REPORT OF OPERATIONS

OCTOBER

During the former part of October, the Regiment's move to Austria to relieve the 26th Infantry Division of its occupation duties was postponed fifteen (15) days. Training continued with emphasis on military discipline, guard duties, operation of road blocks. (Incl. #23) The anticipated loss of key personnel as a result of the lowering of the critical score to 60 points necessitated the inauguration of specialist schools. On 2 October 1945 specialist schools were started for switchboard operators, radio operators, vehicle drivers and supply sergeants and clerks. School for first sergeants was set back until Personnel Officer returned from leave in Switzerland. (Incls. # 1, 15, 18).

No additional I & E schools were planned during the month. The Regiment as a whole was at half strength making it difficult to procure students without causing undue hardship on the remaining men. The three (3) schools which had been in operation were suspended 15 October. Personnel was needed to man roadblocks and administer PW and DP camps. Plans were drawn up to resume schools with a greater capacity, in north Austria.

During October, eleven (11) men were dispatched to Biarritz Army University in France and ten (10) men were sent to the I & E School at Oberammergau, Germany to attend general I & E course. (Incls. 2, 8, 10, 17)

The training week was reduced to thirty-three (33) hours:- Athletics to take majority of the time on the schedule. (Incl # 16)

Preparations were made for movement to Austria. Colonel YORK with Battalion Commanders moved to new area in Austria on 15 October. Plans were to maintain close liason with units to be relieved without causing undue break in the administration of the may DP and PW camps, and the operation of roadblocks on the Russian Frontier. (Incls #s 7, 7a, 7b, 11).

By 1000 hours, 27 October, units of the 4th Armored Division had relieved the 331st Inf of all responsibilities in Kreises VILSHOFEN, GRIESBACH AND PFARRKIRCHEN. (Incls. #s 6 & 11) Movement to North Austria was accomplished by battalions moving individually, with attached units in the order 1st, 2nd, and 3rd. (Incls #s 7 & 13) 1st Battalion moved out 28 October. By 1830 hours, 30 October, all units of the 331st Inf had cleared into new area and relieved the 101st Infantry Regiment of occupation duties. The above movement removed the 83rd Infantry Division from under 3rd Army Control and placed it under control of USFA. Many officers and men from the 101st Infantry joined the 331st Inf. Regt.

Period 1-7 October, "Swoops" were conducted on Stubenberg, Schon burg, Augenkirchen, Fleinting, Ernig, Rhustorf, Len-sham, Altenmarkt, Rostbach, Rothalmunster, Baumgarten and Schonerding. Items confiscated were generally items of G.I. clothing, some knives, non-military rifles and pistols were found along with personnel having no registration papers on their person in violation of security orders.

During the first three weeks of October, three raids on civilian populace were committed by a force of unknown persons. In each case, theft was the motive. In the last incident, occurring on 17 October 1945, a man (German) was shot to death and his wife wounded. All cases were referred to CIC for further investigation. As of 28 October, two significant arrests were made. Violators were believed to be Poles from nearby DP camps. Guards were placed on Russian-Polish Camp at Schalpfing. Camp at Pfarrkirchen was evacuated. To combat the raid menace, each battalion was directed to organize an alert platoon, mobile with radio, whose duty it was to intercept any such subsequent raids. All landrats were directed to make public, location of military installations to which such violences could be reported. Cannon and Anti-Tank Companies were also directed to keep a minimum of fifteen (15) Ems and one officer alert and mobile subject to calls during the night. (Incls #s 5 & 9)

Hungarian movements throughout area of responsibility continued without proper authority. Each case was investigated and Hungarians returned to proper area. Misinterpretation of orders from Hungarian General in charge of Hungarian DPs created much unrest. It was also learned in one instance German Authorities had ordered movement of Hungarians.

On 4 October, train left Pocking with 1500 Hungarian DPs. Pocking continued to serve as a clearing house for Hungarian DPs. On 5 October, 800 Hungarian DPs from Dreises VILSHOFEN AND GRAISBACH were moved into Pocking Camp. (Incl # 4)

By 16 October, the Telephone line to Cannon Company had been cut six (6) times. Solution was found in directing the Landrat to establish guards at key points covering section where sabotage of wire was concentrated. No further cutting of wire was noted.

