In the morning he volunteered to go on a reconnaissance, entering deeper in the town, under artillery and small arms fire, capturing several German soldiers and returning them to the platoon CP. Then he secured rations, cigarettes and dry clothing for his men and returned to the bazooka positions and took charge until the mission was accomplished. His extraordinary courage and leadership reflects great devotion to duty and is in keeping with the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Florida.
