

1 August - 31 August 45 331st Inf Regt.

A detailed training schedule was in effect on August the 1st with the principal object, the completion of Division Proficiency Tests. Tests for the A and P Plts, I and R Plts, Commo Sec, Hvy and Lt Mortars, and Rifle Plts were completed by 13 August. During the 1st week of August a counter-sabatage team visited and conducted demonstrations for all units in the Regiment. This demonstration dealt particularly with Japanese material and methods. (Ltr 30 July 45) September 3rd established as the starting date for unit schools. However, information was received to the effect that all enlisted personnel with an ASR score 65 or greater would leave the regiment prior to 15 September. This caused a further indefinite postponement of the unit schools.

Officer and NCO schools were inaugurated with principle instructions centering about Leadership and Troop Leading. Military Law and procedure was also made a principle subject of classes. (Ing

Memo 28 July 45)

A vigorous campaign was put under way to make every soldier conscious of the great need for personal hygiene. Two factors were considered: First an increase in venereal disease, second the anticipated need for knowledge by the men to protect themselves from natural diseases common to more tropical areas, here-to-fore not a threat to the health and therefore effeciency of the command. (Ing memo 24 July 45) (Ing memo 4 August 45) The latter part of August brought about additional measures for control of VD in this area. Measures were instituted to apprehend all VD carriers and confine same in hospitals where treatment could be conducted. Services of Burgomeisters was sought in this effort. Many such VD carriers were confined. (Memo 31 Aug.) (Memo 25 Aug 45)

Throughout the month of August, much orientation and information media was received and made the subject of discussion at platoon level with the anticipated return of many service personnel to Civil life. The redeployment, the occupation of GERMANY and the war in the PACIFIC gave rise to many pertinent questions viewed

with great interest by all personnel. (Ltr 31 July 45)

Regiment was scheduled to move to the GRAFENWOHR Training Area on 20 August to remain for a period of intensified field problems Of Battalion and Regimental level. This movement was cancelled with the advent of the Automic Bomb and the immediate subsequent peace offer by the last active adversary. (Adm. Order, 12 Aug 45) (Memo 15 Aug. 45) (Memo 18 Aug. 45) This pleasant surprise somewhat altered the training program, although Division proficiency test had been completed for platoon level units and lower. The technical training in combat operations was in part replaced by such subjects as: Conduct of Raids, Operation of Road Blocks, and Traffic Control Points; Increased time for close order drill, Information and Education and Athletics, brought obe by the assumption of MG responsibilities from 405th Inf Regiment.

On 21 August the 331st Inf. again assumed MG responsibility for Landkreis GRIESBACH and PFARRKIRCHEN plus Landkreis EGGENFELDEN which county was made the responsibility of Cannon and Anti-Tank Companies. Anti-Tank Company moved to the town of EGGENFELDEN and established their headquarters. Cannon Company did not move into the newly acquired county. The Regiment relieved the 405th Inf of all security missions and targets. Many were not considered worthy of guards and by 24 August had reduced security

missions within the three (3) counties to ten (10) in all.

The speed with which personnel were being deployed to the Zone of Interior, necessitated starting specialist schools to replace key personnel, thereby sustain losses without undue suffering to the efficiency of the regiment. (Memo 20 Aug. 45)

Today, 15 August 1945, marks the 3rd Anniversary of the Activation of the division. It also, though not the official day, marks the end of World War II.



Disciplinary Drill

All disciplinary drill will be precise and thorough. All instructors will demand performance from individuals and units so that a high standard of proficiency is habitual. Particular attention will be given to correcting slouching during drill.

Saluting

Stress will be made on saluting. There is a definite laxness on the part of all personnel both in saluting and in rendering a correct salute.

The following method will be incorporated in instruction on saluting:

Raise the arm in front of the body with forearm and wrist straight, fingers together and thumb along the forefinger.

Raise arm until upper arm is parallel to the ground.