On 27 October, another train cleared Pocking with approximately 900 DPs. (Incl. #4)

On 24 October 1945, Operation "Chesterfield" resulted in the arrest of 103 persons of the Ortsgruppe level. They were turned over to the PW Camp at Plattling for further processing.

to the PW Camp at Plattling for further classification. 53
other persons in the Ortsgruppe level were listed in the area and
still on wanted list. Civil population was generally cooperative
in this operation.

One small blackmarket currency exchange was raided. One Hun-
garian DP from the Pocking Camp was taken into custody. Situation
as to further development and investigation was placed in the hands
of CIC.

On 28 October, day forward of 331st Inf CP arrived in Steyr,
a vehicle (described as a truck) was stolen from one of the
Lagers. The 26th Inf Div. had not yet been relieved of its' duties
in North Austria. (Incl. # 21)

On 1 October, there were registered 35,965 DPs in the Regimental
Area. During the month 2,441 were repatriated.

Regiment was at one-half strength during the first two weeks
of October although approximately 1000 men joined the Regiment
during this time with ASR of 59 or less. During the third week of
October, approximately 1000 men with ASR of 60 or higher were trans-
ferred out of the Regiment. (Incl. # 18)

Above transfers out of the Regiment were made to the 602nd TD Bn.
90th Infantry Division, 80th Infantry Division, and 26th Infantry
Division, the latter unit then alerted to move to the staging area.
Incoming troops were from such units as 7th, 99th, 89th and 26th Infa
ntry Divisions. Above transfers aggravated a situation already
created by the pronounced shortage of cooks and clerks. Some
specialists were received from the 26th Infantry Division whose per
sonnel were absorbed at the time Regt. moved into North Austria.
(Incl. # 19)

Officer personnel was exchanged with the 101st Infantry Regiment.
The 331st Infantry lost 46 officers and gained 120, making the
Regiment considerably overstrength in officer personnel.

On 13 October 1945, a survey of officer's efficiency and
education reports was conducted by a representative from the
War Department. A criterion of all officers was held at the
3rd Battalion CP. All unit commanders were required to
submit three types of efficiency reports on each officer in the
Regiment.

Some increase in passes to recreational areas was observed dur
ing the month. This no doubt was due to Victory Bond Drive
campaign awarding passes to personnel making Bond purchases. (Incl #3)

1. There have been numerous reports of careless and indiscriminate shooting by hunting parties of American soldiers within the regimental area. Several civilians have been wounded as a result of such shooting.

2. An extract from USFA letter dated 23 August 45, is inclosed for your information and compliance.

3. Troops of this command will not use M-1 rifles or full automatic weapons for hunting.

4. Troops will not drive vehicles through cultivated fields planted with winter wheat.

SUBJECT: Hunting and Fishing Regulations for U.S. Occupation
Troops and Civilians in American Zone in Austria.

2. U.S. Occupational Troops in Austria.

a. Effective this date hunting and fishing by occupational troops in the American Zone will be done only in strict conformity to the following regulations:

(1) Hunting.

(a) Hunting will not be permitted during the closed seasons as listed in the Appendix attached hereto.

(b) Any person desiring to hunt will secure a permit issued by his Unit Special Service Officer.

(c) Foresters of Jagers will accompany all hunting parties. These men are highly trained and are thoroughly familiar with the game in their particular area. Through their assistance better hunting results may be obtained as well as a more intelligent selection of animals to be killed. This will aid in conservation of future game supplies. These men may be contacted through the local Bürgermeister.

(d) Every effort will be made to kill wounded animals.

(e) No carcass will be left in the woods but shall be used either in an army mess or turned over to civil authorities to supplement food supplies which at present are short.

(f) No more than two rounds will be loaded in magazines or clips of semi-automatic weapons.

(g) All normal safety precautions will be observed concerning human life, domestic animals and fire hazards.

(h) Hunting will be restricted to daylight hours.

(2) Fishing.

(a) Fishing will not be permitted during the closed seasons as listed in the Appendix attached hereto.

(b) Fishing permits will be secured from Unit Special Service Officers.

(c) Artificial or natural bait may be used.

(d) The use of firearms, explosives, chemicals or nets of any type is forbidden.

(e) The equipment of professional and commercial fishermen will not be used without permission. All fish caught will be used to supplement the food supply for an army mess or civilian food supplies.

b. Unit Special Service Officers will issue hunting and fishing permits to occupational troops and furnish information as to where equipment may be obtained.

c. Unit Special Service Officers will assure themselves that hunting permits are issued only to persons who are acquainted with the hunting laws and have passed a basic course in the handling of firearms.

