to contact FFI in area. Patrols of the I & R Platoon made reconnaissance along S bank of LOIRE RIVER and went as far south as CHEMILLE (56850). No enemy encountered. On 9 September the 2nd Bn was relieved in the DINARD - ST MALO area and on the Island of CEZEMBRE by one company of the 156th Inf. The 2nd Bn made motor march to bivouac area 7 kilometers W of ANGERS joining the regiment and were ordered into Regtl reserve where they conducted training. Co D, 774th Tank Bn was attached to Regt and joined on Sept 11 for use in Tank - Infantry Training. On 11 September 83d Rcn Trp was attached to 330th Inf for employment in patrolling on river line. Regimental boundary was extended W along N bank of LOIRE to NANTES (exclusive) and E along N bank of LOIRE to BLOIS (exclusive). 2nd Bn moved by motor to bivouac area vic CHATEAU LA VALLIERE on 12 Sept preparatory to Regt relieving 329th Inf in that sector.

13 September - 22 September.

83d Rcn Trp was relieved from attachment on 13 September and the Regtl CP was moved from ANGERS to vic of CHATEAU LA VALLIERE (484851). The 323d FA Bn and Co C, 802d Tp Bn also moved to same area. One R Co 2nd Bn with 1 Plat HMGs and 1 Sec 81mm Mortars attached, assigned sector W bank of LOIRE RIVER opposite TOURS. 2nd Bn (-) in Regtl reserve. 1st Bn with A-T Co attached, remained in ANGERS. The 1st Bn was given the mission of outpost and patrolling area NANTES (exclusive) to VARENNES (272518) and maintaining guard on German Stores in ANGERS. The TD Co was assigned the river line from VARENNES to TOURS (exclusive). I & R Platoon patrolled area from TOURS (exclusive) to BLOIS (exclusive). On 14 September, Co D, 774th Tank Bn (- 1 Platoon) moved from ANGERS to bivouac area vic of 2nd Bn to continue training. The Cannon Co closed into bivouac area vic of Regtl CP on 17 September and Service Co closed into bivouac area vic of 2nd Bn on 18 September. On 19 September orders were received to turn over all German caches in Regtl Area to Communication Zone. The 1st Bn (- A Co and A-T Platoon) and A-T Co moved by motor from ANGERS to bivouac area vic of CHATEAU LA VALLIERE closing in at 1605 22 September and Co A and A-T Platoon joined Bn on 23 September. During period no enemy was contacted. Normal training plus emphasized training in Tank - Infantry operations and attack of fortified positions was conducted during period.

22 September - 23 September 1944.

On September 22 the 323d FA Bn, Co C, 802d TD Bn (- patrol elements of 10 jeeps and personnel), and Co D, 774th Tank Bn reverted to unit control and departed to rejoin at MONTARGIS. The Rifle Co of the 2nd Bn was withdrawn from TOURS to bivouac area of Bn. 3rd Bn relieved of attachment to Task Force B and organic motor elements closed into bivouac area vic CHATEAU LA VALLIERE at 2030, 22 Sept after a 350 mile motor march from vic of BREST. Foot elements moved by rail to CHATEAU DU LOIR and by truck to bivouac area closing in at 0800 23 September. Regt alerted to move to vic of LUXEMBOURG, hour of departure based on arrival of QM Truck Cos.

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crossed I.P. at CHATEAU LA VALLIERE at 1630 on motor march to LUXEMBOURG. Co B, 308th Engrs joined column at MONTARGIS. First stage of march, 233 miles, to BRIENE LA CHATEAU, made in 11½ hours. Here trucks were gassed up and 4 hour rest halt made. Regt resumed march at 0815 25 Sept and head of column reached assembly area 4 miles NE of LUXEMBOURG (921173) at 1800, tail of Regt closed at 2030. Total distance traveled 372 miles. Regiment in Division reserve.

25 September - 26 September 1944.

Regt spent day on maintenance and setting up in bivouac area. On 26 Sept, 3rd Bn was moved from bivouac area vic of LUXEMBOURG to HETTANGE GRANDE (851910) and were attached to task force POLK as Task Force reserve and to conduct training in assaulting fortified positions against pill boxes and emplacements in MAGINOT LINE in this area. 1 Platoon of A-T Co was attached to 3rd Bn for this training. Co C, 802d TD Bn were also bivouaced in the same area for direct fire training on fortifications. Regt conducted reconnaissance of routes and areas of 329th and 331st Combat teams and for counter-attack plans.

27 September - 30 September 1944.

Reconnaissance by I & R Platoon, Bn Staffs and Co C.O.'s for counter-attack plans continued. Cn Co attached to 322 FA Bn for fire missions and departed at 0800, 29 September, rejoined Regt in former bivouac area at 1030, 30 September. Tank and Infantry training with Co C, 774th Tank Bn conducted, demolition and training in attack of fortified position stressed in this phase.

TO : The Adjutant General, Washington, D. C. (Thru Channels)

In accordance with paragraph 10, (c-3), AR 345-105, the following report after action for the month of October 1944 is submitted:

Period: 1 October 1944.

Disposition at beginning of period: Regt in Div reserve. 3rd Bn attached to Task Force POLK as Task Force reserve vicinity of HETTANGE GRANDE (851910) conducting training in assault of fortified positions on MAGINOT LINE Fortifications. 1st and 2nd Bns conducting training in demolitions, assault group and tank-Inf near bivouac areas 4 miles NE of city of LUXEMBOURG. Regtl CP near SENNINGEN at (921173). 1st Bn relieved 3rd Bn as TF POLK reserve closing into assembly area HETTANGE GRANDE at 1010. 3rd Bn closed into assembly area NE of LUXEMBOURG at 1230.

2 October - 4 October 1944.

Training continued. Reconnaissance for counter-attack plan completed.

5 October 1944.

Regt conducted attack problem under Div control, 1st Bn defending, 2nd and 3rd Bns attacking. Problem ceased at 1630 and Bns moved into assembly areas vic of HASSEL (896068) Regtl CP located at SYREN (905082).

6 October 1944.

Regtl CP opened at DALHEIM (933057) at 0800. Reconnaissance begun preparatory to relieving the 331st Inf on the right Div sector of MOSELLE RIVER line. Relief to be completed prior to 2400 7 October. 1st Bn to relieve right Bn of 331st Inf and 2nd Bn the left Bn. Bn, Co, and platoon commanders contacted commanders of 331st Inf, reconnoitered areas and routes, and arranged for guides to effect relief the following day. Regtl sector: W Bank of MOSELLE RIVER from AHN (inclusive) (0515) S. to point opposite RETTEL (978949). Mission: Drive enemy E. of and patrol vigorously to the MOSELLE RIVER and prevent enemy crossing to W. bank in Regtl sector. Co C, 774th Tank Bn attached to Regt at 1200.

