I—AWARD OF SILVER STAR MEDAL (Posthumous)—Under the provisions of AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, and Memorandum No. 34, Headquarters Ninth United States Army, dated 6 September 1944, as amended, the Silver Star Medal is to be awarded posthumously to the following:

TECHNICIAN FIFTH GRADE JAMES M. BARBER, 14140276, Medical Department, 329th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 15 April 1945, in Germany. While advancing through the woods west of Nutha, Germany, the company of which Technician Fifth Grade Barber was a member was held up by well-concealed enemy machine gun and rifle fire. Technician Fifth Grade Barber with complete disregard for his personal safety and in complete observation of the enemy unhesitatingly ran forward to administer aid to a wounded comrade. While engaged in this heroic act he was fatally wounded by an enemy sniper. The outstanding humanity and courageous devotion to duty of this non-commissioned officer reflect the highest credit upon himself and exemplify the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Georgia. Residence: 1114 E. Anderson Street, Savannah, Georgia.

CORPORAL WILLIAM X. GAGNON, 36334768, Medical Department, 329th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 15 April 1945, in Germany. While advancing through the woods west of Nutha, Germany, the company of which Corporal Gagnon was a member was held up by well-concealed enemy machine gun and rifle fire. Corporal Gagnon with complete disregard for his personal safety and in complete observation of the enemy unhesitatingly ran forward to administer aid to a wounded comrade. While engaged in this heroic act he was fatally wounded by an enemy sniper. The outstanding humanity and courageous devotion to duty of this non-commissioned officer reflect the highest credit upon himself and exemplify the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. SERGEANT PALMER K. HAWLEY, 37468411, Infantry, 329th Infantry, United States Army. For gallantry in action on 2 April 1945, in Germany. While leading a patrol against a farmhouse that contained some enemy troops, Sergeant Hawley with complete disregard for personal safety stood in the open and attempted to negotiate their surrender. While thus exposed the enemy troops began to deploy and Sergeant Hawley unhesitatingly gave the order for his patrol to open fire. Throughout this action, he displayed outstanding initiative and coolness under fire until the enemy had been overcome. During this heroic act Sergeant Hawley was killed by enemy artillery. The conspicuous courage and aggressive leadership of this non-commissioned officer reflect the highest credit upon himself and exemplify the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States.