TO : All Battalions and Separate Units:

I. REPORTS OF ACCIDENTS.

The following excerpt from DB # 74, Headquarters, 83rd Infantry Division dated 16 August 1945 is ~~again~~ repeated for your information and strict compliance.

" 1. Effective at once, reports of accidents resulting in death or serious injury to military personnel of this command will be made in the manner prescribed below. All gunshot wounds will be reported.

a. Immediately upon obtaining knowledge of such accident, unit commanders will make a telephonic report to the office of Division Surgeon (Blackstone 16) and to the Adjutant General's Office (Blackstone 7). This report will contain the complete information available at time of making the report regarding the accident, ie cause of death or injury, type of injury if injury is sustained, diagnosis of medical officer of such is available, disposition of personnel.

b. As soon as possible thereafter, but not later than twelve hours from time of accident, a report in writing will be forwarded to the Adjutant General's Office for the information of the Commanding General. This report will contain full and complete information regarding the accident, diagnosis, the disposition of the injured or deceased personnel and a statement as to the approximate date the line of duty investigation will be forwarded to this headquarters.

2. The above procedure for reporting of accidents will be brought to the attention of all personnel. Duty officers and non-commissioned officers functioning as Charge of Quarters will be particularly informed as to these instructions. (AG) "

Immediately upon receipt of information pertaining to an accident, alcoholic poisoning, death, gunshot wound or self inflicted wound, an investigating officer will be appointed by the Battalion or separate company involved to fully investigate the case. The Investigating Officer will immediately insure that the above telephonic and written reports were strictly complied with. On all accidents, Officers Report of Investigation will be rendered in quintuplicate (5 copies); in case of death report will be rendered in sextuplicate (6 copies). Investigating Officers will fully acquaint themselves with the provisions of AR 345-415.

All reports written and oral will be rendered thru Regimental S-1.

The Regimental Commander is not at all pleased with the lax attitude in the past as to reporting such accidents.

II. Foreign Weapons:

Company Commanders are again reminded that all troops will turn in souvenir weapons to the supply room for safe keeping. No man will have in his possession ammunition or weapons of a foreign manufacture.

SUBJ CT: Vacating Covered Accomodations.

TO : Organizations Commanders, 331st Infantry, APO #83,
U.S. Army

1. Paragraph IX, Daily Bulletin, No. 129, Headquarters, 83rd Infantry Division, APO #83, U.S. Army, dated 17 October 1945, Subject: "Vacating Covered Accomodation" covers procedure of inventory, etc. prior to vacating accomodations occupied by U.S. Forces. This paragraph directs attention to Memorandum No. 15, Headquarters, Third U. S. Army, dated 12 July 1945. Paragraph 5 of this memorandum requires that upon vacating covered accomodations, a complete inspection will be made to determine any loss or damage to personal or real property. Sub-paragraph 5c of this memorandum requires that accomodations being vacated by units will be kept under guard until turned over to the owners or reoccupied by military units. In the 331st Infantry area all accomodations presently occupied by U.S. Forces will also be posted with OFF LIMITS signs before vacating and the Military Government Detachment in the area furnished lists of accomodations being vacated in order that they may be held available to relieving troops or for housing of Displaced Persons if necessary. These steps will be taken immediately.

2. Paragraph 5a of above Memorandum refers to Paragraph 5 of Procurement Directive No. 32, Headquarters, Third U. S. Army, dated 19 February 1945. Sub-paragraph 5b, Procurement Directive No. 32, prohibits the removal of any equipment, movable fixtures, or personal property from occupied premises without proper procurement action through appropriate authorities. Sub-paragraph 5c requires that before vacating real property, occupying unit commanders will cause check to be made of inventory which was accomplished at time of occupancy, noting deficiencies or damages and giving notification thereof to Town Major, Acting Town Major, Division, Corps or Army Engineer having authority in the area. Two days before organizations vacate accomodations presently occupied, the organization commanders concerned will forward any deficiencies noted to this Headquarters in order that necessary corrective action may be taken before departure of units. This report is in addition to report to be made to Town Major, Acting Town Major, etc. noting any deficiencies. Sub-paragraph 5d requires that vacated accomodations be thoroughly policed insofar as practicable. Officers will inspect all accomodations vacated by their troops for police. Battalion and Separate Unit Commanders or their staff representatives will personally make a final inspection with a view to correcting any deficiencies noted prior to departure.

