During the 1st week of July, a vigorous training campaign was conducted in so far as MG duties permitted. In addition to disciplinary drills and training, personnel continued familiarization firing with the various personal T/O weapons as well as crew served weapons. Work continued on the construction and survey of combat ranges for future small unit combat problems. (Ltr 14 July 45)

In order to properly care for DPs and PWs in the Regt'l area, a registration plan was placed into effect at this time requiring registration of all persons within the area as well as registration of bicycles and cars. Not until the second week of July was relief from MG duties effected. On 8 July the 405th Inf of the 102nd Div moved into the regimental area and by 13 July had assumed all MG duties. This restored the regiment to a full training status, enabling it to

(w) embark on a 44 hour training week starting 17 July.

The additional time alloted to training, now having priority, enabled the regiment to develop the finer details of training.

Many new men had joined the regiment; some of these fillers had little or no battle experience. All had less than 85 points. Preparation for training tests were made. Teams were organized at this time for purpose of conducting tests in combat problems of units within the Division. Tests were to be conducted for Rifle-Squads, Rifle Platoons, Mortars-both light and heavy, and Machine Guns-both light and heavy. The solst Inf Regiment furnished personnel to conduct test of south Inf Regt. The solt Inf Regt. furnished personnel to test the units of this Regt; the solst Inf. (Ltr. 16 July 45)

Japanese tactics became a common subject of discusson among soldiers, as well as frequent reference in the training schedule. Material on Japanese warfare was definitely limited, however, much valuable instruction was obtained from the monthly periodical "Combat Experience in the Pacific". Tactics of small units began to mold themselves about the Japanese principles of stabbing from behind. Particular stress was placed on anti-infiltration measures and frequent and strong patrolling, both nite and day. (Ing memo

24 July 45, Tng memo 20 July 45).

During period 20-31 July, all organizations conducted squad problem tests. Platoon problems were also given many "dry run" tests in preparation for the future division tests. Crews of crew served weapons received training on selected ranges. (Memo 17

July 45).

On 24 July General PATTON, then Commanding General 3rd Army, reviewed a composite Regiment made up of one Bn per Inf Regt. The 2nd Bn represented this regiment. Review was conducted at POCKING Air Strip. A platoon combat problem demonstration was conducted by the 3rd Bn of the 331st Inf on the Generals' visiting date. Problem was rated excellent.

Changing the primary mission of the Division, resulted in the curtailment of the I & E Program. All personnel had been surveyed at this time with school staff and faculty, school buildings and quarters selected. School had been scheduled to start 1st of August. The direct complication was brought about by the losses to date and anticipated losses in personnel by virtue of the Boint-Score Deployment System. The regiment was below strength as of 1 July 45. On 10-15 July fillers arrived (with ASR less than 85) from 76th and 99th Inf Div. A total of 199 men were

(of personnel) assigned to the regiment. This was the 1st mass movement effected by the point score system in this regiment. (S.O. #40 Hq 331st Inf Regt 10 July 45, S.U. #47 Hq oblist Int Regt 10 July 45).

The I & E Program, although temporarily postponed, required prepareaness. Steps were undertaken to survey all fillers and maintain records and files on all personnel. Quotas were sent to I & E specialist schools throughout the month of July to train the necessary personnel for the successful administration of Unit schoolsand also development of Discussion Leaders and Educational Advisors.

Training did not take all the training time. During the month of July the solst Regiment was singularly outstanding and instrumental in securing the Swimming Championship of the XII Corps for the Division. The regiment likewise placed first in the tennis matches within the division and went on ahead to secure the Corp tennis first on 13 July 45.

General PATTON, Commanding General Third U. S. Army, will arrive at the Pocking Air Strip at 1000, 24 July 1945, and will pass thru parts of the Division area enroute to Passau for Luncheon and briefing. 2. At the Air Strip at Pocking, General PATTON will be met by General Macon and a Guard of Honor, and the 83rd Ron Troop. He will then review a composite Regiment made up of a battalion from each Regiment. The Second Battalion will represent the 331st Infantry Regiment. 3. Then General PATTON will proceed thru whatever parts of the 331st Inf. area that he desires to observe the state of training, military courtesy, dress, saluting, driving and parking discipline, etc. of the troops. Individual Protective Measures

Individual protective measures are any steps that an individual may take to protect himself from enemy observation and fire.

Cover is protection from hostile fire. Concealment is protection from hostile air or ground observation. Natural concealment and cover is that found on the ground without change. Many natural objects such as trees, rocks, bursh, ditches, embankments, logs, and folds in the ground give protection and are readily apparent. The trained soldier must learn to appreciate the protection offorded by the slightest depressions and humps in ground that appear flat to the untrained eye.

The pinciples of individual concealment are:

1. Remain motionless when not required to move.

2. Use all available concealment.
3. Exposenothing which listens.

4. Blend with background. Clothing that does not blend

with the background will disclose your presence.

5. Stay in the shade. When moving from one place to another try to remain in the shade and make every effort to always stop in the shade, whether firing or merely stopping before continuing to another postion.

6. Break the regular outline of objects.

7. Avoid outstanding landmarks such as lone trees, rocks, and fence corners. These should be avoided as they are easily picked up by enemy observers.


8. Spotches across the face and hands with camouflage

Grease paint, burned wood or cork, or mud, if black.

9. Use of camouflage clothing either issued or improvised.

10. Placing of leaves, twigs, or grass in helmet net.

The individual soldier must learn to take advantage of any cover that wil protect him from enemy fire both in moving and when stopped. If halted for a few hours only, he should dig a slit trench to provide additional shelter from artillery and mortar fire. If in woods or near trees, he should get as much overhead cover as is practicable in the time available, to protect him from tree bursts, leaving part of the trench uncovered to provide a firing position and means of entry.



If remianing in the position for some length of time, or is digging in defensive position, then he should dig a foxhole, probably with another man, with complete overhead cover of adequate thickness to stop shell fragments. This emplacement should have firing ports in several directions and should be large enough to permit freedom of movement.

As the position is improved, shallow communication trenches should be dug from one fox hole to another, later deepened to provide easy and rapid movement from one position to another.

Above all the fortified positions must blendcompletely with surrounding ground and foliage and all evidence of digging removed.

Demonstrations should be given illustrating the points mentioned above and covered positions prepared for men to inspect prior to practical work in concealment and construction of covered positions.

SECURITY Because of infiltration tactics used by the Japenese in the Pacific theater, the security of CPs and any separate installations such as a service area or artillery position is of the utmost importance. Regimental and Battalion Hq Co, Service Co. and Cannon Co., will start training in security covering the following points: 1. Maintain, at all times, necessary local interior guards. 2. All around security outposts covering likely approaches. 3. Assigned sectors for each subordinate unit to occupy and defend. 4. Hq Commandant selects positions and have dug in for A-T weapons. 5. Constitute a reserve which will be held out until plan of enemy has definitely been developed. When enemy plan has been developed employ reserve vigorously to best halt enemy. 7. Have selected rallying points for each subordinate unit in the event it is necessary to assemble it quickly for employment in another sector. 8. Have warning signal for: a. Infantry attacks only. b. Infantry and tank attacks. Training for this security will be condu cted in present area and when the Regt. is in Grafenwohr Training Area the installations listed above will be prepared at all times, when on field problems, for surprise attacks.
