JOURNAL FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE

- June 1. Actual Company Strength: 9 Officers, 1 Warrant Officer, 137 Enlisted Men. Attached to Company for Rations and Quarters: 1 Officer, 4 Enlisted Men from Chemical Warfare Service. Normal maintenance and Supply functions and training at Stoke on Tern, Shropshire, England, 16 Mile Map of Great Britain VK0949.
- June 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10. Same as 1.
- June 11. Relieved from attached to Company for Rations and Quarters, 1 Officer and 4 Enlisted Men. (1) Normal maintenance and Supply functions and training.
- June 12, 13, 14, 15. Same as (1) of June 11.
- June 16. Preparations for Movement were initiated and all sections started packing. Received Secret Orders at 2230, to move Company to Camp in Southern England, C-14 Marshalling Area. Departed Stoke on Tern with Convoy of 30 Vehicles and all members of Company except 5 Enlisted Men and 1 Officer to act as Rear Guard and Clean up squad, at 2230 16 July, 1944.
- June 17. Arrived at C-14 at 1400, all vehicles arrived safe, Spirit and Morale was high. Started water-proofing vehicles immediately for Beach landing of all vehicles, Order rescinded at 1930. Received Special Briefing Top Secret at 2200 from Motor Traffic Control Officer at C-14. Moved Company to old Berth 39, Southampton, England and started loading Vehicles on Liberty Boat for crossing.
- June 18. One First Aid man from Special Troops Headquarters assigned to Company. Finished loading and pulled out to stream waiting for Convoy.
- June 19. Crossing Channel, Rations issued. Morale High.
- June 20, 21, 22. Abandoned Transport during Storm with High Waves and Strong Wind.
- June 23. Started unloading procedures at 2300.
- June 24. First Barge of vehicles left Ship at 0400, Finished unloading at 1930. Unloaded at Ramp on Utah Beach Northwest of Les Treveries at 0100 went to Transit Area # 2.
- June 25. Moved from Area # 2, to Southwest of Bricquville T6080 Cherbourg & Caen Map of (France) Sheet No. 3A & 8.
- June 26. Received Verbal Orders to move Company North of Bricquville at 1000 Reconnoitered Area, then received orders to hold position.

- July 1. Actual Company Strength 9 Officers 1 Warrant Officer, 136 Enlisted Men. Location: Les Droueries, France Cord. 385888 $\frac{1}{2}$ -mile West. Lost 1 MM NBC dy to deceased, Accidentally shot by Garbine at 1800 hours while getting out of Pup tent.
- July 2. Normal Supply and Maintenance Functions, cleaned area of all German and American Ammunition. Heavy demand for all types of Automatic weapons and vehicles to replace Battle losses sustained in Battle. Company had contact parties out to repair & Collect Vehicles and weapons also salvage and captured Enemy Material.

- July 5. Heavy demand for supply of automatic Weapons & Vehicles. Have Location of two $\frac{1}{4}$ -Tons which have become Battle Looses but can not Evacuate same due to Enemy Shelling. All Sections working Hard.
- July 6. Same conditions exists and Supply Section has been very busy getting Replacement Vehicles & Automatic weapons. Have had several 57's Replaced & Repaired by the 255th Ordnance MM Company. Lost 1 EM Accidentally shot while on guard duty by another guard. NBC Duty to deceased.
- July 7. Received Verbal orders to move Location of Company. Moved Company to New Location Cantepie, France. Cord. 354841 $\frac{1}{4}$ -mile North Move made from 1300 to 1545, distance 6 miles.
- July 8. Company Dug in and well camouflaged and all units have new Location. Issued 4 of Companies Rocket Launchers for Infantry to stop Tank Attack. Have three contact parties out, for Automotive Spot Check, Small Arms & Artillery Spot check.
- July 9. Have three Salvage parties out picking up Reclaimable & Repairable Ordnance Equipment. Considerable amounts of Small Arms Automatic Weapons slightly damaged and rusty have passed thru the Armanent Section to the Supply Section for Reissue.
- July 10. Continued the salvage operations some trouble with Snipers. Recovered four German Vehicles two 20MM Cannons complete. Large numbers of Small Arms & Automatic German Weapons Evacuated to 974th Evac. Co. Truck loads of Ammo both American & German evacuated to ASP.

- July 25. Received special Service B-Kit consisting of Radio, Phonograph and 125 Books.
- July 26. Sent nine Alligators back to unit and carried on with Normal Duties.
- July 27. Received orders to move Company to new Location, Tribehou, France. Cord. 388736 1 mile South distance 7 miles Started move at 1830 closed at 2230.
- July 28. Received orders to move to new location Les Mesni Vigot, France Cord. 366676 $1\frac{1}{2}$ -miles South. Distance 7 miles moved at 1915 to 2130.
- July 29. Started plans to spot check entire Division with 65 Men from 16th Ordnance MM Co. to assist LM Company Normal Duties.
- July 30. Completed all preparations and notified units. Normal Duties.
- July 31. Started Inspection & Repair Teams at 0800 Reports during day indicated units were in good shape maintenance has improved a great deal since last inspection in England, 100% Inspection of Vehicles Weapons and Artillery Instruments. Company very busy, Finished first units and reports are very satisfactory. Company has made many repairs of mechanical nature to all vehicles & Weapons needing 3rd Echelon Repair.