3. Necessary steps and inspections will be carried out by Organization Commanders to prevent looting of any nature of vacated accomodations.

4. Whatever accomodations are taken over by the relieving troops will be signed for. These signed Certificates as to condition and police and the inventory forms covering the accomodations taken over by the relieving troops will be kept in the organization's files for at least six months from date of departure from this area.

TO : All MG Detachments in Kreises Vilshofen, Greisbach and Pfarrkerchen.

As a result of recent raids on the civil population within the subject Kreises by unknown band(s) of thieves and mobsters, this Regiment has inaugurated counter measures as follows:

1. Each Bn and Special Unit will maintain a reinforced platoon on the alert, commanded by an officer, during the hours of darkness, prepared to intercept, investigate and apprehend any and all participants in acts of violence, sabotage, theivery etc.
2. Radio communication will be maintained between the alert platoon and the dispatched unit at all times.
3. The success of the counter measures is directly proportional to the speed with which the location of the violence is reported. Therefore, you are directed:
 - a. To make public through the medium of Land Kreis commanders and burgomeisters the location of all military installations.
 - b. To instruct such Kreis Commanders and burgomeisters that when situation arises requiring assistance from troops, that a guide will be placed conveniently to direct the alert patrol to the scene of disturbance, and to furnish to the patrol leader such details that will prove helpful in the apprehension of the culprits.

1. This Division turns over its present area to the 4th Armored Division prior to 6 Nov. 45 and relieves the 26th Division in upper Austria (Obodonau) during period 24 Oct-6 Nov 45. The 83rd Division will occupy and govern the province of Upper Austria and secure designated installations and the border.

2. a. This Regiment relieves the 101st Inf in its present area on 27-29 Oct. Bns will relieve corresponding units of 101st Inf and will move to new area on dates indicated.

2nd Bn. - 27 Oct 45

3rd Bn. - 28 Oct 45

1st Bn. - 29 Oct 45

Regimental Hq Co and Service Co will move on orders from the Regimental Commander.

b. For route (see strip map).

3. a. The 1st Bn, with Anti-Tank Co atchd, 2nd Bn, and 3rd Bn with Cannon Co atchd will relieve designated units of 101st Inf. Regt of all duties now performed by those units and will continue the government and security of those areas.

(1) Units will complete reconnaissance of new area by 19 October and will make detailed plans for relief.

(2) Advance parties from organizations of Bn level will precede their organization by (4) days. Advance parties should include Bn C.O., S-1, S-3, and one officer from each company.

(5) Unit Commanders will insure that all billets and facilities presently occupied by elements of the 26th Inf Div, are kept under guard as vacated by the 26th Inf Div. No civilians will be permitted to reoccupy any of these buildings.

(6) Upon closing in the new area, all units will submit an overlay showing unit dispositions, a list of the installations guarded, road blocks established and the number of men required to guard each installation.

(7) All organizations will make careful inventory of amount and condition of property in new area.

(8) For installations for which each Bn is responsible see Annex #1. Bn boundaries will be published at a later date.

4. Advance Details will carry one (1) days ten-in-one ration with them.

5. CPs will open at hour Organization Commanders assume responsibility for area and will report this action to Regt'l CP at Steyr.