7 October 1944.

Co I, reinforced, attached to 2nd Bn. 1 platoon Co C, 774th Tank Bn attached to 1st Bn and 1 platoon to 2d Bn. Co C, 774th Tank Bn (-2

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platoons) in Regtl reserve. 1st Bn sector N. along W. bank of MOSELLE RIVER from right boundary to (020070). The boundary between Bns: W. from that point through BOUS (9807). 2nd Bn sector extended N. from (020070) to left Regtl boundary. 3rd Bn (-1 rifle co) in Regtl reserve. CP 3rd Bn closed into WALFRANGE (950055) at 1200 and 3rd Bn completed relief of 3rd Bn 331st Inf at 1522, area vic of WALFRANGE. K Co motorized. 1st Bn marched at 0800 and completed relief of 2nd Bn 331st Inf at 2218. 2nd Bn marched at 0800 and completed relief of 1st Bn 331st Inf by 2130. Relief of some outposts completed after darkness and by infiltration because positions were under enemy observation and fire. Front line Co's from N. to S. in 2nd Bn sector were G, F, and I Co. 1st Bn, N. to S. was C and A. Regt supported by arty gpmt under command of CO 323d FA, consisting of 323d FA Bn; Cn Co, Co B, 774th Tank Bn; Co C, 802d TD Bn (direct support of 2nd Bn); 908th FA Bn; Co B, 802d TD Bn (direct support of 1st Bn); 689th FA Bn (med) in general support. In addition Co C, 774th Tank Bn was employed on secondary mission with arty.

8 October 1944.

Rcn of area continued. OP's and outposts manned.

9 October 1944.

Reserve Bn completed rcn and plan for counterattack. Small enemy patrols active on W. bank of river. Our ambush patrols active. Rcn by Bn and Sep Co's carried on in connection with Div Defense Plan. Enemy arty active and our own arty and mortars active firing on enemy troops, bldgs containing enemy, and other targets of opportunity spotted by Inf and Arty OP's.

10 October 1944.

At 2130 an enemy patrol of undetermined strength entered I Co area at (017130), the patrol was driven off in the fire fight that followed.

11 October - 12 October 1944.

Enemy active on E. bank of river especially at NENNIG area where enemy column of 25 vehicles were brought under arty fire. Enemy appears careless both in exposing themselves and vehicles in daylight and fires and lighted vehicles at night.

13 October 1944 and 14 October 1944.

E Co relieved G Co and L Co relieved I Co in 2nd Bn sector. L Co attached to 2nd Bn. I Co relieved A Co in 1st Bn sector on 13 October. Inf OP's adjusted arty fire on enemy personnel and installations spotted across river. Ambushes set up by Cos and I & R Plat to trap enemy patrols operating on our side of the river, with negative results. 81st FA Bn (med) replaced 689th FA Bn in arty groupment supporting regiment.

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15 October 1944.

The two platoons of tanks attached to 1st and 2nd Bns reverted to Co control and Co C, 774th Tank Bn assembled vicinity of DALHEIM, to be employed in secondary mission. At 0930 a nine man enemy patrol entered A Co sector in vicinity of (Q006967). The patrol was engaged by our outpost and a patrol of A Co attempted to surround the enemy; the enemy withdrew and contact could not be regained.

16 October 1944 and 17 October 1944.

An ambush set up by the I & R Platoon encountered an enemy patrol vicinity of (Q007976) as they were moving into position at 161900. The I & R Platoon brought fire on the enemy and enemy withdrew. Marked increase in enemy arty fire on 16th October which lessened on 17th October. Five deserters of enemy 10 man patrol were picked up. The five men had volunteered for patrol duty in order to get on W. side of river to desert.

18 October 1944.

Enemy parachutists were reported to have landed in Div rear area. Motorized patrol of 7 jeeps under officer command formed on Div order at 172040 to proceed to FRISANGE (8803). Patrol was taken from 3rd Bn, 4 536 radios and 2 284 radios given patrol to facilitate communications. Patrol leader and Regtl S-3 reported to Div CP to receive orders. Patrol given mission of proceeding from FRISANGE to NOERTZANGE (785025), contact police chief there who had information of enemy parachutists landing vic MONDER-CONZE (735052), set up CP there and patrol roads between NOERTZANGE and BELVAUX (690028), prevent enemy from moving S. of main road between patrol points. At 180052 patrol moved out from FRISANGE on mission. No parachutists found. Patrol gathered what information it could as to the rumor and was ordered to return to Regtl Area at 181030. Patrol returned at 181245.

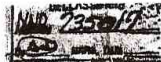
19 October 1944.

K Co relieved L Co at 1845. F Co relieved G Co at 1845, composition of outposts and OPs remained the same. Two men from K Co outpost missing.

20 October 1944.

Regiment took part in demonstration of river crossing at PALZEM (0107) prepared by Div Hq for purpose of testing enemy reaction. Co B 308th Engr Bn moved assault boats to BOUS (980072) on afternoon of 19th as part of demonstration. One platoon of tanks also moved to BOUS on October 19th to be available for rapid employment in the event of enemy action and also as part of the demonstration. The 81mm mortars and HMGs of 3rd Bn were put in position to lay fire on PALZEM. The hv wpns of the 1st and 2nd Bn in outpost within range of PALZEM also were employed in demonstration. The arty gpmt supporting Regt fired concen-

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tration from 0700 to 0715, followed by 81mm mortar and MGs. No foot troops were used in the demonstration. No shifting of enemy reserves was noted, enemy reaction slow in returning arty fire. A six man patrol entered B Co's area in vicinity of (U975958) at 0730. They were engaged by a B Co outpost and the enemy patrol leader killed.

21 October 1944.

Enemy arty activity increased during day. Outpost vic of AHN (LO515) made contact with enemy patrol and inflicted casualties on enemy in fire fight. The 3rd Bn occupied a sector on the river line between 2nd and 1st Bn from (014105) S. to (017064). K Co reverted to control of 3rd Bn and reinforced by 1 sec HMGs and 1 section 81mm mortars occupied the sector.

22 October 1944.

1 sec tanks fired direct fire mission on pillboxes at (015088) camouflaged as haystacks, 38 rounds were fired with no damage believed to have been done pillboxes, tanks received no return fire. No enemy patrol action.

23 October 1944 and 24 October 1944.

Sector quiet during the period.

25 October 1944.

The 32nd Cav relieved 1st Bn in its sector from (978949) N. along W. bank of MOSELLE RIVER to point just S. of WINTRANGE (0001) at 1000. Boundary between 32nd Cav and 330th Inf a line from (0001) W. through S. edge of ELVANGE (972019) to (940019). 1st Bn's sector was extended N. along river line to (013080) and the 1st Bn completed relief of that part of 3rd Bn S. of that point at 1000. The 2nd Bn completed relief of the 3rd Bn in the 3rd Bn area N. of STADTEREDIMUS at 2000. The boundary between the 1st and 2nd Bn; a line from (013080) W. on main road to BOUS (982072), BOUS inclusive to 2nd Bn. The 3rd Bn (-1 platoon of K Co not relieved at that time) moved by motor at 1300 to vic of FLAXWEILER (995195) preparatory to relieving elements of 329th Inf on following day. 3rd Bn to occupy the left sector of the Regt from (053154) N. along MOSELLE RIVER to (100235). The boundary between 330th Inf and 329th Inf on our left; from (100235) S.W. along RR to BETZDORF (0022). One sec tanks Co C, 774th Tank Bn fired 170 rounds HE at targets in PALZEM (015083) beginning at 0730. Building used by enemy as OP was damaged and other buildings used by enemy set fire. No counterbattery fire received by tanks.

