I--AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL--Under the provisions of AR 600-45, as amended per ETOUSA Letter AG 200.6 MP subject: "Bronze Star Medals", dated 27 February 1944, and in accordance with the authority contained in paragraph 3c, Section I, Circular No. 32, Hq ETOUSA, 20 March 1944, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following officers and enlisted men of the 83d Infantry Division:


