

#### 1 March 1945

0100		for ]	lst	Bn	and	its	attachments.	Gave plan for	r

0830 1st Bn started for new assembly area. Moved up to the vicinity of ROCKRATH, Germany WF 2385

7730 2nd Bn moved to same vicinity. 3rd Bn followed.

1300 Regt given sector between 330th on the left and 331st on the right. Direction of of theattack to the NE to NEUSS and then the RHINE RIVER opposite DUSSELDORF. 1st Bn detrucked in assembly area, marched to LD and jumped off at 1300. Captured objectives No. 1 and 3.

1820 Elements of 1st Bn reported on edge of objective 7.

1930 Received word from Division to continue attack throughout the night.

2nd Bn in Regt reserve - ready on callin town of HOLZHEIM. 3rd Bn also in 2000 reserve - ready on call in town of LOVELING.

Col Speedie reported to CP for plans on reaching the RHINE. 2200

2400 Total PW's for today - 2.

## 2 March 1945 ·

0045 3rd Bn moved from their assembly in the vicinity of LOVELING. 0330 2nd Bn alerted to be ready to move to assist 1st Bn on their left. 0430 Col Sharpe visited CP to receive instructions on his plan of maneuver. 0530 1st Bn captured objective #7.

2nd Bn notified to remain in present location.

0630 1st Bn captured objective #11.

0725 3rd Bn jumped off. Were slow starting due to more resistance than expected. Casualties were very light.

0930 Regtl CP established in LOVELING.

Col Crabill went down to 3rd Bn. Present plan to reach Rhine not going 1000 through. Col Crabill planning a tank attack.

1010 Reported that a German counterattack cut main road at KAPPELEN with tanks and Infantry. Our air is working on them.

PW total for today as of 1200 - 192. 1200

Elements of 3rd Bn reported 300 yards from bridge over RHINE. Report many 1340 prisoners taken.

1530 Gen Farenbaugh came down to CP. Col Dodge from Engrs also joined conference. Planned on river crossing for tonight. 3rd Bn is going to cross.

1830 Col Crabill, Maj Bagley, Maj Orr, and Col Dodge went forward to 3rd Bn OP. Will operate action for river crossing over there.

2000 Operations for tonight called off. Germans blew part of the bridge. combat patrol is going out to check damage.

2300 Total PW's for today as of 2300 - 287

# 3 March 1945

0400 Germans finished blowing up bridge. Bridge now totally impassable.

0900 Col Powell now with our Regiment. Will help Col Crabill.

Gen Farenbaugh came down. Present mission now is to hold our bank of the 1000 RHINE with the 3rd Bn. 2nd Bn to hold part of ERFT Canal and relieve 2nd Bn 331st.

Regtl CP started displacing to NEUSS. 1200

Regtl CP closed in new location in NEUSS. 1st Bn also in NEUSS holding 1330 sector formerly held by elements of 330th.

Received report of Ferry activity on RHINE. Checked on report and could 1910 not locate its source

1935 Total PW's for today as of 1930 - 29.





#### 4 March 1945

- 0930 Today the regiment is to continue mopping up the MEUSS area and organize it for defense. Road blocks are being set up and maintained to prevent the movement of civilians into and within our zone.
- 1955 Total of prisoners taken in drive to and capture of NEUSS, from 1 March to date inclusive, is 403.

#### 5 March 1945

- 0945 99th Inf Div on our right, is moving steadily towards the RHINE on the south side of the ERFT Canal.
- 1305 It has been reported that the 99th Inf Div has reached the RHINE on our right. This will enable the regt to withdraw 2nd Bn from their position on the ERFT Canal where they have been protecting the exposed right flank of the regiment.
- 2nd Bn is being withdrawn from the ERFT Canal and will occupy a reserve position in NEUSS, near the Regtl CP.
- The light tank platoon and AG platoon of 736th Tank Bn have been detached. The Rcn Troop has also been detached, which leaves the Regt with only the normal medical attachment.