26 October 1944.

Cn Co moved from GOSTINGEN to position near WECKER (030227) closing in new position at 1040; Cn Co attached to 323rd FA Bn for fire missions.

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3rd Platoon of K Co moved to join 3rd Bn at 0800. The I & R platoon moved CP from BURMERANGE to BOUS at 1230. Mission of I & R platoon: Establish CP and ambush enemy patrols; patrol forward areas, clear and apprehend suspicious civilians. The 3rd Bn completed the relief of the 329th Inf in its sector at 1330. The eight trucks assigned to motorize one Co of 3rd Bn were transferred to 1st Bn to motorize one company. The 1st Bn, employed 1 rifle company, reinforced, on the river line. 2nd Bn outposted river line with 3 rifle companies (-1 $\frac{1}{2}$  squads), reinforced, and the 3rd Bn with 2 rifle companies (✓) reinforced. A carrying party of 10 men carrying rations to a platoon of L Co in GREVENMACHER was ambushed by an enemy patrol as they returned to the Co CP at 2015, two of our men were killed and three missing. A patrol sent out to intercept enemy patrol as it withdrew did not contact the enemy.

27 October 1944.

Sector quiet - no change.

28 October 1944.

One platoon of motorized company dispatched to woods vic of WALDRED-IMUS (948066) at 1700 to search out 4 man enemy patrol who were seen there by a civilian. The patrol could not be located. 1st Bn apprehended an enemy agent who had been brought across the river by 4 German soldiers who remained on this side of the river. An ambush was laid to trap the enemy soldiers as they attempted to return to GERMANY under cover of darkness. The ambush contacted two enemy groups and succeeded in killing one and it is believed wounded others. One of our men was killed by MG fire from across the river. A German Major of the 17th SS Pz Gren Div crossed river and surrendered to 1st Bn outpost.

29 October 1944 and 30 October 1944.

Sector quiet, no contact with enemy during period.

31 October 1944.

The 3rd Bn pushed strong patrols to high ground at (059184) vic of MACHTUM with view of setting up new outposts; the operation drew enemy fire from concealed positions on both sides of the river. The patrols were withdrawn as the ground was untenable.

General Comment:

The river line in Regtl sector is some 19 miles in length, heavily wooded with deep valleys and draws extending the whole length. Observation is excellent from both sides of the river. The enemy was aggressive in his patrolling on our side of the river and succeeded in inflicting some casualties on us. Our troops made extensive use of booby traps

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around outpost positions and the enemy suffered casualties as a result. Our troops were also successful in ambushing enemy patrols sent across river. Enemy vehicle and anti-personnel mine fields were found to be extensive in the BASE-KONTZ area (993958) where we had three vehicles damaged by mines. We suffered casualties in clearing mines in fields that had been booby trapped. Enemy arty and mortars were active throughout period but apparently not much effort was made on part of the enemy to adjust their mortar fire when they had observation. Arty fire, enemy and our own, was principally harassing and interdictory.

1 December 1944.

The Adjutant General, Washington, D.C. (thru channels)

In accordance with paragraph 10, (c-3), AR 345-105, the following report after action for the month of November 1944 is submitted:

Period: 1 November 1944.

Disposition at beginning of period: Regt occupied defensiv- sector on MOSELLE RIVER from point just S. of WINTERGARD (0001) N. along MOSELLE RIVER to (100235), river line held from N. to S. with 3rd Bn, 2nd Bn and 1st Bn. Regt1 CP at DALLMAN (933057). Attachments: Co J, 774th Tank Bn, assembled vic of DALLMAN, employed in secondary mission. Co Jo attached to 323d FA Bn for fire missions, gun positions vic of WEBKER (030227). At 0010 an enemy patrol of 6 to 8 men with automatic weapons ap- proched a "G" Co outpost at (1018121). One man of "G" Co outpost was killed in the exchange of fire. At 0220 an enemy patrol of 7 or 8 men approached an outpost of "F" Co at (1005083). The patrol was allowed to advance within 30 yards of the outpost position be- fore they opened fire. The enemy patrol leader and a corporal were killed and a third wounded.

2 & 3 November 1944.

Sector Quiet.

4 November 1944.

The 1st Bn was relieved by the 2nd Bn on the river line at 1100. Co D (- 1 platoon MG's) was attached to 32d Cav for employment in clearing the enemy on the W. bank of the river in the CONTZ area. The 1st Bn (- D Co elements attached to 32d Cav) closed into as- sembly area in woods (9998) at 1210. The boundary between the 2nd and 3rd Bn from a point on river line (050142) W. to (000149). The 3rd Bn relieved elements of 2nd Bn N. of this line at 1020. No enemy patrols contacted during period, arty and mortar fire light. 1st Bn contacted 32d Cav & executed reconnaissance before dark preparatory to clearing enemy from bridgehead on W. bank of MOSELLE RIVER in the CONTZ sector (0096) on 5 November. D Co elements reverted to Bn control.

5 November 1944.

At 0800, 1st Bn initiated attack to clear enemy from CONTZ salient. "A" Co began attack on the right, advancing from CONTZ (995958) generally S.E. around reverse slope of the bluff. "B" Co began the attack from SCHENGEN (006977) advancing south. Heavy arty and mortar fire encountered by both Cos from emplacements on E. side of river. The enemy were well dug in on the steep S.E. slope of The STROMBERG Hill in the sector and our arty was unable to put fire on them. "A" Co advanced slowly under heavy arty, mortar and s/a fire and through dense anti-personnel mine fields. At 1030 "A" Cos left platoon had advanced to (0095) where it was pinned down by s/a fire. "A" Co attempted to maneuver right platoon around right flank of enemy and get in rear of enemy. This platoon also came under heavy fire and was pinned down. At 1100 "B" Co had advanced to (005970) where they encountered heavy s/a fire from E. bank of river. Mortars snaked E. bank of river and "B" Co was able to continue advance.

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5 November 1944 (Continued)

"A" Co committed support platoon at 1130 and by employing machine fire had advanced to (005954). At 1420 "A" Co was counterattacked and pushed back to (001950). At 1530 "B" Co repulsed counterattack. No further progress made. At 1700 1st Bn completed consolidation of their positions and were ordered to hold present positions for the night.

At 1630 one rifle company (reinforced) 331st Inf attached to 330th Inf and were moved to MONDCRFF (941145) for possible employment in operations next day.

I & R platoon withdrawn from BCUS assembled at Regtl Hq.

2nd and 3rd Bn sectors quiet.

Casualties - 18 KIA - 93 WIA - 13 MIA.

6 November 1944.

"A" and "B" Co's resumed attack at 0845 and at 1040 right platoon of "B" Co made contact with "A" Co at (003955), "C" Co was echeloned to right rear of "B" Co and employed to clear area along river line. No opposition, no mortar or arty fire encountered. At 10:5 all objectives had been occupied and 1st Bn began reorganization and occupation of sector.

The rifle co of 331st Inf released from attachment at 1440.

