

Stations during period: (Contd) (b) Camp Shanks, New York; 31 March 1944 to 5 April 1944 (c) Camp Bryn-y-Pys, Flintshire, Wales; 17 April to 1 May 1944 (d) Aston Park, Shropshire, England; 2 May 1944 to 13 May 1944 (e) Ystradfellete, Brecknockshire, Wales; 14 May 1944 to 27 May 1944 (f) Aston Park, Shropshire, England; 28 May 1944 to 15 June 1944 (g) European Theater of Operations; 19 June 1944 to 31 December 1944 5. Marches: (a) 14th May 1944 battalion proceeded to Ystradfellte, Brecknockshire, Wales in order to hold firing practice. Distance traveled 150 miles. Several firing positions were occupied during the period spent in Ystradfellte area. 27th May 1944 battalion returned to Aston Park, Shropshire, England. (b) 16th June 1944 battalion departed for the marshalling area in southern England and bivouaced the night 16th - 17th June at Boscombe Down, Wiltshire, England near Stonegenge. 17th June the battalion departed Boscombe Down and at 1200 arrived at D-10 marshalling area 10 miles west of Dorchester, England. 18th June departed D-10 marshalling area and proceeded to embarkation point at Portland, England where by 1800 the battalion was loaded aboard LST's. Hq and Hq Battery on IST 288, A - B - C batteries on LST 75 and Service Battery on LST 7. 2200 on the 18th June departed Portland harbor enroute to France. On the morning 19th June IST 288 arrived off Utah Beach and at 1600 Hq. Battery landed in France from IST 288 and proceeded to a bivouac area 1 mile west of St. Marie du Mont, France, Hq. Batterybeing the first element of the 83rd Division to land in France. 20th June Hq Battery departed bivouac area near St. Marie du Mont and proceeded to a bivouac area 2 mile north Bricqueville, France. On 22nd June A - B - C batteries landed at Omaha Beach from LST 75 and proceeded to battalion bivouac area 2 mile north of Bricqueville. 23rd June Service Battery landed at Omaha Beach from IST 7 and proceeded to battalion bivouac area. Battalion remained in bivouac area 2 mile north of Bricqueville until 27th June when battalion moved into first combat position 1 mile west of Carentan. (c) 1800 27th June all batteries registered in first combat position. 101st Airborne Division releived by 83rd Infantry Division. 28th June to 3rd July 1944 remained in position and fired numerous missions. Combat light and no change in front lines. 4th July heavy barrage fired by all artillery inbeachhead opening a heavy offensive against the German positions southwest of Carentan. Heavy fighting all along the divisionfront. 5th July fired barrage for continuation of offensive. Heavy fighting continues throughout day, slight gains made against desperate opposition by the Germans who havebeen identified as the 17th S. S. Panzer Grenadier Division. 6th July battalion displaced forward to new positon 2 miles southwest of carentan along Carentan - Periers road. Heavy fighting contimues - small advances made against continuing stubborn resistance. 7th July to 12 July position unchanged. Heavy fighting continues. 12th July battalion displaced to position 500 yards north of Hotot. Death of 2nd Lieut. Ward on 11th July reported, first member of battalion to be killed in action. 13th July "A" Battery receives heavy counter-battery fire, Cpl. Carder killed. Position unchanged. Heavy fighting continues. 18th July battalion displaced to position 2 miles north west of Remilly-sur-Luzon. 19th July to 27th July position unchanged. Heavy fighting continues. Heavy bombing attack followed by heavy artillery barrage placed on enemy positions on the 25th July, attack progressing slowly. 27th July battalion displaced to position 2 miles south east of Remilly-sur-Luzon. 28th and 129th July position unchanged. General German retreat takes place and armored breakthrough perils entire German resistance in Normandy peninsula. HEADQUARTERS 83d INF. DIV.

(d) 30th July battalion in rest area $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles north west of Marigny - first rest period since 27th June. 31st July to 2nd August battalion in rest area $4\frac{1}{2}$

miles north of Marigny.

(e) 3rd August battalion departed rest area and proceeded to bivouac position limites north east of Pont reson then proceeded to new position 3 miles east of Dol de Bretaigne. 4th August battalion moved to new position 1 mile east of Dol then proceeded to new position 5 miles south east of Dol then proceeded to new position in mile south east of Miniac. No resistance encountered by the infantry and no missions fired.

5th August battalion moved to new position mile north west of Miniac.