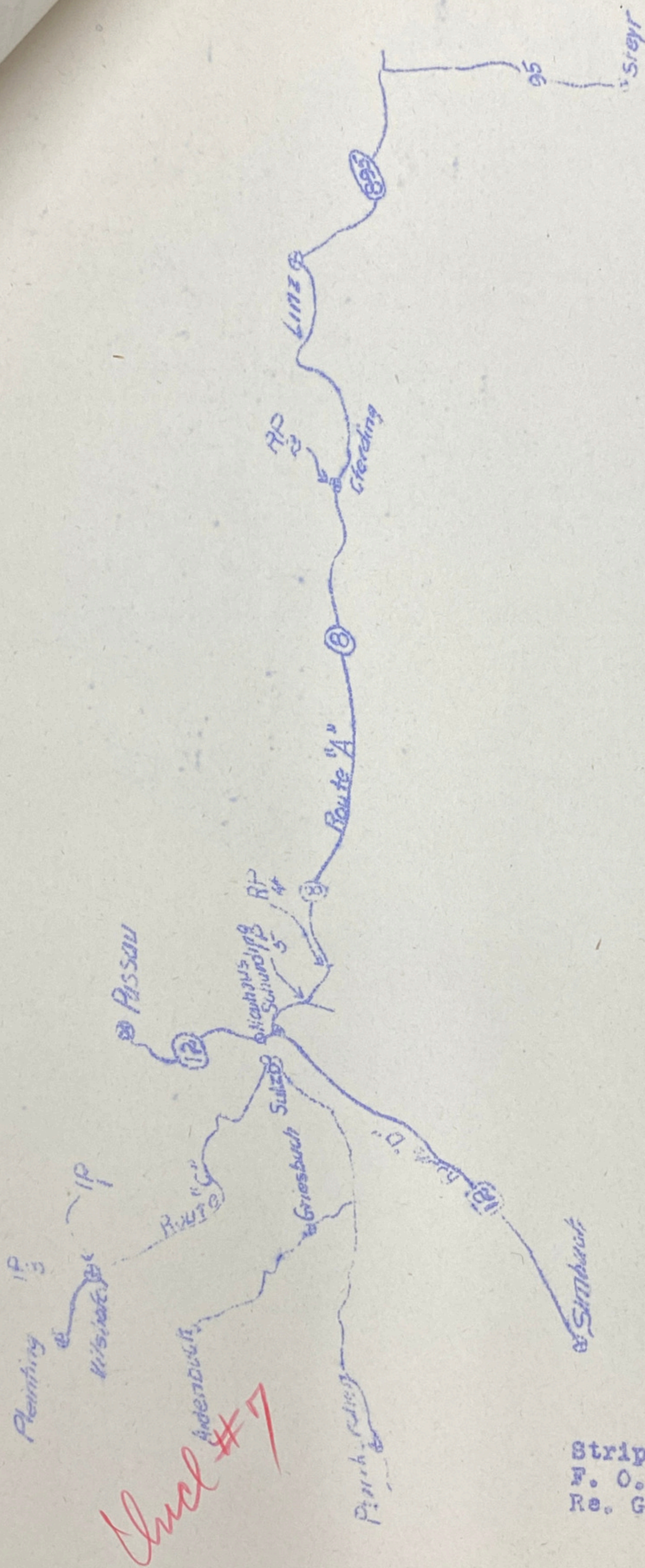

MEMORANDUM:

TO : All Battalion and Company Commanders.

In the past few days there have been two instances in which groups of men as large as 25 men have made raids on towns and farms committing rape and robbery. Most of these raids have taken place between 2000 and 0100 hours.

In order to combat this each Bn will have alerted during the hours of darkness one reinforced rifle platoon with a commissioned Officer in charge and necessary transportation to move on notification by local civilian authorities that a raid is in progress or threatened.

Regimental Hq Co, Cannon and Anti-Tank Companies will have 15 men and 1 Officer alerted.

Additional radios (SCR's 284 & 610) will be issued to provide communication between patrols and base sets. Each base set will be set up to attain maximum possible range and patrols will be instructed to set up radios in such a location as to take maximum advantage of terrain in order to secure the best possible range and reception.

Instructions will be issued to provide civilian agencies as to locations of various alerted units and they will be directed to advise army personnel of point at which a guide will be to lead alert unit to scene of incident.

If the raid is in progress when the alert unit reaches the scene of the incident the officer in charge will take necessary steps to halt the raid and capture the participants.

In the event the raid is over the area immediately surrounding will be covered by motor and foot patrols in an effort to apprehend the participants.

To expediate movement of alert unit the nearest unit to scene of raid will dispatch the security patrol.

The officer in charge of the alerted group will institute at once an investigation to attempt to learn the homes of the participants and notify his Hq so that an immediate search can be made for the raiders and for stolen goods.