7 November 1944.

The 1st Bn outposted STROMBERG Hill sector with "A" & "B" Cos initially. At 1925 "C" Co relieved "A" on outposts. "A" Co, who suffered fairly heavy casualties was placed in reserve to reorganize. 1st Bn sector on river line: from (000974) S to (958950). 200 rounds arty fire in vicinity of (104221). Fire was undoubtedly counterbattery fire directed at Cannon Company. Rounds missed gun position 800 to 1,000 yards. 2nd and 3rd Bn sector quiet.

8 November 1944.

An enemy patrol of 3 men was fired on by "K" Co outpost vic (1029163) at 0025, shortly after daylight two men of this patrol were captured by "K" Co. Enemy arty and mortar fire light. Co B, 705th TD Bn attached in present position (8307) at 1200.

9 November 1944.

TF POLK began relief of Regt in morning hours and the three Bns were completely relieved at 2130. The Regtl combat team began assembling in staging area for operations east of MOSELLE RIVER. The 1st Bn closed into assembly area, "A" & "B" Cos vic of BURMERANGE (977994), "C" & "D" Cos vic of ELVANGE (971018) at 2145. 1st Bn CP located at BURMERANGE. "E" Co (- 1 platoon), "F" Co, and advance elements of Bn CP closed into 2nd Bn assembly area vic of PILSDORF (923050) at 1630. The remainder of Bn remained in former area for the nite. The 3rd Bn CP, Hq Co and "M" Co closed into assembly area at ALLEWEIS (929023) at 2100. "N", "O", & "I" Cos remained in former area for the nite. "I" Co captured enemy patrol leader vic of (1006235) at 0545.

10 November 1944.

The remaining elements of 2nd Bn closed into Bn assembly area at 0830 and 3rd Bn closed at 0910. Cn Co closed into assembly area (922075) at 0905 and the 323rd FA Bn closed into vic of PILSDORF (9205) at 1010. One platoon of Co B, 705th TD Bn attached to each 2nd and 3rd and joined Bns in assembly area at 1050. The

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10 November 1944 (Continued)

assembly of combat team, except for Co C, 31st Inf Co, enroute from METZ Area and attached to Regt, completed at 1010.

11 November 1944.

At 1920 CG, 3rd Inf Div issued oral orders for Regt to recapture former positions on MOSELLE RIVER LINE by 1000 on 12 November.

12 November 1944.

1st and 2nd Bns moved at 0700 to relieve TF POLA on river line. At 1000 both 1st and 2nd Bns had completed relief in their sectors, except those positions to be relieved under cover of darkness. Relief complete at 1800. Regtl W. boundary (057195) W. to (980109); S. boundary (979753) W. to (920955). The boundary between 2nd Bn on N. and 1st Bn on S. (018077) W. to (988025). 3rd Bn in reserve vic of FILSDORF. Co positions vic of ELVAISE (972017). Other units of Regt remained in present positions. No enemy patrols contacted during period. enemy mortar and arty fire very light.

13 November 1944.

Sector quiet. No contact with enemy. 36 rounds 81mm mortar fell in STAUDEREDIMUS (009080) between 2120 - 2145 hours. Five deserters surrendered to 2nd Bn.

14 November 1944.

On 13 November Regt assigned new boundaries on MOSELLE RIVER Line extending from a line (992957) - (9399) N. to a line (017110) - (112985) - (918097). The new boundaries shortened Regtl sector on river line approximately 10 kilometers. The 3rd Bn occupied the N. Sector of the river line and completed relief of 2nd Bn in their sector and had occupied positions by 1700, with "I" and "K" Cos outposting Bn sector and "L" Co in reserve. "L" Co in assembly area vic of WALDEREDIMUS (952073). Bn CP at BOUS. The 1st Bn occupied S. Sector at 1700 with "A" and "B" Cos on outpost line and "C" Co in Bn reserve vicinity of BURMERANGE (978993). Bn CP at BURMERANGE. 1st Bn also maintained CP at HAUTE KONIG (975959). The 2nd Bn was relieved by 351st Inf in that part of their sector N. of new Regtl boundary at 1640 and by 3rd Bn in 3rd Bn sector at 1700. The 2nd Bn closed into assembly area at MCHURGF (940018) at 1955 and were placed in Regtl Reserve with one company motorized. Cannon Co closed into positions vic of BOUS (980071) at 1500 for support in W. part of Regtl Sector. No contact with enemy patrols reported, arty and mortar fire very light. A patrol of 7 men from "G" Co crossed MOSELLE RIVER at (1023120) and reached RJ at (105051265) a few meters from WINCHERS W. No enemy mines, road blocks or personnel encountered. Patrol returned at 2400.

15 November 1944.

An 8 man patrol led by an officer of Co A crossed MOSELLE RIVER vic of SCHENCKEN (0007977) at 141945. The patrol penetrated to edge of FARKL (020978). No defensive works, mine fields, road blocks, booby traps or enemy personnel encountered. Visibility was poor, patrol returned at 0300 15 November. Shortly after midnight an enemy patrol was observed at (1011078) and was fired on and dispersed by our outpost. Enemy arty and mortar fire light.

16 November 1944.

3 man patrol of "I" Co crossed river at (020475) but failed to get beyond river bank which was steep at this place patrol landed, no enemy encountered.

17 November 1944.

No enemy patrols encountered and no enemy arty or mortar fire fell in sector during period. 3 man patrol of I & R Platoon failed to get across MOSELLE RIVER when rubber boat capsized with patrol in the flood stage river.

18 November 1944.

Three patrols crossed MOSELLE RIVER on the night of the 17th. The 3 man patrol of I & R Platoon and a 3 man patrol of the 3rd Bn crossed river at (019062) and immediately ran into enemy. The two patrols were able to break contact but encountered booby traps and more enemy personnel and were unable to penetrate beyond 300 yards of the rivers edge. The patrol of the 1st Bn crossed river at SCHMIDT (009978), contacted TF POLK. The patrol captured one PW. "L" Co relieved "I" Co on river line.

19 November 1944.

Sector quiet - no contact with enemy patrols on W. side of river. A patrol of the 1st Bn crossed MOSELLE RIVER at SCHMIDT to contact TF POLK, ascertain extent of enemy resistance and make a terrain study of ground in area vicinity of (021990) (030971) and (031981) at 1500. Patrol returned at 1900 after completing mission. 1 squad remained across river from SCHMIDT.

20 November 1944.

A two man enemy patrol was fired on by one outpost at STAUBMANN (003081). No enemy arty or mortar fire reported during period.

21 November 1944.

The advance of the 10th Armd Div east of the MOSELLE RIVER uncovered "B" Co and they were therefore directed to withdraw outposts from their sector on river line from SCHMIDT (009978) (exclusive), to HAULE SCHEITZ (inclusive). The withdrawal began, at 1030 and "B" Co was assembled at HAULE SCHEITZ (993999) at 1200. "B" Co sent two officer led patrols across MOSELLE RIVER at 1500 in rear of 10th Armd Div front lines to contact 10th Armd Div and determine the nature and extent of the resistance and make terrain study behind the lines of the 10th Armd Div. "B" Co maintained 4 OPs in their former sector and patrolled between OPs to prevent enemy agents from infiltrating across river.