Place tip of forefinger on lower part of head—
dress or on forehead above and slightly to the
right of the right eye, palm to the left, fore—
arm at an angle of 45° so that individual will
just be able to see the last three fingers.

Each man will be checked individually for correctness of execution.

Men will be checked at frequent intervals during each day to check on execution of the salute.

Headquarters, 331st Inf. SECRET 29 August 1945. SUBJECT: Security Control Checks and Search Operations in 331st Infantry Zone of Occupation. : All Battalions and Special Units, 331st Infantry. 1. Purpose: To exploit the results of Operation "Tally-Ho" and to in-1 51 (1) sure a continued coordinated security control of the 331st Infantry zone, battalions and separate company commanders will be prepared to institute a series of security checks of communities at irregular intervals on orders from this headquarters. The objections of these security checks are the same as Operation "Tally-He", plus such additional items as from time to time are warranted because of local conditions. Basically the prime objectivesare: a. Stopping of black market activities. b. Confiscation of illegal weapons. c. Checking of individual identity and travel papers,

particularly of male civilians.

d. Seizing illegally possessed or operated motor vehicles.

e. Location and apprehension of subversive groups or individuals.

2. Procedure:

a. A minimum of one raid per week per battalion and one of the separate companies (to be designated by this headquarters) will be inaugarated, commencing the week of 9-15 September. Towns to be searched, H-hour, and day will be given by this headquarters for each operation. Great care will be taken to insure secrecy of the planned operation. "TOP SECRET" procedure will be employed.

b. During the week of 9-15 September, the following towns will be searched on orders from this headquarters by the units

(indicated:

1st Battalion - SIMBACH (2922770) 2nd Battalion - POCKING (V122934) 3rd Battalion - PFARRKIRCHEN (2845948) Anti-Tank Co. - EGGENFELDEN (2717908)

c. For checking of identity and travel papers see paragraph 2, Instructions for Area Commanders and Roadblock Guards. Headquarters 83rd Infantry Division, dated 27 August 1945.

d. All persons apprehended during an operation will be detained at a place to be designated by each unit commander for CIC

screening.

e. Weapons, vehicles, signal equipment, and other prohibited articles found on civilian premises during the search will be evacuated through normal channels. Explosivesm demolitions, food, gasoline etc., will be left where discovered, a guard posted, and this headquarters notified.

f. All searchers will be conducted under the supervision of a commisioned officer or responsible non-commisioned officer, and absolutely no looting or confiscation of personal property other than firearms, long knives or daggers, damaging of property, or molesting of women will be allowed.

SUBJECT: Road Block and Curfew Checks.

TO : Battalion and Special Unit Commanders.

- 1. TRAFFIC ROAD BLOCKS will be established by all Bn and Spec Unit Commanders within their respective areas from 0800 to 2000, 31 Aug 1945 to check all civilians vehicles, i.e., automobiles, trucks, motorcycles, and bicycles. The following check will be made by roadblocks:
- a. Every motor-powered vehicle must have a Military Government, Third U.S. Army sticker attached to the inside of the windshield, properly filled out and signed by a Military Government Officer.
- b. Every bicycle must have a gray bicycle registration card (3" x 4").
- C. Every civilian must have on his person either a "Temporary Registration" Military Government Pass or "Military Government of Germany" Registration paper (about 5" x 9") also entitled "Military Government Exempions" paper.
- 2. VIOLATORS: Any civilian whose vehicle does not have a proper Military Government Registration Sticker and any civilian who does not have a proper Registration Paper on his person (similar to the U S Army Identification Card) will be turned over to the Military Government for investigation and disposition.
- CURFEW CHECK: Unit Commanders will make a thorough curfew check in their respective areas Friday night, 31 Aug 1945. Violators will be picked up and turned over to the Military Government for necessary action.
- H. MILITARY GO VERNMENTS PAPERS, CARRIED by civilians, that Road Blocks Guards will acrutinize are attached for the information and guidance of all Military Personnel. All men will be shown these forms and an officer will explain to them their meaning to that they can perform the Road Block duties efficiently.