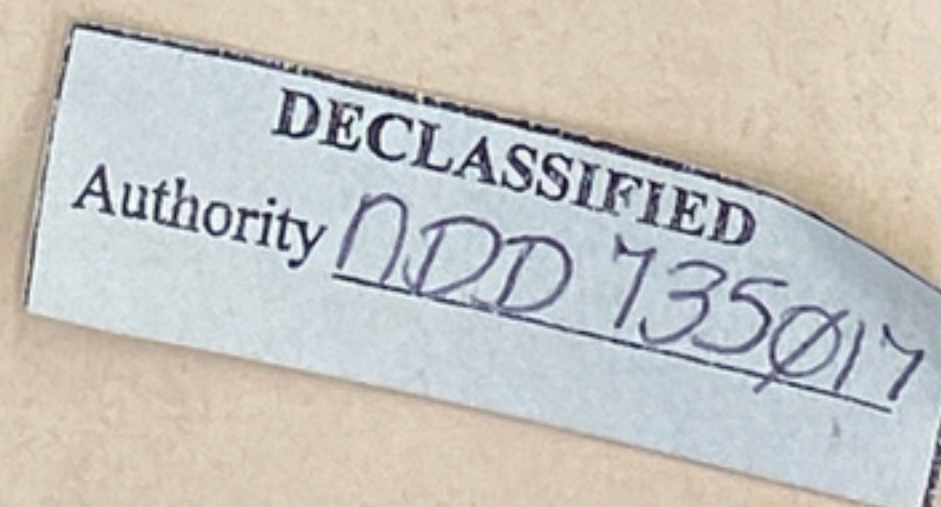

MEMORANDUM:

Guide for Train Commanders to Hungary.

1. This memorandum is published for the information and guidance of Train Commanders of trains carrying Hungarians from the Pocking Camp into Hungary and is based on the actual experience of a recently-retained Train Commander of one of these Hungarian Loaded trains.
 2. EACH TRAIN SECTION must have a Train Commander, who should be referred to as "The Commandant" by interpreters for reasons of prestige.
 3. RATIONS for Train Commander and Guards should be sufficient for 12 or 15 days, as rations cannot be obtained in Russian-occupied territory. Variety is desirable; 10 in 1's are recommended plus bread.
 4. A SUITABLE CAR with sleeping and cooling facilities should be included in the train for the Train Commander and Guards. Not only can they operate more efficiently, but such accommodations for the Train Commander impresses the people with whom he must deal and is a decided asset.
 5. EQUIPMENT AND ITEMS necessary for the comfort of the Train Commander and his Guards should be brought along. These include small gasoline stoves, blankets and sleeping bags, cots, pots and pans for cooking, halizone tablets, water cans, gasoline, and necessary stationary.
 6. INTERPRETER At least one German-speaking interpreter should be included in the Train Commander's party. A Russian speaking interpreter is an asset but not a necessity.
 7. A HUNGARIAN OFFICER OR LEADER should be put in charge of the Hungarians on each train and the Train Commander should work through him. Hungarian-car commanders should be designated for each car.
 8. RATIONS for at least 7 days should be loaded on the train for the Hungarians, because of the delays enroute. These rations should be issued daily by the Hungarian Officer in Charge and under the supervision of the Train Commander.
- HOSPITAL TRAIN In the case of hospital trains the number of GERMAN Hospital Personnel riding the train should be included in the MOVEMENT order to facilitate entering and leaving Russian-occupied territory.
10. UNAUTHORIZED PERSONNEL found on the train by the Russians may result in the train with all its passengers being returned to Germany. This fact should be impressed upon the Hungarians.

1. AT HALTS passengers must not wonder away from the train.

12. PRESTIGE OF THE AMERICAN TRAIN COMMANDER must be maintained. In this connection Austrian and Hungarian railroad personnel must be impressed with the fact that the American Train Commander is the "Commandant" and must be referred to as such by the interpreter. It is also well for the Train Commander and Guards to wear their best clothes and their ribbons. A good deal of ranting, raving and banging of fists on tables by the Commandant" and insistence by him on immediate action will generally produce results. This is really an effective method.

13. TRAIN "BOSS". Be sure to impress upon the Austrian and Hungarian Railroad and Hungarian Police Personnel that you as an American Officer Train Commander are the "boss" of your train no matter where it is and what you direct will be carried out.

14. VIENNA "BOTTLENECK" A bottle-neck exists in the railroad yards in Vienna due to the lack of locomotives and coal. Therefore, you will expedite matters by keeping in touch with the American Authorities in Vienna.

15. LOCOMOTIVES obtained in Austria should be kept for the trip into and return from Hungary, as Hungarian locomotives may be commandeered at any time leaving your cars on a siding with no engine. Coal appears to be sufficient in Hungary, but locomotives are scarce. It may be necessary to stop over night on a siding to let the locomotive personnel sleep, but this will save time in the long run.

