SUBJECT : Action Against Enemy Report.

TO : The Adjutant General, Washington, D.C. (Thru Channels)

1. In compliance with letter from Headquarters 83d Infantry Division, Office of the Commanding General, APO 83, US Army, file 319.1/401 subject: Action Against Enemy, Reports After/After Action Reports dated 20 July 1944 the following report is submitted:

During the month of August the Prisoner of War Cage processed 11,272 prisoners taken during the St. Malo and Dinard operations. Included in these figures were 298 officers of which Colonel Von Auleck was one. The number processed through Division Medical Channels, totaled 984. Making a Division total for the month of August, 12,256.

The traffic section with the remainder of the Police Section, in addition to their regular duties, followed the Infantry advance into St. Malo, St. Servan and Dinard, establishing guards over all captured enemy stores and installations. After the fall of the Citadel the responsibility was turned over to the Regimental Commander by order of the Commanding General. During the operation and immediately after the towns of St. Malo, St. Servan, Dinard, Dinan and Paramé were patrolled by these two sections.

Commencing the 26 August 1944 part of the Police Section were patrolling the town of Nantes, France. The remainder of the Platoon has been on routine duty in the towns of Chateaubriant and Soudan.
