SUBJECT: Action Against Enemy Report.

TO : The Adjutant General, Washington 25, D. C.

THRU : Command Channels.

1. In compliance with Ltr. Hq FUSA, file 319.1/401 (c), dated 13 July 1944; and par. 10, C3, AR 345-105, 9 March 1943, the following report is submitted herewith:.

The 83d Signal Company was bivouaced in the vicinity of Bricqueville, France on 24 June 1944. The company was alerted for movement on 27 June 1944 and moved to the vicinity of Vierville, France in the rear echelon of the 83rd Infantry Division which was at this time relieving the 101st Airborne Division in the Carentan Sector. The Division then consolidated its position and began preparations for an offensive operation South of Carentan. The operations platoon installed and maintained communications within the division and to attached units. The Message Center section was in 24 hour operation from the Division Command Post and also from the Rear Echelon Command Post. The Division Signal Supply was busy bringing the signal supplies of the division up to their normal strength. The other sections of the company had no operational duties at the time, with the exception of normal administration functions.