22 November 1944.

No change in situation. Two patrols of 1st Bn crossed MOSELLE RIVER at 0700 and had contact with 10th Armd Div.

23 November 1944.

The 1st Bn has been uncovered by the advance of the 10th Armd Div east of the MOSELLE RIVER. The 1st Bn was ordered to withdraw outposts from river line. The withdrawal was completed at 0930, and the 1st Bn (- C Co) assembled vic of HESFELANG (E862102) at 1715. "B" Co remained in SCHMIDT (978993). The I & R Platoon established a patrol between 3rd Bn boundary and SCHMIDT (992997) and the

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23 November 1944. (Continued)

Mine Platoon of AT Co established outposts and patrols between REMERSHOF and BASSE CORTZ (993960). The mission of the I & R Platoon and the Mine Platoon of AT Co: keep civilians from re-entering villages along river and prevent enemy from infiltrating across river.

24 November 1944.

"I" Co closed into assembly area at BURMELAND at 1100 and "C" Co joined 1st Bn vic of MELFRANGEN at 1300. Sector was quiet during period, contact made with 10th Armd Div.

25 November 1944.

The 2nd Bn completed relief of the 3rd Bn at 1200. "I" Co remained in BURMELAND. 3rd Bn closed into reserve assembly area vicinity of MONDORFF at 1330. One rifle company of 3rd Bn was motorized and placed on 30 minute alert. One PW was captured by AT Co patrol in a bldg in which he had been hiding since 1st Bn cleared LE STROMBERG Hill on 6 November. No enemy patrols, arty or mortar fire reported during period.

26 November 1944.

1st Bn placed on 2 hour alert and made available to CG 329th Inf upon request to CG 33d Inf Div. 1st Bn made reconnaissance of routes to 329th Inf sector for possible employment.

27 November 1944.

The 10th Armd Div withdrew its forward elements on the east side of MOSELLE RIVER leaving a gap on west bank of river. AT Co was ordered outpost river line from 3rd Bn S. to SCHENGEN (exclusive) and maintain patrols at night. At 1515 the AT Co had occupied sector and the I & R Platoon had begun patrolling in the sector from SCHENGEN to BASSE CORTZ (994957). Enemy arty and mortar fire light during period, no patrols contacted.

28 November 1944.

No Change. Regtl Mine Platoon, in mine clearing operation in STROMBERG Hill Area (003960), removed over 3000 S. mines.

29 November 1944.

At 0001 Regt received warning order to be prepared to move by motor on 30 November. The 2nd Bn, AT Co, Cannon Co and the I & R Platoon were relieved on river line by 331st Inf at 1600. The 2nd Bn closed into assembly area vic of FLEBDORF (923050) at 1700. AT Co closed into DALHEIM at 1600. The 323d FA Bn, Co B, 308th Med Bn located at MONDORFF (945016), Co B 308th Engr Bn (837179) and Co C, 802d TD Bn (948023) were attached to Regt in place at 1200. Enemy arty and mortar fire light during period.

30 November 1944.

Co C, 774th Tn Bn (7405) attached to Regt at 1200 and Co C, 802d TD Bn relieved of attachment. Assembly of Regtl Combat Team for move complete. The 3 Bn Co's and quartering parties departed at 0850 to contact commanders of the 4th Division prior to relief of one Inf by Regt.

Casualties 29 November: 10 - KIA; 96 - WIA; 13 - MIA.

SUBJECT: Report After Action Against the Enemy.

TO : The Adjutant General, Washington, D. C. (thru channels).

In accordance with paragraph 10, (c-3), AR 345-105, the following report after action for the month of December 1944 is submitted:

Period: 1 December 1944.

Disposition at beginning of period: Regtl combat team in assembly area vic of DALHEIM, LUXEMBOURG (933057), attachments:

- 323rd FA Bn (945016)
- Co B, 308th Engr Bn (837179)
- Co B, 308th Med Bn (7405)
- Co C, 774th Tk Bn (7405).

Sector quiet. Move to VII Corps Area postponed for 24 hours. Co C, 774th Tk Bn relieved from attachment to 330th Inf. 95 Trucks of two 1st Army QM Truck Cos closed into Bn areas at 1800. Co B, 308th Engr Bn and Regtl Mine Plat departed at 0800 to move to VII Corps sector to clear mines in Regtl Combat Team assembly area. VII Corps had reported roads, trails, fields and woods heavily mined and no assurance could be given that rear areas were clear of mines.

2 December 1944.

At 1015 Regtl Combat Team received orders to cross IP at 1200 for move to assembly area vic of GRESSENICH, GERMANY. 1st Bn, lead element, crossed IP at 1200.

The 1st Bn closed into assembly area vic of SCHEVENHUTTE, GERMANY (005-422) at 2115 and all elements of combat team had closed into assembly areas at (030130).

The service train which followed the main body suffered 6 casualties from strafing enemy aircraft.

330th Inf became attached to the 4th Div on arrival.

3 December 1944.

The 1st Bn moved from assembly area at 0730 to relieve the 1st Bn of the 22nd Inf, the 2nd Bn moved at 0745 to relieve 3rd Bn, 22nd Inf, and the 3rd Bn moved at 0800 to relieve the 2nd Bn, 22nd Inf. The Regtl CP was established at (025382), the location of the 22nd Inf CP, at 0845. The 1st Bn had completed its relief at 1600, the 2nd at 1700, and the 3rd at 1200. At 2105, Regt assumed responsibility for sector. Our troops occupied same positions as those occupied by 22nd Infantry.

Dispositions: 1st Bn: (06753903) - (06953875) - (06703850), B Co on left, C Co on right, A Co in reserve. 2nd Bn: G Co (05833990) - (06083928); E Co (06083930) - (06403918); F Co (06403918) - (06453880); 3rd Bn: (06303870) - (06203805), K Co on left, I Co in center, and L Co on right. 121st Inf on right, 12th Infantry on left. Contact with 121st Inf made by patrol and was maintained throughout night.

Mortar and arty fire was extremely heavy, fighting went on throughout the process of relief and we suffered casualties in effecting the relief. Muddy roads and fields together with the fact that practically all fields were mined and booby trapped made it impractical to get all organic transportation forward. Therefore, Hvy wpons Cos took 6 jeeps w/trailers and rifle Cos took 1 jeep w/trailer forward. The remainder of Bn vehicles remained behind in Bn motor pools. Co B, 629th TD Bn (SP) arrived in area and attached to 330th Inf on arrival. Co B, 774th Tk Bn attached.

4 December 1944.

Positions unchanged, mortar and arty fire heavy on forward elements, one vehicle 2nd Bn destroyed by mine. Enemy aircraft straffed Regtl area, no casualties resulted.

Co B, 629th TD Bn (SP), relieved elements of 803rd TD Bn (SP) in sector at 1030 and Co C, 774th Tk Bn relieved 70th Tk Bn elements at 1030. Contact with 121st Inf maintained every 3 hours during night by patrol from 3rd Bn.

