Subject: Report of G-1 activities for period 1 July to 31 July 1944.

To : Commanding General 83d Infantry Division.

Herewith report of G-1 activities as follows:

a. Replacements: The Division was initially engaged on 4 July 1944, and requisitions submitted immediately following the first days action for replacements. No replacements were received until 8 July 1944, when an initial shipment of approximately 1500 was secured. The time lag caused the infantry regiments to fall sufficiently below T/O strength to prevent building up until the action became less fierce even though after the initial shipment of replacements was received the flow was fairly regular. In the latter part of the engagement the regiments had been built up sufficiently to enable a provisional training battalion to be organized in which all incoming officer and EM replacements were given a 2 1/2 day intensive indoctrination in hedgerow fighting. This greatly improved the morale and effectiveness of the replacements. See Incl No. 1 for statistical information.

b. Graves Registration: The division organized a team to supplement the regimental and battalion teams in evacuating the areas in which the division operated. See Incl No. 2.

c. Red Cross: See Incl No. 3.

d. Civil Affairs: Restraint lines were established within the division area and civilians evacuated outside these lines during action both for their protection and to clear the area of possible espionage agents. Incl No. 4.

e. Special Service: Special Service instituted a weekly news sheet on division happenings. There was little that could be done in the way of morale work as the troops were actively engaged almost continuously.

f. Chaplains: The chaplains have been indefatigable in their work and are in the lines continuously with their units. One chaplain was killed in action.

g. Finance: The division, less very recently received replacements, was paid on the last day of the month. Unpaid individuals will be paid on supplemental payrolls within a week.

h. Awards and decorations: Incl No. 5.

i. Military Justice: Incl No. 6.

j. Postal Service: Mail reached the troops regularly at all times. The statistics given in par 4, A & B, Incl No. 7, provide an interesting insight as to what the soldier does with his money.

k. Morale: Morale was uniformly excellent throughout the division during the entire operation. All the wounded men were in good spirits and most of them were anxious to get back and have another crack at the enemy.

l. Stragglers: Stragglers during the operation amounted to 553 in number. Most of these men had become separated from their units temporarily. All were returned to their units by the Division Provost Marshal. Only minor disciplinary action was indicated in most cases.

m. Prisoners of War: The division captured 1 officer and 371 EM during the period. Practically all of these were interrogated by G-2.

n. Medical data: Incl No. 8.

o. Public relations: Numerous short news stories on individuals were submitted to the CG, FUSA, but as the division was (and is) carried on the secret list, no publicity has been released.

p. Relations with civilian population: All areas occupied by the division were evacuated of civilians. Casual civilians encountered were agreeable but did not exhibit any wild enthusiasm.

Civil Affairs Periodic Report

2 August 1944  
From: 1 July 44  
To: 31 July 44

1. Summary of Civil Affairs Situation.

In the course of the month 3526 civilians were evacuated from strategic areas in which Blackstone was engaged. Many of these were refugees who had filtered through the front lines. Due to lack of space in Corps refugee centers it became necessary to establish our own refugee camps. Four camps were established and maintained. Nine hundred and fifty-three evacuees were cared for in these camps and were returned to their homes when the tactical situation warranted. Constant patrolling of roads in the Blackstone areas by personnel of this section insured free passage for military traffic.

- a. General health condition was found to be good. Medical aid was given in emergencies or when necessary.
- b. Behavior of troops towards civilians and civilian property was excellent.




