I-AWARD OF THE MERITORIOUS SERVICE UNIT PLAGUE-Gold Star-Under the provisions of Section 1, WD Circular 345, dated 25 August 1944, as amended, the Gold Star to the Meritorious Service Unit Plaque is awarded the 85d Quartermaster Company for superior performance of duty in the accomplishment of exceptionally difficult tacks, and achievement and maintenance of a high standard of discipline from 1 January 1945 to 30 June 1945.

II-AMARD OF THE SILVER STAR LEDAI-Posthumously--Under the provisions of AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, and Diroular No.0, Head quarters Third United States Army, dated 26 April 1944, as amended, the Silver Star Medal is awarded posthumously to the following:

PRIVATE FIRST CLESS GLEMM W. COLLINS, 35749452, Infantry, 229th Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action against an enemy of the United States on 2 Yarch 1945 at Neuss, Germany. Company "I", 329th Infantry was attacking enemy positions and was temporarily delayed by concentrated 20mm machine gun fire from enemy strong points. Private Collins, with utter disregard for his personal safety moved to an exposed position on the left flank, and firing his automatic rifle, succeeded in reducing the enemy strongpoint. His outstanding action permitted his unit to regain the initiative, eliminate the remaining strong points, and gain its objective. His conspicuous initiative, aggressiveness and disregard for personal safety reflect the highest credit upon himself and exemplify the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from West Virginia.

CAPTAIN JOHN J. MARKONITZ, 0-442866, (then First Lieutenant), Infantry, 352th Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action against an enemy of the United States on 11 and 13 August 1944 at St. Servan, Franco. Captain Markowitz led his company into the attack on the citadel of St. Malo, under intense enemy artillery and small arms fire from three sides. Using bangalors torpodes he succeeded in clearing a path through mine fields and reaching the fort. There he climbed to the top of a high wall and, set domolition charges while under enemy observation and fire. When the charges failed to open the fort, Captain Markowitz was ordered to withdraw, but he remained behind to make certain that all wounded work evacuated. Two days later he again led his company in the

Again he declined to withdraw until all of his wounded man were rescued.