5 December 1944.

At 0645, approximately 50 enemy attacked B Co's positions from the NE, preceded by heavy concentrations of mortar and arty. B Co allowed enemy to approach to within 50 yards of their positions. In the fire fight that followed, 20 prisoners were taken and approximately 20 killed. B Co suffered very light casualties.

The sector was quiet throughout remainder of day except for arty and mortar which continued to be heavy on front line elements.

At 2330, a reconnaissance patrol of 3rd Bn passed outpost line to reconnoiter area vic of (070392). This was the area from which B Co had received their attack. The patrol was met by accurate mortar fire each time they attempted to advance to their objective, the patrol failed to accomplish mission.

Contact patrols maintained contact with 121st Inf on right throughout night.

6 December 1944.

The 1st Bn readjusted their front lines and occupied the positions of K and I Cos with A Co. 3rd Bn assembled NE of GROSSHAU (048386) as Regtl Reserve. This readjustment was completed at 2400. G Co relieved B Co at 1330. B Co assembled at (063383) in Bn Reserve. The 759th Lt Tk Bn (-B & C) attached to Regt at 2000.

7 December 1944.

330th Inf relieved from attachment to 4th Div at 1600.

Two patrols of Maurauder Plat were given mission of: (1) reconnoiter road leading into SCHAFFSBURG and (2) reconnoiter hill 375 (071378), discover the strength and disposition of enemy forces occupying hill and if possible occupy hill with combat patrol. The patrol reached a point (068381) but received considerable mortar fire and was unsuccessful in penetrating to objective. The patrol returned through A Cos outpost at 0010.

At 1300, a reconnaissance patrol led by A Co NCO penetrated to what he believed to be hill 375 (072377) and reported it unoccupied by enemy. At 1645, 1st Bn started infiltrating 1 Plat to occupy hill 375. At 1855, 1st Bn reported A Co occupied hill 375. One enemy patrol was encountered during movement and driven off.

The Regtl Mine Plat began operations to clear roads leading to hill 375 in order to get light tanks up to reinforce A Co.

Enemy arty and mortar fire was heavy throughout day and night on forward elements.

One officer was killed and jeep destroyed by a mine on a road in 3rd Bn sector that had been traveled on extensively throughout preceding two days.

8 December 1944.

At 072300 A Co discovered it did not occupy hill 375 but rather position generally at (489379). A Co was ordered to occupy hill 375 and B Co alerted to follow. By 0625, both A and B Cos had taken position on hill forming a circular defense the center being at (492377). The enemy occupying position was taken by surprise, 15 men and two officers were taken prisoner before they were aware our forces were on hill. The mission of the enemy on the position was to warn their headquarters in case of an attack.

One platoon of light tanks Co A, 759th Tk Bn, began moving to hill 375 before morning. One tank was lost in friendly mine field of 121st Inf that was not marked. Regtl Mine Plat cleared road ahead of tanks there-

after. At 1230, 1st Plat of Lt Tks had arrived on hill. Co I was attached to 1st Bn to occupy former A Co sector and establish contact with A Co on hill 375. I Co suffered casualties in heavy arty and mortar concentrations and were only partly successful in occupying positions between C and A.

The 2nd Plat of Lt Tks had joined 1st Plat on hill 375 at 1600. The Marauder Plat sent patrols to (073383) where they observed SCHAFBERG at (07453740).

Dec 4A and B Cos attempted to readjust their lines during night of 8 - 9 Dec and were partly successful, extremely heavy arty and mortar fire caused heavy casualties in A and B Cos. The enemy launched counterattack on A Co's position with Inf and one SF gun or tank. The Lt Tks engaged the enemy tank repeatedly but were unable to do it any apparent harm. The enemy tank withdrew and the attack was repulsed. Small groups of enemy infantry supported by tanks attempted to penetrate I Co's sector but were unsuccessful. However, I Co became disorganized as a result and small groups of I Co joined C Co on left while approximately 1 Plat maintained positions. The arty and mortar fire was very heavy in I Co's sector and I Co was unable to maintain contact with A and C Cos. All of Co A, 759th Lt Tk Co were able to complete move to hill 375 with Cos A and B. A and B Cos' front lines: no appreciative change.

10 December 1944.

The Regt launched attack at 0630. The plan of attack was for the 1st Bn to advance from present lines and secure the forward slope of hill 375 (071375), and prevent counterattack from S and SE. At the same time, the 3rd Bn would launch attack in column of companies to seize town of STRASS (078391). The time of attack 0630 was given to take advantage of darkness to prevent observation of enemy and to secure surprise if possible. The 3rd Bn with L Co leading, crossed LD at 0630 through C Co lines and passed through SCHAFBERG (074384) under cover of darkness with little opposition from enemy personnel but against heavy arty and mortar fire. Some prisoners were taken. At 0728, 3rd Bn reported they were in STRASS and that K Co was being committed on the right of L Co and that mopping up operations in the town had begun. Enemy tanks or assault guns attacked 3rd Bn and 3rd Bn knocked out 3 tanks with bazooka fire. The 3rd Bn called for G Co, 774th Tk Bn to come forward and join the Bn at 0900. At 1100, G Co, 774th Tk Bn had joined 3rd Bn in STRASS and were engaged with enemy tanks or SF guns. 1 Plat of Co B, 629th TD Bn moved to STRASS, one TD was knocked out enroute. Our arty continually took enemy SF and Inf under fire. Enemy forces in SCHAFBERG, including direct fire weapons vic of (083387) that had been-bypassed by 3rd Bn, blocked the road between LD and STRASS. No vehicles were able to get past (071381) where the TD was knocked out. At close of day, 3rd Bn still occupied STRASS with L and K Cos and the only communication with 3rd Bn was by radio of 629th TDs. The 1st Bn jumped off at 0630 and after advancing approximately 300 yards, were held up at line (075377) - (07553790) at 0800 before entrenched enemy infantry and extremely heavy arty and mortar fire. No further advance was made by 1st Bn. 1st Bn knocked out 1 enemy tank; 3 of our light tanks were knocked out. At 0955, 1 Plat Co B, 629th TD Bn, towing 1 Plat Regtl AT guns moved to A and B Cos' sector to give direct fire support to 3rd Bn and 1st Bn from vic of (0838). At 1330, G Co was committed to clean out SCHAFBERG area. At 1530, G Co was engaged with entrenched enemy infantry at (071387) and were unable to advance.

During night of 10-11, repeated attempts were made to get supplies to 3rd Bn in STRASS by foot patrols and vehicle. Only tracked vehicles were able to negotiate the muddy roads and tanks were lost to mines and direct fire weapons during daylight. Extremely heavy arty and mortar fire and s/a prevented patrols from getting through. Co A, 87th Cml Co arrived in Regtl Area at 1238 and began supporting Bns by fire at 1430.

11 December 1944.

1st Bn maintained position throughout day under heavy arty and mortar fire. During early hours of morning L and K Cos in STRASS were attacked by enemy armor and infantry. The TDs and TIs engaged armor and reported knocking out 3 enemy armored vehicles. L and K repulsed infantry throughout remainder of daylight. Our forces in STRASS were subjected to continual heavy arty and mortar fire and 3rd Bn had lost four Bn commanders killed, missing and injured. At 1900, 3rd Bn received another attack of infantry and armor from SE but again repulsed the attack and maintained their position. All TDs had been knocked out by close of day and only 7 tanks of Co C, 774th Tk Bn remained in operating order. One 10-man patrol with food, ammo and medical supplies got through to STRASS after dark. 60 casualties were reported to be in STRASS, no evacuation was possible. Only communication by TD radio. At 0730, Co A, 759th Tk Bn was relieved from attachment and elements of CCB, 5th Armd Div passed through 1st Bn. 1st Bn remained on present positions.

