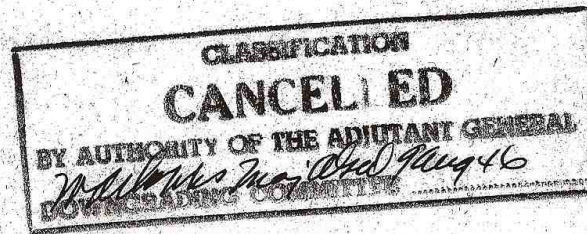

1 MAY 1945

The month of May started with the 329th Infantry still sitting in the central sector of the Elbe River Bridgehead, with the 330th Infantry on the left and the 331st Infantry on the right. 2nd Bn occupied a forward position to the east in Zerbst, WD 9882. To the rear were 1st Bn, on the left, and 3rd Bn, on the right.

On April 29th an administrative group, commanded by Lt Col Pack, had gone 65kms back to the rear, or west, to handle the administration of DPs and PWs and to keep order in the area. This group consisted of quartering parties of all the units, A-T Co (less the gun platoons) Cn Co, the Regt'l Medical section and I Co.

The action in the bridgehead area had been reduced to the sending out of patrols. On the 1st of May, 3 patrols went out from Zerbst. The I & R went NE to Kerchaw, WE 0289, Badewitz, WE 0389, took prisoners and engaged in a fire fight with some enemy defending Deetz, WE 0392. 2nd Bn patrol went to Pultsporde, WE 0284, Bonitz, WE 0484, and Truben, WE 0684, took PWs, and returned. TD Rcn patrol went north to Lindau, WD 9990, took PWs, went west to Buhlendorf, WD 9590, and returned.

Regimental CP was still in Walternienburg, WD 8882, where it had been since 15 April.

Attachments as of the beginning of the month were: Co A, 306 Med Bn; Co A, 736th Tk Bn; and Co A (plus rcn plat), 643rd TD Bn.

2 - 4 MAY 1945

On these 3 days the Regiment was busily occupied with the evacuation of PWs and DPs. The largest group to be handled was a group of 19,000 Allied PWs of assorted nationalities who were located in a camp 30 kms NE of Zerbst.

On the 2nd of May the rcn platoon of 643rd TD Bn was detached and returned to their battalion for maintenance.

5 MAY 1945

The Regiment moved out of the Elbe bridgehead area, crossed the IP at 1430, and closed into the rear Military Government area at 2215. This was the same MG area to which Lt Col Pack's administrative group had moved on April 29. The Regt'l CP was located at Wegeleben, WD 3670, a move of 65 kms to the west. 1st Bn CP was located in Wegeleben, WD 4577. Cos G, F, and K remained in the Elbe bridgehead area to turn over positions to the Russians. Lt Col Sharpe was in command of these 3 companies. As of 1800 our attachments were relieved, and then the entire 643rd TD Bn was attached. An order was received from Div late in the evening for the Regiment to move south to take over a new MG area.

6 MAY 1945

The first unit crossed the IP at 0900 and last unit closed into the new area at 1500. This new area was in the Harz Mountains, and the job to be done was a administrative one. The area covered approximately 750 square kms, and in taking over the area the Regiment relieved elements of the 8th Armd Div. The Regt'l CP moved to Blankenburg, WD 2159, a move of 12 miles to the SW.

6 MAY 1945 Cont'd

Other CPs were as follows: 1st Bn - Ilsenburg, WD 0267; 2nd Bn - Hasselfelde, WD 1548; 3rd Bn - Blankenburg; 643rd TD Bn - Braunlage, WD 9852. C, F, and K Companies rejoined their Battalions.

7 MAY 1945

There were slight changes made in the positions of some of the units to facilitate administration of the area.

8 MAY 1945

Division ordered us to move to another new area so that all of the Div units would be in British occupation territory. The Regiment started moving at 1100 without benefit of extra transportation. Because of shuttling the last units did not close into the new area until late at night. The Regt'l CP moved 40 miles NW to Wolfenbittel, rX 9200. Bn CPs were located as follows: 1st Bn - Bortfeld, rX 8113; 2nd Bn - Schoppenstedt, WD 0798; 3rd Bn - Schandleah, rY 0112. The size of the area was about 800 square kms, surrounding the large city of Braunschweig, rX 9010. 308th Engr Bn was already in Braunschweig performing the guard and MG duties of that city, and they were attached in place. 643rd TD Bn was detached. In this area we relieved elements of 2nd Armd Div, 330th Inf, and Div Arty.

9 MAY 1945

The Regiment continued organization of the new area, putting guards on installations, setting up the administration of MG, and planning patrol routes to those towns where no troops were located.

Starting at 0001, this day was the official V-E DAY, although there had been only a small amount of fighting done by the Regiment since the last German counterattack against our Elbe Bridgehead on April 18th.

10 - 20 MAY 1945

During this period the Regiment continued with the administration of MG in the Braunschweig area. Due to the size of the area and the many installations to be guarded, all units were kept very busy. On May 11th, the 322nd FA Bn was attached and relieved the 308th Engr Bn. On May 17th, the Regimental area of responsibility was increased by the attachment of the 736th Tk Bn in place. On May 20, Co A (-one platoon), 524th MP Bn, was attached to the Regiment and given to 322nd FA Bn to aid them in the city of Braunschweig.

Training schedules were submitted to Division for the week commencing May 21st. The Regiment was to conduct limited training - a minimum of 27 hours per week plus several hours for I & E and athletic programs. Familiarization firing was to be the principle subject of training, taking 10 hours per week although it was planned that actual firing would not start until May 28th.

21 - 27 MAY 1945

The training schedules mentioned above were put into effect. MG went on as usual. Some of the DPs and PWs in the area were gathered up and started off on their journey home. Colonel Crabill, who had been Regimental Commander since the activation of the Regiment in August 1942, left the Regiment on May 24th to become Assistant Division Commander. Colonel Crabill had been loved and respected by officers and men alike for his actions as an officer and a man, and all were sorry to see his departure from the Regiment. Colonel Reid, recently of the 106th Inf Div, arrived on the same day and took over the duties of Regimental Commander.

28 - 30 MAY 1945

Another week of training was started, with familiarization firing the principal subject. MG still had its problems, but they became fewer. The Russians and Poles were the two largest groups of DPs still in the area, and we awaited instructions for their removal. On 30 May, Memorial Day, there was no training, and services were held for those of the Regiment who had given their lives in the War with Germany.

31 MAY 1945

A quartering party left at 0700 for Duggendorf, Germany, approximately 300 miles to the south. It was planned that the British would relieve the 329th in the Braunschweig area on June 1st and that we would move to vic of Dennegdorf on June 5th.