16. TRAIN ENGINES (LOCOMOTIVES) are scarce. Therefore, let no one take your engine from your train. At almost every stop someone will try to commandeer your locomotive, but if you instruct the engineer to advise you (the Train Commander) any time this happens, you can prevent it.

17. FACILITIES FOR DPs AT DESTINATION are usually insufficient so that it is often necessary to travel a short distance beyond your destination to discharge your passengers. The distance into Hungary that the train should proceed beyond its destination should be left to the train Commander, but should be held to a minimum. The Hungarian Police will try to tell you that you have to go where they tell you, but this is not so.

18. HUNGARIAN POLICE take care of the DPs as soon as they are unloaded.

19. RETURN TRIP a. On the return trip a strict watch must be kept on the train or you will have hundreds of passengers if you will allow them to ride. It is suggested that Russian Military Personnel desiring to ride be afforded the opportunity, but no others.

b. Coordination between Division and the American Railroad Authorities at MUNICH should be made beforehand with regard to the return train to Pocking (point of origin)

20. HOSPITAL TRAIN. Permission must be obtained from the Surgeon General's Office for the return of a Hospital Train from Munich to the point of origin (Pocking).

21. DDT POWDER should be carried by the Train Commander. A half-dozen cans is sufficient.

In addition to awards offered to the various commands in this theater, the following have been authorized for the highest number of bonds purchased by any one Company, Battery, or Troop in the Division. Figures will be based on \$25.00 bonds. One \$100.00 bond will equal four \$25.00 bonds, etc:

- (1) All bond purchasers in the unit to receive their choice of leave or furlough in any of the following leave centers:

United Kingdom	7 - day leave/furlough
Paris	72 hour pass
Riviera	7 - day leave/furlough
Switzerland	7 - day leave/furlough

b. The Company, Battery, or Troop being second highest will be entitled to send 50% of their bond purchasers, with individual choice of leave/furlough area.

c. The Company, Battery, or Troop being third highest will be entitled to send 25% of their bond purchasers, with individual choice of leave/furlough area.

3. Unit Bond Officers will submit to the Regimental Bond Officer, 2nd Lt Ralph B. Caspersen, Regimental Headquarters Company, not later than 5 December 1945, the number of bonds purchased, by type and amount, for their units, with a list of the number of personnel buying bonds.



REPORT OF OPERATIONS

OCTOBER

During the former part of October, the Regiment's move to Austria to relieve the 26th Infantry Division of its occupation duties was postponed fifteen (15) days. Training continued with emphasis on military discipline, guard duties, operation of road blocks. (Incl. #23) The anticipated loss of key personnel as a result of the lowering of the critical score to 60 points necessitated the inauguration of specialist schools. On 2 October 1945 specialist schools were started for switchboard operators, radio operators, vehicle drivers and supply sergeants and clerks. School for first sergeants was set back until Personnel Officer returned from leave in Switzerland. (Incls. # 1, 15, 18).

No additional I & E schools were planned during the month. The Regiment as a whole was at half strength making it difficult to procure students without causing undue hardship on the remaining men. The three (3) schools which had been in operation were suspended 15 October. Personnel was needed to man roadblocks and administer PW and DP camps. Plans were drawn up to resume schools with a greater capacity, in north Austria.

During October, eleven (11) men were dispatched to Biarritz Army University in France and ten (10) men were sent to the I & E School at Oberammergau, Germany to attend general I & E course. (Incls. 2, 8, 10, 17)

The training week was reduced to thirty-three (33) hours:- Athletics to take majority of the time on the schedule. (Incl # 16)

Preparations were made for movement to Austria. Colonel YORK with Battalion Commanders moved to new area in Austria on 15 October. Plans were to maintain close liason with units to be relieved without causing undue break in the administration of the may DP and PW camps, and the operation of roadblocks on the Russian Frontier. (Incls #s 7, 7a, 7b, 11).

By 1000 hours, 27 October, units of the 4th Armored Division had relieved the 331st Inf of all responsibilities in Kreises VILSHOFEN, GREISBACH AND PFARRKIRCHEN. (Incls. #s 6 & 11) Movement to North Austria was accomplished by battalions moving individually, with attached units in the order 1st, 2nd, and 3rd. (Incls #s 7 & 13) 1st Battalion moved out 28 October. By 1830 hours, 30 October, all units of the 331st Inf had cleared into new area and relieved the 101st Infantry Regiment of occupation duties. The above movement removed the 83rd Infantry Division from under 3rd Army Control and placed it under control of USFA. Many officers and men from the 101st Infantry joined the 331st Inf. Regt.