12 December 1944.

G Co resumed attack and at 0900 were at (07503855). At 1010, I Co of 331st relieved E and F Cos and E and F Cos went into assembly area behind G Co. At 1300, E Co was committed around right flank of G Co but little progress was made.

E and G Cos resumed attack on SCHAFBERG at 0730 and were engaged with enemy infantry and SF guns vic of SCHAFBERG. At 1655, E and F Cos moved into SCHAFBERG at (078381) and were mopping up and G Co was going on into STRASS. Over 100 FVs were taken by 2nd Bn in SCHAFBERG area. At 1755, G Co made contact with 3rd Bn in STRASS and at 2150, F and E Cos followed. The 1st Bn moved from positions on hill 375 into SCHAFBERG at 2000. Col Foster returned to Regtl CP from 2nd Bn. Had received light wound from shell fragment, was evacuated at 1755. Col Walthour assumed command of Regt at 1955.

The 3rd Bn maintained position in STRASS through period. Medical supplies, food and ammunition was dropped by cub plane on STRASS. Enemy made no further attempt to retake STRASS during period. Large foot patrols, reinforcements and supplies succeeded in getting through to STRASS during night of 12 - 13. Col Shuster accompanied patrol and assumed command 3rd Bn. Tanks towing trailers arrived in STRASS with supplies. Co B, 308th Engr Bn and the Regtl Mine Platoon had been working constantly throughout every night removing mines and making roads passable. Some tanks were lost to mines and direct fire in efforts to relieve 3rd Bn in STRASS.

13 December 1944.

Marauder Plat was given mission of searching out enemy believed to be ambushing wire patrols of 3rd Bn at (056378). Marauder platoon searched the dense forest but were unable to find any enemy.

The 2nd Bn was attached to CCB at 0700. 2nd Bn remained at STRASS preparing to attack and seize half of 1st Objective of CCB at (092386). Attack was scheduled for 1030 but CCB did not attack. The only communication with 2nd Bn still by radio and CCB was unable to get Arty FC to 2nd Bn. The 3rd Bn maintained positions in STRASS. Arty and mortar fire continued to be heavy on SCHAFBERG and STRASS and the area between the two towns. 1st Bn maintained positions in SCHAFBERG.

During the night foot patrols and reinforcements of both 2nd and 3rd Bns got through to STRASS. These patrols carried supplies of all types. 4 out of 5 light tanks towing trailers got through by the SCHAFBERG route. Co A, 87th Cml Co relieved of attachment at 2150 and attached to 331st Infantry VOGG.

Co B, 308th Engr Bn worked throughout the night on the road from STRASS towards GEY to clear the roads of mines. The Engrs attached to 331st Inf worked from GEY towards STRASS. At 140330, the road was reported clear of mines; however, one light tank returning from STRASS hit a mine.

14 December 1944.

The 2nd Bn jumped off in column of companies, E Co leading and at 0725, was at (086387) where they came under s/a fire and were engaged by two enemy SP guns or tanks. Both enemy vehicles were knocked out by bazooka fire. Enemy fortifications on their flanks at (086389) held up E Co's advance. To relieve pressure on supply route to 2nd and 3rd Bns, 3rd Bn was ordered attack to NE and seize high ground at (080397). The 3rd Bn received heavy arty fire, which held them up initially but later advanced rapidly and were on their objective at (08003973) with L Co at 1045.

At 1245, 2nd Bn made contact with AI<sup>0N</sup> of GCB at (085385). G Co moved around-left flank of E to flank enemy pillbox and emplacements at (085388).

15 December 1944.

At 0015, Co B, 308th Engr Bn, completed construction of a treadway bridge over a ~~Shell Crater~~ on the STRASS-GEY road and by morning of the 15th, the evacuation and supply of troops in STRASS was well in hand. L Co continued to hold objective at (08003973) and the remainder of the Bn garrisoned STRASS.

The 2nd Bn, attached to GCB, 5th Armd Div, began attack with GCB and at 1015, G and F Cos were on 1st Objective at (08953869) - (08923905) and at 1105, 2nd Bn had leading elements on 2nd Objective of GCB at (097388).

Disposition of supporting elements:

Co C, 774th Tk Bn: 1 Plat - completely missing or knocked out.  
2 Plat - 3 tks in STRASS, 2 tks in Co area.  
3 Plat - With 3rd Bn in STRASS, at least one known to be knocked out.

Co B, 629th TD Bn: Aslt Gun Plat - In Co assembly area at (042382).  
1 Plat attached to 1st Bn and in SCHAFFBERG - 3 guns operating.  
2 Plat attached to 3rd Bn - In assembly area at (055382). 4 guns in good shape.  
3 Plat - completely knocked out, was with 3rd Bn in STRASS.

At 1305, 1st and 3rd Bns were alerted to move to assembly area at dusk and at 1700, 1st Bn had closed into assembly area vic of (055387) with Bn CP at GROSSHAU (05153818). At 1900, the 3rd Bn closed into assembly area at (047387) vic GROSSHAU. 330th Inf (-2nd Bn), having accomplished mission, passed to Div reserve. 323rd FA Bn relieved of direct support of 330th Inf at 2100.

16 December 1944.

Co C, 774th Tk Bn, and Co B, 629th TD Bn, relieved from attachment to 330th Inf at 1000, and Co B, 308th Engr Bn, relieved of direct support mission. The Regt (-2nd Bn) engaged in refitting and recovering materiel and resting troops. The 2nd Bn (-G Co) in woods N of Quarry (091386) in assembly area. G Co occupies BERGHEIM (104388).

17 December 1944.

No change. There was considerable air activity over Regtl Area, some bombs were dropped and strafing reported. We suffered no casualties or damage.

1st Bn conducted reconnaissance of assembly area to the N.

18 December 1944.

At 1030, 1st Bn closed into assembly area vic of (0442). This move was made to put 1st Bn in favorable position for employment on N flank of Div. Regtl Area was searched for enemy paratroopers; none found. Plans and reconnaissance completed to move regiment to repulse counterattack.

19 and 20 December 1944

Plans completed for defense of GEY area (022398) completed and teams organized to ride tanks and TDs in event regiment is called on to move to repel counterattack. No change.

21 December 1944

No change in tactical situation. 1st Bn completed move back to assembly area vic of GROSSHAU (055388). Regiment (-2d Bn) in one assembly area. Defensive and counterattack plans continued to be improved and supplemented.