No contact with the enemy. No firing. 6th August "C" Battery detached from the battalion to go on special mission with Task Force "B". Battalion less "C" Battery moved to new position 2 miles north of St. Pere.

7th August battalion moved to new position $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles west of St. Malo.

"B" Battery received heavy counter-battery fire. PFC Furtado killed. 8th August position of battalion unchanged. Heavy fighting.

9th August battalion releived from direct support of 330th Infantry.
2200 left position $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles west of St. Malo and proceeded to new position 2 miles south of Pleurtuit. Arrived at new position 0217 - 10 August. 10 August battalion received heavy enemy mortar and small arms fire from the enemy. Received permission to move to rear 2000 yards. Battalion in general support of 56th Field Artillery Battalion of the 121st infantry Combat Team, 8th Division. 10th August to 13th August battalion position unchanged. Mission unchanged.

13th August battalion displaced to new position 1/3 miles south west of Tremereuc. 14th August battalion position unchanged.

15th August battalion displaced to new position 2 miles west of Pleurtuit.
All organized German resistance in the St. Malo - Dinard area collapses with the exception of a small garrison still holding out on the Isle de Cezembre in the St. Malo Bay. 16th August battalion remained in position 2 miles west of Pleurtuit.

17th August battalion moved to rest area 3 miles east of Dinan along the Rance River. 18th - 19th August remained in rest area on Rance River.

19th August battalion moves to position in Dinard in order to fireon
Isle de Cezembre on which the German garrision refuses to surrender. 20th to 24th
August the battalion remained in Dinard area fighting harrasing fire on Isle de
Cezembre. German garrison still refuses to surrender. Ofders received on the 24th
Ifor the battalion to move to position north of Loire River leaving 2nd Bn. of 330th
Infantry Regt in the Dinard area as a garrison for surveillance of the Isle de
Cezembre.

JAN 31 945 25th August battalion departed Dinard area 1030 enroute to Chateau La Valliere. 2045 battalion arrived assembly area 1 mile east of Chateau La Valliere. No contact with the enemy. Distance traveled 171 miles. 26th August battalion 83d Namoved to position area 2 miles south east of Chateau La Valliere. No firing from this position as infantry has not contacted enemy. 1652 Battalion displaced to new south of Loire River.

(d) 30th July battalion in rest area $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles north west of Marigny - first rest period since 27th June. 31st July to 2nd August battalion in rest area $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles north of Marigny.

(e) 3rd August battalion departed rest area and proceeded to bivouac position la miles north east of Pont Orson then proceeded to new position 3 miles east of Dol de Bretaigne. 4th Agust battalion moved to new position 1 mile east of Dol then proceeded to new position 5 miles south east of Dol then proceeded to new position miles south east of Dol then proceeded to new position miles south east of Miniac. No resistance encountered by the infantry and no missions fired.

5th August battalion moved to new position \(\frac{1}{2} \) mile north west of Miniac. No contact with the enemy. No firing. 6th August "C" Battery detached from the battalion to gon on special mission with Task Force "B". Battalion less "C" Battery moved to new position 2 miles north of St. Pere.

7th August battalion moved to new position 2½ miles west of St. Malo.
"B" Battery received heavy counter-battery fire. PFC Furtado killed. Sth August position of battalion unchanged. Heavy fighting.

9th August battalion redeived from direct support of 330th Infantry.
2200 left position $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles west of St. Malo and proceeded to new position 2 miles south of Pleurtuit. Arrived at new position 0217 - 10 August. 10 August battalion received heavy enemy mortar and small arms fire from the enemy. Received permission to move to rear 2000 yards. Battalion in general support of 56th Field Artillery Battalion of the 121st Infantry Combat Team, 8th Division. 10th August to 13th August battalion position unchanged. Mission unchanged.

13th Augustbattalion displaced to new position 1/3 mile south west of Tremereuc. 14th August battalion position unchanged.

15th August battalion displaced to new position 2 miles west of Pleurtuit.
All organized German resistance in the St. Malo - Dinard area collapses with the
exception of a small garrison still holding out on the Isle of De Cezembre in the
St. Malo Bay. 16th Augustbattalion remained in position 2 miles west of Pleurtuit.

17th August battalion moved to rest area 3 miles east of Dinan along the Rance River. 18th - 19th August remained in rest area on Rance River.

