23 Peb 44	Crossed on Dominion Monarch Stationed in England.
17 Jun 44	Stationed in Ingland. X BATTERY FORMED AND TEMP ATTACHED TO LAND AT UTAH BEACH 12 TUNE SUPPORT FOR 4 DIVISION
18 Jun 44 31 Jul 44	Normandy campaign. Unit landed at Utah Beach 18 June. Mission was AA protection of VII Corps Artillery. En remained in positions around Valognes until fall of Cherbourg, then moved south of St. Mere Eglise. Most action against enemy aircraft was during week of 18-24 June. On 2 July, mission changed to protection of 83d Div Arty. Enemy artillery fire increased. Elements of En participated in Infantry-Antiaircraft combined operations in the Periers sector.

- Aug 44 Bn moved with 83d Div from vio Fengeres to la Gousiniere. Unit assisted in capture of St. Malo and Dinard.
- Sep 44 Remained attached to 63d Inf Div and moved with it from Dinard area via Chatembriant, Vendome, and the Foret de Montagris to Luxembourg, with Headquarters located near Betzdorf at end of month.
- Oct 44 With 83d Inf Div, Bn continued to protect field artillery positions and also provided AA protection to Radio Luxembourg at Junglinster.
- Nov 44 Quiet period with no change in mission.
- Dec 44 During 1-6 Dec, En moved north to Gressenich, between Aachen and Duren, Germany. Enemy air activity increased. Very heavy enemy

453d Sep CA Bn (Cont'd)

air raids occurred over Duren sector on 18 Dec, when 131 aircraft were engaged by the Enttalion. Twenty-eight enemy planes were destroyed and an additional nine probably destroyed. On 26 Dec, Bn moved with 63d Div Artillery from positions in Huertgen Forest to assembly area in Bois Bassin, Belgium, and at month's end it was deployed south of Barvaux.

- Jan 45 Quiet month spent in Belgium. Bn moved into concentration area on 22 Jan and spent rest of month in rehabilitation and training.
- Feb 45 Several enemy bombing and strafing raids occurred during latter half of month. Eight enemy planes believed destroyed.
- Mar 45 All batteries now stationed in Germany. Numerous enemy planes engaged and total of 8 destroyed. On 22 March, Bn was relieved of tactical mission and moved to Birgden, Germany, for period of training.
- Apr 45

 En accompanied 83d Inf Div in drive from the Rhine to the Ribe River.
 Only scattered raids by enemy aircraft in early part of month.
 During 14-20 April, enemy planes made frequent attacks on the Elbe
 River birdge and the bridgehead area. Pive men were killed and 21
 other casualties sustained.
- May 45
 Little or no activity. Bn was relieved of its combat mission on 6
 May and moved from Calbe to Kongislutter, Germany. On 8 May it
 moved into Kreis Blankenburg, where it was assigned a military
 government mission.