#### 6 March 1945

- 0850 2nd Bn completed moving into their reserve area at 0730.
- 0915 Training in the use of assault boats is being started on a small lagoon in the central part of the city of NEUSS.
- It is being planned to send a small patrol to the enemy's side of the RHINE tonight to obtain information on the difficulty in crossing the river and conditions on the other side.
- The patrol crossing the river tonight will consist of 6 men from the Regtl IER platoon and 2 engrs. They will cross in an assault boat at a place SE of NEUSS, approximately 1500 yards south of the highway bridge. The patrol will leave at about 2200 tonight.

#### 7 March 1945

- O730 The IER platoon patrol which crossed the RHINE last night, returned safely at 2230 with the following information: crossing time was 8 minutes; there was very little drift; the bank on the enemy side of the river is firm and there is entrenched enemy 150 yards from the far bank of the river.
- 1300 Training is being continued today with assault boats. A platoon of "Ducks" is being attached for training in loading.

#### 8 March 1945

1000 Training with assault boats and ducks is being continued and training of small units in village fighting and assault of fortified positions is being started today.

#### 9 March 1945

Units will continue training today on same subjects as yesterday.

While the regt has been in this defensive position in NEUSS, an abundance of movies and other forms of entertainment have been afforded to all troops, largely through the untiring efforts of Tec 5 Julius Ansel, Regtl Entertainment director, who has been putting in 16 and 18 hours every day to back up his saying that "Nothing's too good for the boys" which has become a by-word throughout the regt.

#### 9 March 1945 (Cont'd)

2005 4th Cav Group relieved 99th Div on our right today.

#### 10 March 1945

1700 Training was continued today. 3rd platoon of Co D, 736th Tank Bn, was attached today for training and has been given to 2nd Bn. On our right the 113th Cav Group relieved the lith Cav Group.

#### 11 March 1945

- O900 Today is Sunday and no training is being conducted. Plans for training are being made for the coming week.
- 3rd platoon of Co A, 736th Tank Bn, has been attached to the regt for training purposes and has been given to the 3rd Bn.

#### 12 March 1945

Tests on "company in attack" are being held today for Co's E & I. Co's F & K will be tested on a night problem "company in attack" tonight.

#### 13 March 1945

More company problems are being held today. Company B is being tested on a day problem "company in attack" and Co A is to be tested on a night problem "company in attack" tonight. Units not running problems and tests are conducting miscellaneous training, firing of small arms, firing of the "Panzerfaust", firing of mortars, and physical conditioning.

#### 14 March 1945

- It has been planned that 3rd Bn will take the entire Regtl sector, relieving 1st Bn of their sector this afternoon. This is being accomplished so that 2nd Bn will be available for Bn problems in the weeks training.
- 1735 3rd Bn has completed relatef of 1st Bn.

# 15 March 1945

Training is being continued today.

The 3rd platoon of Co A, 736th Tank Bn, which has been conducting training with 3rd Bn, was detached today and returned to the Tank Bn. The platoon of Light Tanks which has been training with the 2nd Bn, has been given to the 1st Bn. The ducks which have been attached to the regt left today. 3rd platoon Co A, 643rd TD Bn, has been attached to the regt and has been given to the 1st Bn.

# 16 March 1945

- O930 Training is being continued today. Upon order from Corps, smoke is being laid across the RHINE to check enemy reaction.
- A foot bridge constructed by the Engrs is being used today by 2nd Bn for practic crossings. 1st Bn is going to practice the use of assault boats after dark.
- There was little enemy reaction to the smoke laid down across the river today.

  The only result of the experiment was a very few rounds of arty fire.

### 17 March 1945

1130 Traing with assault boats and foot bridges is being continued today.

1800 1st plat, Co B, 736 Tk Bn, was attached to the regt today and given to 3rd Bn.





#### 18 March 1945

Sunday - no training is being conducted today. Church services are being 1000 conducted today and entertainment is being carried on for the troops. 1715

3rd Plat, Co A, was replaced by 1st Plat Co A, 643rd TD Bn.

#### 19 March 1945

An all-day problem is being held today in a large area west of NEUSS with 11.00 1st Bn in attack and 2nd Bn and A-T Co in the defense. K & L Co's are still holding defensive positions in the regtl sector while I Co is carrying on miscellaneous training.

