Verbal instructions from higher Headquarters deleted one enlisted man truck driver from Headquarters Battery strength.

Ltr, Hq FUSA, 21 October 1944, Subj: "Advance Issue of Officer Replacements", authorized an overstrength of one Second Lieutenant per firing battery. (Total addition: Three officers)

T/O & E 6-25, dated 27 September 1944, takes into consideration all of the above items with the exception of ltr, Hq FUSA, and as of 31 December 1944 the battalion operated on the basis of 33 Field Artillery officers, 1 Medical officer, 2 Warrant Officers, 462 Enlisted Men (FA) and 11 Medical enlisted men. However, authority for three overstrength officers has not been rescinded so that the total Field Artillery officer strength is 36.