Period 1-7 October, "Swoops" were conducted on Stubenberg, Schon burg, Augenkirchen, Pleinting, Ernig, Rhustorf, Lengsham, Altenmarket, Rossbach, Rothalmunster, Baumgarten and Schonerting. Items confiscated were generally items of G.I. clothing, some knives, non-military rifles and pistols were found along with personnel having no registration papers on their person in violation of security orders.

During the first three weeks of October, three raids on civilian populace were committed by a force of unknown persons. In each case, theft was the motive. In the last incident, occurring on 17 October 1945, a man (German) was shot to death and his wife wounded. All cases were referred to CIC for further investigation. As of 28 October, two significant arrests were made. Violators were believed to be Poles from nearby DP camps. Guards were placed on Russian-Polish Camp at Schalpfing. Camp at Pfarrkirchen was evacuated. To combat the raid menace, each battalion was directed to organize an alert platoon, mobile with radio, whose duty it was to intercept any such subsequent raids. All landrats were directed to make public, location of military installations to which such violences could be reported. Cannon and Anti-Tank Companies were also directed to keep a minimum of fifteen (15) EMs and one officer alert and mobile subject to calls during the night. (Incls #s 5 & 9)

Hungarian movements throughout area of responsibility continued without proper authority. Each case was investigated and Hungarians returned to proper area. Misinterpretation of orders from Hungarian General in charge of Hungarian DPs created much unrest. It was also learned in one instance German Authorities had ordered movement of Hungarians.

On 4 October, train left Pocking with 1500 Hungarian DPS. Pocking continued to serve as a clearing house for Hungarian DPs. On 5 October, 800 Hungarian DPs from Dreises VILSHOFEN AND GREISBACK were moved into Pocking Camp. (Incl # 4)

By 16 October, the Telephone line to Cannon Company had been cut six (6) times. Solution was found in directing the Landrat to establish guards at key points covering section where sabotage of wire was concentrated. No further cutting of wire was noted.

On 27 October, another train cleared Pocking with approximately 900 DPs. (Incl. #4)

On 24 October 1945, Operation "Chesterfield" resulted in the re arrest of 103 persons of the Ortsgruppe level. They were turned over

to the PW Camp at Platting for further classification. 53
other persons in the Ortsgruppe level were listed in the area and
still on wanted list. Civil population was generally cooperative
in this operation.

One small blackmarket currency exchange was raided. One Hun-
garian DP from the Pocking Camp was taken into custody. Situation
as to further development and investigation was placed in the hands
of CIC.

On 28 October, day forward of 331st Inf CP arrived in Steyr,
a vehicle (described as a truck) was stolen from one of the
Lagers. The 26th Inf Div. had not yet been relieved of its' duties
in North Austria. (Incl. # 21)

On 1 October, there were registered 35,965 DPs in the Regimental
Area. During the month 2,441 were repatriated.

Regiment was at one-half strength during the first two weeks
of October although approximately 1000 men joined the Regiment
during this time with ASR of 59 or less. During the third week of
October, approximately 1000 men with ASR of 60 or higher were trans-
ferred out of the Regiment. (Incl. # 18)

Above transfers out of the Regiment were made to the 602nd TD Bn.
90th Infantry Division, 80th Infantry Division, and 26th Infantry
Division, the latter unit then alerted to move to the staging area.
Incoming troops were from such units as 76th, 99th, 89th and 26th Infa-
ntry Divisions. Above transfers aggravated a situation already
created by the pronounced shortage of cooks and clerks. Some
specialists were received from the 26th Infantry Division whose per-
sonnel were absorbed at the time Regt. moved into North Austria.
(Incl. # 19)

Officer personnel was exchanged with the 101st Infantry Regiment.
The 331st Infantry lost 46 officers and gained 120, making the
Regiment considerably overstrength in officer personnel.

On 13 October 1945, a survey of officer's efficiency and
education reports was conducted by a representative from the
War Department. A criterion of all officers was held at the
3rd Battalion CP. All unit commanders were required to
submit three types of efficiency reports on each officer in the
Regiment.

Some increase in passes to recreational areas was observed dur-
ing the month. This no doubt was due to Victory Bond Drive
campaign awarding passes to personnel making Bond purchases. (Incl #3)