19th August battalion moves to position in Dinard in order to fire on Isle de Cezembre on which the German garrision refuses to surrender. 20th to 24th the battalion remained in Dinard area fifting harassing fire on Isle de Cezembre. German garrison still refuses to surrender. Orders received on the 24th for the battalion to move to position north of Loire River leaving 2nd battalion of 330th Infantry Regt in the Dinard area as a garrison for surveillance of Isle De Cezembre.

Valliere. 2055 battalion arrived assembly area 1 mile east of Chateau La Valliere. No contact with the enemy. Distance traveled 171 miles. 26th August battalion moved to position area 2 miles south east of Chateau La Valliere. No firing from this position as infantry has not contacted enemy. 1652 Battalion displaced to new position area 2 miles south east of Clere. Light harrassing fire placed on ememy south of Loire River.

(e) Contd. 28th August battalion departed position area 2 miles south east of Clere enroute to Dinard. Orders have been issued for battalion to support an assault by the 2nd Battalion of the 330th Infantry on Isle de Cezembre. 1915 battalion arrived position area at Dinard. Distance traveled 171 miles. 29th August to 1st September battalion remains in position in Dinard area. Heavy harrassing fire reinforced by daily aerial bombardment placed on Isle de Cezembre in preparation for infantry assault scheduled for 2 Sept. 2 Sept Isle de Cezembre surrenders prior to infantry assault and all resistance in St. Malo - Dinard area definitely ends.

3rd September battalion moves to assembly area 1 mile south of Chateau Ia Valliere. Distance traveled 171 miles. 4th September battalion in assembly area 1 mile south of Chateau La Valliere. Orders received for battalion to move to vicinity Angers.

5th Sept battalion moves to position area vicinity Angers. Mission defensive position of City. Distance traveled from Chateau La Valliere 50 miles. 6th Sept to 12 Sept battalion in position of defense vicinity of Angers. No contact with enemy. Angers first city in France, which battalion has been in, which has been very little damaged by war and where life is very close to normal.

13th Sept battalion departed Angers and moved to defensive position 1 mile west of Chatteau La Valliere. Distance traveled from Angers 50 miles. No contact with the enemy. L4th Sept "C" Battery reported back to battalion control having been released by Task Force "B". During absence from battalion "C" Battery has been in action on the Brittany Teninsula and in the Brest area. "C" Battery reports two men missing in action; 1st Sgt. Frantz and S/Sgt Gordanier. 1st Sgt Frantz reported back to battalion 16th Sept after escape from German prison Camp. Reports Gordanierwounded and still prisoner of Germans. Gordanier returned to U. S. Army hospital after fall of Brest, dies of wounds 3rd Oct 1944. 15th Sept to 21 Sept battalionremains in defensive position vicinity Chateau La Valliere. No contact with enemy and no missions fired.

(f) 22nd Sept battalion moves to assembly area vicinity Montarges. Distance traveled from Chateau La Valliere 150 miles. 23rd Sept battalion departed Montarges assembly area at 2050 enroute to Duchy of Luxembourg. 1045 24th September battalion crosses French - Luxembourg border. 1200 battalion in position vicinity of Bettemburg, Luxembourg.

25th Sept battalion moved to position 1 mile south east of Asplet. OO Mission reinforcing the fires of the 908th F. A. Bn. 26th Sept. first round by battalion to land on German soil fired by 3rd Section of "B" Battery. Pvt. Rey "B" Battery fired the piece.

27th Sept battalion moved to newposition area vicinity Canach. Mission direct support 3rd Battalion 331st Infantry Regiment. Distance traveled from Aspelt 15 miles.

29th Sept battalion moved to position area 1 mile south of Hemstal.

Distance traveled from Canach 17 miles. Mission general support. 30th Sept to

(f) Contd. 5th October battalion moved to position area vicinity of Canach. Distance traveled 17 miles. Mission direct support 3rd Battalion 331st Inf. Regt. Mission of 83rd Division is defense of the west bank of Moselle River. 6th Oct to 24th October battalion remains in position vicinity Canach. Harrassing fire in support of defense of Moselle River. Infantry action limited mainly to patrol action. 8th October Prince Feliz of Luxembourg accompanied General Macon to Bn. O.P. where they watched our fire landing on the German side of the Moselle River. 25th Oct firing batteries moved to new location in order to improve range, "A" Battery to Beyren, "B" Battery to Gostingen, "C" Battery to Beyren. Hq Battery remains in Canach and Service Battery remains at Octrange. 26th October to 9th November battalion remains in position. Harrassing fires and observed missions fired in support of defense of Moselle River.