#### 20 March 1945

It has been directed that the regt begin preparations for a move back to 0930 Holland. The regiment will be relieved in its present sector in NEUSS by 379th Inf Regt of the 95th Inf Div. An inspection of billets, clothing and equipment is to be held today.

1st Bn, 379th Inf has relieved 3rd Bn of our regt. One man per outpost 1810 will remain with the relieving troops until tomorrow morning. The regts Tank and TD attachments have been released.

#### 21 March 1945

Leading elements of the regt crossed the IP at LOVELING at 0805. 0830 The move is being made with Co A, 308th Med Bn and 322nd FA Bn attached.

CP closed out for new location at NIEUWSTADT, HOLLAND, VK 6872. 0925

All elements of the regt have closed in to new location, NIEUWSTADT, VK6782. 1235 The move was one of 50 miles straight west from NEUSS, Germany.

It is believed that our stay in this rear area will be a short one. 1500 purpose of this move is to train the troops on river crossings on the Maas River. Subjects for training have been designated by Div and are being passed on to the Bns.

# 22 March 1945

Training is being started today on Bn in attack of a town, Bn in river 0900 crossing, and training in river crossing by small units. Foot bridges and assault boats are to be used in river crossing training. Tanks and TD's will be used in the Bn problems with the Infantry.

# 23 March 1945

Training was continued today on the same subjects as yesterday. 1900

# 24 March 1945

1635 Col Crabill has called the Bn Comdrs together for a meeting to outline operations in the near future. It is likely that the regt will move forward within the next few days.

# 25 March 1945

Capt Bunch and quartering parties left this morning for a new assembly area 1100 south of Krefeld, Germany. No definite time has been set for the regt to

move. Capt Bunch and the quartering party are going to remain at the new area tonight. 1715





#### 26 March 1945

	No further information has been received about the tentative move.
1635	The quartering party has been called back and will return here tonight.

#### 27 March 1945

- Capt Bunch left this morning to make a personal rcn for a possible assembly area east of the RHINE river. It is believed that the Regt will move directly across the RHINE without stopping at another assembly area on the west side of the river.
- 1715. The move to the east side of the RHINE has been cancelled. The regt is awaiting further orders.

#### 28 March 1945

- Regt will move late this afternoon to a new area in Germany about 40 miles from the present location in NTEUWSTADT. Captain Bunch and quartering party left this morning for new location.
- 1715 CP closed out for new location at HORST, Germany, WF 151864
- 2005 2nd Bn closed in to their new location.
- 2030 lst " " " " " "
- 2130 Regt CP closed in to new location at HORST, Germany, WF 151864
- It is believed that our stay in this area will be only for one night and that the regt will move further forward early tomorrow.

#### 29 March 1945

- O840 Capt Bunch and quartering party left to make rcn of new area. It is not yet known what time the regt will move today.
- First elements will start move to new location across the RHINE River at 1749. Col Crabill has called the BN Comdrs together for a meeting at 1330 to orient them on the move and the coming situation.
- 1725 Regtl CP closed out for new location
- 2130 Regtl CP closed into new location WA 269359, 4 miles west of BRUCKHAUSEN, Germany, amove of 41 miles to the northeast.
- The entire regt with 322nd FA Bn and Co A, 308th Med Bn has closed into the new area. It is believed the regt will move forward again tomorrow.

# 30 March 1945

- 0930 Col Crabill has called a meeting of all Bn Comdrs for 1000. No order for the regt to move has yet been received from the Div.
- It has been directed that the Regt be prepared to leave on 2 hours notice at anytime after 1300. The regt is to be prepared to move at 1630. The new area has not yet been designated. The advance party will leave at 1430.
- 1745 Regtl CP closed out for new location.
- Regtl CP closed in to new area at WA 565485 in the vicinity of EPPENDORF, Germany, a move of approximately 30 miles to the NE.
- 2115 Entire regiment has closed into new location.

# 31 March 1945

- Orders have been received to have regt prepare to move again this afternoon Quartering party will leave at 1300 and main body of regt will move later this afternoon.
- A change in orders has been received and quartering party will not depart until further notice is given by Div.