22 December 1944

Colonel Walthour relieved of assignment and duty as Regimental Commander, and Colonel Foster assumed command of 330th Infantry at 0920. The 330th Infantry given mission of relieving elements of 5th Armored Div from the boundary W of 331st Inf running from (113033) W to (103395)-(090394) to a boundary on S with 4th Cav Group running E-W from (098370)-(087379). Boundary between battalions (112376) NW to (100382). Third Bn on Right and 2d Bn on left. The 2d Bn was relieved from attachment to 5th Armored Div at 2300 and reverted to Regimental Reserve vic (093386) upon being relieved by 3rd Bn at 2200. The 1st Bn relieved elements of OCA in their sector at 2150. The 3d Bn established contact with Co A at 2305. Sector quiet. 3d Bn received light mortar fire in effecting relief; no casualties resulted. 323d FA Bn in direct support. Regimental CP closed into new location (065393) at 1235. One platoon AT Co attached to each 1st and 3rd Bns.

23 December 1944

The 1st and 3rd Bns continued to make adjustments in their defensive positions. The 1st Bn made contact with 331st Inf on left. The 2nd Bn occupied reserve position and carried out reorganization and rehabilitation. Co B, 772d TD Bn (T) reported in and began reconnaissance to support the regiment. Co C, 774th Tn Bn attached. Because the 5th Armored Div was withdrawn from line before having accomplished mission of clearing ground on W bank of ROER River in the sector, the 330th Infantry was ordered to attack and clear enemy from W bank of ROER in its sector. Mission of 1st Bn: Clear enemy in E of A, occupy town of WINDEN (113385) to W bank of river and destroy bridge at (116389). Mission of 3d Bn: Clear enemy from high ground at (109374) and occupy ground to W bank of ROER River in its sector and destroy bridge at (112373). The 2d Bn remained in reserve and support of 1st and 3d Bns with fire from present positions. At 1615, Co C launched attack from its positions at (111391) towards S edge of WINDEN (114389) and B Co from positions at (11053818) attacked E toward WINDEN, and Co A sent one platoon to attack the town from the S. Both B and C Cos met heavy small arms and artillery fire. Co C got into N edge of town at 1730, but B Co was unable to reach town before nightfall. The 3d Bn from present positions along crest of hill at (106374) attempted to send engineer party accompanied by Infantrymen of Co I to blow bridge at (112373). This party encountered heavy artillery and small arms fire from across river and were unable to reach bridge. 1st Bn, 331st Inf attached in present position at 2400.

24 December 1944.

Co A with a platoon of tanks advanced from southern end of WINDEN (111378) and by 1100 had reached the church at (113386). Resistance was light. Co A, after encountering heavy mortar, bazooka and small arms fire in N edge of town (113389) during night, were able to move forward with one platoon of tanks and by 1100 had penetrated town to a point at (113388). Co B was unable to advance, and was pulled back into Bn reserve in its original position. The resistance of the enemy in the vicinity of the church (113386) was very determined, and was supported by two SP guns. At 1300, Co B was ordered to infiltrate into town from the S and assist Co A in clearing the town. Co I continued to push toward the bridge at (112373). Enemy small arms and artillery fire covered the approaches to the bridge from the center and left and made it impossible to reach bridge from the left. At 1500, Co I began a new attack from positions vic of (105377) and advanced to within 150 yards of bridge where they came under small arms fire from enemy located in factory at (107372). One platoon of Co I attacked factory to clear enemy positions after an artillery preparation of light and heavy howitzers was placed on factory district. By 2300, the platoon of Co I had taken factory positions and captured 26 PWs.

25 December 1944.

Co F attached to 1st Bn to assist in clearing town of WINDEN. The 1st Bn with Co A leading followed by Co B attacked at 0730 with objective the factory at N end of town (11283890). At 1055, Co A was two houses short of objective. Co B, which initially followed Co A, turned right to secure road junction at (11503885). Initially, small arms fire from automatic weapons was main resistance, artillery and mortar fire being sporadic. Co A was held up in present position by bazooka fire. Co F in Bn reserve, followed attacking companies and cleared houses on their right flank. Co C occupied positions on N edge of town (11253917). At 1200, Co A and B received heavy concentrations of mortar fire which was silenced by artillery counter-fire. At 1720, 1st Bn reported the town of WINDEN cleared. Lt. Mannheim, Co B, 308th Engr Bn, made reconnaissance to bridge and placed charges, and at 260300 the bridge was blown. A patrol of Co K and Engrs from Co B, 308th Engr Bn, attempted to reach bridge (112373) by going around hill 253 (10753820) through WINDEN, accompanied by two medium tanks, but ran into small arms automatic fire and were forced to abandon attempt. The platoon of Co I continued to search out small enemy pockets in factory throughout daylight. Both attempts of 3rd Bn to blow bridge at (112373) were not making satisfactory progress; therefore, Co G was attached to 3rd Bn, and Co G and one platoon of Co K plus three tanks were given the mission of securing road junction (11153750) and escorting engineer party through WINDEN at (112380), clearing enemy to bridge, and covering Engrs while charges were placed. By 2040, Co G had cleared road junction and had gotten engineer party to bridge approach. At 2100, while Engr officer was making his reconnaissance to place charges, the bridge was blown at E end by the enemy.

1st Bn 331st Inf was relieved by elements of 113 Cav Gp at 2000 and moved immediately to rejoin 331st Inf. Co G, 774th Tk Bn, relieved from attachment.

26 December 1944.

The 113th Cav Group began relief of 1st Bn at 251930, and at 260330 the 1st Bn had been completely relieved. 1st Bn moved out immediately for new assembly area vic of AACHEN, and closed in that area at 0830.

26 December 1944, cont'd.

Co F rejoined 2nd Bn at 0330 and Co E rejoined at 0600; at 0800, 2nd Bn moved from STRASS to assembly area vic of AACHEN and closed in that area at 1115. The 3rd Bn finished mopping up factory area at 2300, but the relief by the Engrs of the 113th Cav Group was not completed until 0600. The 3rd Bn assembled vic of STRASS, and at 1200, due to artillery fire being placed on road between STRASS and GROSSHAU by the enemy, the Bn marched to GROSSHAU by foot. The 3rd Bn moved by motor at 1400 for assembly area at AACHEN, and closed in that area at 1630. The Regtl CP located at (834403) was the center of the regimental assembly area. At 1730, the Regimental Combat Team with 323rd FA Bn, Co B, 308th Engr Bn, Co B, 308th Med Bn, and Co B, 772nd TD Bn (T), attached for movement, moved by motor to assembly area vicinity of SOMME LEUZE, BELGIUM (3195).

27 December 1944.

Regimental CP opened at (316958) at 0230, and by 0530 all units had closed into assembly area. 330th Infantry (-1st Bn) was attached upon arrival to VII Corps, and placed in Corps reserve. The 1st Bn was attached upon arrival to the 84th Inf Div, and went into assembly position in 84th Inf Div sector. Co B, 772nd TD Bn (T); Co C, 774th Tr Bn, and one platoon Co B, 308th Engr Bn attached to 330th Infantry. Co C, 774th Tr Bn closed in regimental assembly area vic (316958) at 2000. All units of regiment engaged in resting and rehabilitation.

28 December to 31 December 1944.

No change in tactical situation during remainder of period. Regiment engaged in reorganizing, training of replacements, critique of earlier operations and reconnaissance of routes to units of VII Corps for counter-attack plans.