10th November battalion moved to assembly area vicinity Filsdorf preparatory to crossing Moselle River in support of attack by 330th Infantry Regt. 11th Nov remained in assembly position due to flhoded condition of Moselle River. Engineers unable to properly bridge river.

12th November battalion moved to positions occupied by battalion on 9th
Nov: Hq Battery - Canach, "A" Battery - Beyren, "B" Battery - Gostingen, "C" Battery
Beyren, "Serv" Battery - Oetrange. 13th November positions unchanged. Recconaissance made in Mondorf area.

Lith November battalion moved to position area vicinity of Mondorf.

Mission defensive fires in support of 330th Infantry Regt. with secondary mission to reinforce fires of Task Force Polk which is attacking north on east bank of Moselle River. 15th to 16th November battalion in position vicinity of Mondorf.

Mission remains unchanged.

17th November battalion moved to position area vicinity of Burmerange.
Mission unchanged. 18th Nov to 21st Nov battalion remains in vicinity Burmerange.
Mission unchanged.

22nd November battalion moved to Canach area. "Hq" Battery - Canach, "A" Battery - Beyren, "B" Battery - Gostingen, "C" Battery - Beyren, "Serv" Battery Oetrange. 23rd November to 27th November battalion remains in position area vicinity Ganach. Mission defensive fires in defense of Moselle River. 28th Nov. battalion moved to position area vicinity Mondorf. Mission direct support of Task force Polk. 29th November battalion alerted for movement any time subsequent to 2400. 30th November to 1st December battalion remains in position in vicinity of Mondorf.

2nd December battalion departed Mondorf enroute to Aachen area. 2400 battalion in assembly area 1 mile east of Zwiefall, Germany. Distance traveled 150 miles.

3rd December battalion moved to position area 2 miles west of Grosshau.

330th Infantry Regt releived 22nd Inf. Regt of the 4th Infantry Division. 4th

JAN 3 December "C" Battery 5th Sectiontruck explodes mine while delivering ammo. No

casualties but truck destroyed. 5th December heavy fighting; 1st Lieut Baringer

HEADQUEILLE While acting as forward observer. 6th December battalion remains in position

83d NHeavy fighting continues. Heavy rain has made roads almost impassable.

(f) Contd. 7th December battalion moved to position area = mile west of Grosshau. Road conditions very bad. "A" Battery prime mover explodes a mine. No casualties but vehicle destroyed. 8th December battalion fires round number 50,000 since entering action on 27 June. Heavy fighting continues but slow steady progress is being made in clearing the Germans from their last hold on the Hurgen Forest area. 9th December to 10th December battalion remains in position. T/4 Vachon reported missing in action. Heavy fighting continues. 11th to 12th December battalion remains in position | mile west of Grosshau. "B" Battery receives counter-battery fire, no casualties. 13th to 16th December battalion remains in position. Heavy fighting continues. Infantry making slow steady progress against fanatical resistance. Body of T/4 Vachon discovered in Strass. Reconnaissance for new position made. 17th December battalion ordered to remain in present position and not displace. 18th December to 24th December battalion remains in position mile west of Grosshau. Heavy fighting continues. Infantry making slow progress toward the Roer River and the city of Duren. 25th December (Christmas Day). The first Christmas day overseas is spent among the pine trees of the Hurtgen Forest and Except for turekey and a few extras on the menu is just another day of war. Throughout the month of December German air activity over our lines has been fairly heavy but the cost to German caused by friendly planes and friendly anti-aircraft artillery is very heavy. All west bank of Roer River in the sector of the 83rd Division is now clear of the enemy.

26th December battalion leaves position ½ mile west of Grosshau for assembly area vicinity of Brand, Germany. Battalion departed assembly area vicinity Brand Germany for assembly area vicinity Havelange, Belgium on the north flank of the breakthrough area caused by the German counter-attack which began on the 16th December and had at this time driven a wedge into the American line almost 45 miles deep. 27th December 0400 battalion closed in assembly area vicinity Havelange. Distance traveled 75 miles. 1630 battalion moved to position area vicinity of Les Basses, Belgium. Mission reinforce the fires of the 322nd F. A. Bn. 28th Dec to 30th December battalion remains in psotion vicinity Les Basses, Belgium. Mission unchanged.

31st December battalion moved to position area vicinity Soy, Belgium.
Mission general support reinforcing fires of the 898th F. A. Bn., 75th infantry Division.
