

Report After Action Against the Enemy.

The Adjutant General, Washington, D. C. (thru channels)

In accordance with paragraph 10 (c-3), AR 345-105, and Adm Memo month of March 1945 is submitted:

#### 1 March 1945.

At 282300, Regt1 CO and S-3 reported to Div CP to receive orders for movement of the Regt1 CT. The Regt1 CO returned to the Regt1 CP and issued orders at 0200 for the movement of the Regt to vic of BEDBURDYCK, GERMANY (177808). The Comd Cp departed at 0530.

The 1st serial, consisting of the 2nd Bn, 323rd FA Bn, Cn Co, Co B 643rd TD Bn, AT Co, Co A 736th Tk Bn, and Plat Y of the 453rd AA Bn crossed IP at TITZ at 0630 for BEDBURDYCK. The 1st Bn and Hq Co were to follow later in serial #3 and the 3rd Bn and Co B 308th Med Bn were to make up serial #6.

The movement of the 3rd and 6th serials was delayed considerably due to the great number of units moving forward, congested traffic, and were far behind schedule in arriving at new area

The Comd Gp established Fwd CP at BUSCH (202837) at 0850. They were the first American troops to reach that town. Eight PsW were taken by the Comd Gp and one enemy fighter plane was shot down by the I&R Plat.

The attached units, except Co B 308th Med Bn, had all closed into assembly area vic BUSCH by 1600. The 2nd Bn detrucked at BEDBURDYCK and proceeded on foot to LUTTERGHLEN (212860) closing in at 1130. The trucks that

moved the 2nd Bn returned to pick up the 3rd Bn.

E Co jumped off and at 1945 had advanced 1500 yards to (240877) and by 2130, E Co was at (250889) and had encountered no resistance. The guns that had been holding up F Co's advance had been outflanked and F Co was advancing to the right rear of E Co.

By 2300, E Co was moving up to the NORD CANAL astride the road at (253-890) and F Co was advancing steadily on the right. G Co was following up E Co, completing mopping-up operations. The Bn advanced rapidly against light resistance consisting of light arty and S/A fire.

This platoon reported the far side clear of enemy and E Co began crossing. F Co was at the canal to the left of E Co, and G Co, who had been following, was swinging to the right of E Co to clear the city area on the Bn's right flank. By 0245, both E and F Cos were across the canal, G Co had run into an enemy strong point at (259888) and were bringing up tanks to blast it out. The 2nd Bn at this point was well into the built-up part of NEUSS and was having trouble controlling civilians and guarding FsW. Large buildings made it difficult to advance rapidly and still comb the area. By 0600, the 2nd Bn had advanced to a line along the docks from (27059010) to (272897) and was continuing the mopping-up process. up process.

A Co crossed the RR and was advancing NE and at 0105, was at (246906). Coon the right of A Co was within 400 yards of the canal. Both Cos sent patrols to the canal to find crossings, and began closing up to the canal. B Co, mounted on tanks, moved up to rear of A Co. Engineers who had previously been alerted for bridging operations had begun to bring forward bridging equipment. A Co ran into an enemy tank which was destroyed by bacooks teams. All bridges in the lat Bn except one had been destroyed. However, A Co found damaged locks and by 0630, the Co had crossed and B Co was following.

B Co was in the built-up area clearing buildings and factories. 1st Bn continued slow process of moving forward to the N clearing out buildings throughout the day. By 2100, 1st Bn had cleared all the area across the canal from (240915)-(253897)-(257924), except one bunker at (245913). A Co was using dynamite to clear this bunker. Opposition was mainly by sniper and scattered arty fire.

At 0200, the 3rd Bn was ordered to move up behind the 2nd Bn, prepara-At 0200, the 3rd Bn was ordered to move up behind the 2nd Bn, preparatory to passing through them and continue mission of clearing the town. By 0300, the 3rd Bn had cleared the enemy 88mm gun battery at (244877) that had been by-passed by F Co. Some Psw were taken and the guns put out of action. At 0930, the attack was broken up by dive bombers and the 329th Inf, all troops except the AT Co, were withdrawn at 1400. The AT Co maintained road blocks until 041000.

Areas of responsibility were assigned as follows:

1st Bn = (282920) - (278933) - (283938) - (293939).

2nd Bn = (289931) - (292958) - (311949) - (3093).

3rd Bn = the peninsula from east of a line (311949) - (3093).

1st Bn 331st Inf = (281939) - (267960) - (27977) - (311950).

The 1st and 2nd Bms began occupying positions, the 1st Bn 331st Infremained in the area of the 3rd Bn.

Patrols and road blocks were established to prevent civilian movement and the search of the area was continued.

The Regtl CP displaced to NEUSS (261895), opening at 0915 and later moved to (283927), opening at 1500.

The attack of 1 March through 3 March was pushed rapidly to exploit the confusion of the enemy created by the rapid advance of our forces in this sector. The steady pressure exerted both day and night prevented him from reorganizing. Elements of many enemy units were taken prisoner.

The resistance throughout the period generally would be classified as

light, although some strong points resisted stubbornly. These strong points



were by-passed by the assault troops and mopped-up by elements that follow-

F Co captured 56 PaW as they came marching down a street at close interval, right shoulder arms. Later the same night, two men captured a half-track towing an 88mm gun, the crew of 15 were riding in the half track. G Co took about 50 police officers of NEUSS as they were mounting trucks to cross the river. In each of the above instances, the enemy was not aware of the fact that our troops were in the area.

Civilians offered very little resistance although cases of sniping by civilians was reported. Civilians milling around hampered operations during

darkness.

An enemy concentration of about 150 rds of arty fell on the 3rd Bn area on 051845. The CP received a direct hit, casualties were light. Light harassing fire fell in Regtl area throughout the night.

A patrol of 3 men of Co B crossed the RHINE at (305952) on 070045 and returned on 072100 with information of enemy installations and troop move-

ment on the E side of the river.

Training was conducted on a limited scale with assault boats, squad problems and conditioning marches.

Go B 308th Engr Bn was relieved of attachment on 6 March 1945.

#### 9 March through 19 March 1945.

Considerable harrassing fire, arty, mortar and some MG fire fell in the Regtl area throughout the period. Casualties were light. Training continued, emphasizing assault box training, Tk, TD and Inf training. Bn and Regtl tests were conducted on attack of village, supported by TDs and tks.

#### 20 March 1945.

The 2nd Bn of the 379th Inf Regt, 95th Inf Div, began relief of the Regt at 1630. Relief was completed at 1915. The Regt remained in same area preparatory to moving on following day to MEUSE RIVER, vic of ECHT, HOLLAND (6960).

#### 21 March 1945.

The Regt crossed IP (276928) at 0950, following the 331st CT. The move out of the assembly area was made under enemy arty fire. The 1st and



2nd Bns suffered some casualties as a result. Six trucks were temporarily

disabled.

The 323rd FA Bn and Co B 308th Med Bn were attached for the move.

The Regtl CP opened at (761485), vic DIERGAARDE, HOLLAND, at 1220.

Co B 643rd TD Bn (SP) and Co A 736th Tk Bn joined column at ST TONIS, GERMANY (S1303) and became attached to the Regti

for AA protection. The Regtl CP opened at (273377) at 1730. All elements of CT had closed into assembly by 2230.

#### 30 March 1945.
